

Middleton resident joins global outage

A routine software update on Friday, July 19 triggered an international tech outage that affected computers worldwide, cancelling flights, disrupting businesses and putting numerous locals out of work for the day, including Nicholas from Middleton, who works from home.

CrowdStrike is an American cyber security company and its software product Falcon sparked a wave of system crashes across the globe due to an error in its upgrade.

Whilst CrowdStrike issued a remediation within hours of the event the sheer scale of the outage, which Microsoft estimates impacted about 8.5 million computers, has led to ongoing issues.

"The majority of big system-wide impacts have been dealt with," Home Affairs Minister Clare O'Neil said.

"What we are dealing with now are niggles and other issues which may create significant delays and other issues for Australians."

Nicholas wasn't particularly alarmed when his laptop stopped working, as it had been having troubles on the Friday morning.

"I contacted my line manager and our IT support staff to notify them of the issue and, to my surprise, my manager told me their laptop had the same issue!" he said.

Whilst some of Nicholas' colleagues were eventually able to log back in and have their laptops function correctly, Nicholas continued to have issues.

"I imagined our IT support staff would be very busy resolving the issue so I decided to wait until I heard back from them, though this wouldn't be until the following Monday afternoon," Nicholas said.

"The first half of Monday was awkward as I was using my personal computer for work so that I could participate in meetings and keep up with my workload."

Storm Bay reef health explored

Scientists have used high-tech underwater robots to take a closer look at the deep offshore reefs on the east coast of Bruny Island, revealing the seabed biodiversity there for the first time.

More than 61,000 images of three reef systems in Storm Bay were collected at depths of 30 to 60 metres, using an Autonomous Underwater Vehicle (AUV). "The imagery we captured has given us an initial understanding of the seabed

biodiversity across these deep offshore reefs, and an inventory that provides an important baseline for tracking how that biodiversity changes over time," said IMAS marine ecologist Ms Ashlee Bastiaansen, who is the lead author of the study.

"We observed a general decline in the overall diversity of organisms on these deep reefs between 2015 and 2020."

Community organisations are being encouraged to apply for the latest round of funding available through Kingborough Council's Community Grants Program.



Deep dive into Storm Bay ecosystem

Ms Ashlee Bastiaansen noted that the images indicate seaweed cover dominates the shallower depths of the Storm Bay reefs, and sponges, corals and other seabed animals are more prevalent below 40 metres.

"We also found that the green macroalgae Caulerpa, which is a feature of reef tops at depths of 30 metres in this area, had become shallower and reduced in cover over this period," Ms Bastiaansen said.

"This is important because changes in the distribution and abundance of key species like Caulerpa can indicate shifts in ecosystem health and function, potentially affecting the broader reef community and its resilience to environmental changes."

IMAS Project Lead and co-author Associate Professor Neville Barrett said these deep reefs were relatively inaccessible, so were not well studied.

"Yet they host high levels of biodiversity and important

commercial and recreational fishery values," he said.

"With the increasing human pressures on coastal regions, including nutrient inputs from cities and recent offshore aquaculture developments, baseline studies like this are vital for monitoring and managing the health of deep reef ecosystems."

The images and annotations from the work are hosted on the Integrated Marine Observing System (IMOS) SQUIDLE+ online platform, which offers a permanent, publicly accessible baseline for monitoring the ecosystems in Storm Bay.

"This baseline data provides an essential foundation for evidence-based management plans for Storm Bay," Ms Bastiaansen said.

"While the work described in this paper is based on two time points, the true value of these publicly accessible images and baseline annotations will become apparent over time."

Kingborough called to curb smoke pollution

Kingborough residents are being encouraged to 'Burn Brighter This Winter' to reduce wood smoke pollution.

Wood heaters are a common and efficient way to warm homes and keep well in winter.

Often wood heater owners burn wood overnight to keep homes warm and this can often result in visible smoke around many towns and suburbs across Tasmania.

To reduce smoke emissions, the Environment Protection Authority (EPA) and councils are encouraging residents to burn wood with a flame (Burn Brighter) when loading in new wood, rather than loading wood and shutting down the air intake straight away - which results in higher smoke emissions.

Dr John Innis from the EPA said air quality monitoring undertaken across Tasmania shows that there is poor air quality in several locations during the winter months. "On still winter days and nights smoke tends to linger

and build up around towns and suburbs which is unpleasant, can be a nuisance and can also have negative consequences on our health," Dr Innis said.

Dr Innis said the amount of smoke coming from a wood heater is dependent on the age and type of heater, but also on how it is operated.

The good news is that we can burn wood in a way that creates less smoke.

"To reduce smoke, make sure you always burn with a flame (don't let your fire smoulder), after reloading open the air intake and burn your fire on high for 20 minutes, only burn dry, seasoned wood and ensure the flue is clean," Dr Innis says.

"If you can, go outside every once in a while and check how much smoke is coming from your chimney.

"If it is regularly producing a lot of smoke even with good operation you may need to have your heater checked or the flue cleaned."

Local push for energy upgrades

A new report from Deloitte Access Economics has explored the barriers, objectives and solutions to delivering energy upgrades to low-income households.

The report analysed the efficacy of applying energy efficiency measures such as better insulation, draught reduction, window shades and solar panels over a seven-year period.

TasCOSS CEO Adrienne Picone said the report highlighted the benefits of installing solar on the 1774 social housing properties in the Franklin electorate, predicted to deliver annual household energy bill savings of approximately \$1367 a year.

"An accelerated home energy upgrade program would deliver significant benefits for Tasmania resulting in a drastic reduction in energy poverty for those struggling to heat or cool their homes to a healthy temperature, as well as a significant boost to the state's economy with the generation of up to \$3.3 billion in GSP and over 3000 Tasmanian jobs across the seven-year rollout period of the upgrades," Ms Picone said.

"Low income Tasmanians are more likely to live in poorly-insulated and inefficient housing stock and spend more than three times as much of their income on electricity than those on the highest incomes.

"Increased investment in household energy efficiency initiatives will improve energy affordability for Tasmanian households on low incomes by lowering their consumption and energy costs.

"The report concludes that an accelerated home energy upgrade program could drastically reduce energy poverty for people struggling to heat and cool their housing, and that large scale investment would deliver ongoing and significant energy bill savings, create thousands of jobs and supercharge the energy transition."

TasCOSS, along with all the state and territory COSS network, have written to Energy Ministers to establish a national fund in the Mid-Year Economic and Fiscal Outlook (MYEFO) budget to accelerate upgrades.

It would start with \$2 billion in the first year, scaling up each year with contributions from other sources.

Kingston hosts coastal chat

Residents and community groups gathered in the Kingborough Community Hub on Wednesday evening, July 24 to discuss the proposed changes to the Tasmanian State Coastal Policy 1996.

The evening involved presentations and a panel of speakers who included Sophie Underwood from Planning Matters Alliance Tasmania, Eric Woehler from Australian Coastal Society, Nala Mansell from Tasmanian Aboriginal Centre and

local business owner and recreational fisher Gerard Castles. The proposed changes to the Tasmanian State Coastal Policy could potentially open up the Tasmanian coastline to private development by removing a clause that prohibits development on mobile coastlines.

Environment Tasmania is concerned that the proposed amendments, which are retrospective amendments, would facilitate the construction of infrastructure for

Robbins Island Wind Farm (a 510-metre jetty), threatening the habitat Tasmanian shorebirds rely upon.

"Areas of the coast could become locked up for private development, making them inaccessible for Tasmanians," Senior Marine Campaigner at Environment Tasmania Rebecca Howarth said.

Minister for Parks and Environment Nick Duigan said the draft legislation has been released for consultation to remove uncertainties around coastal infrastructure.

"The interpretation of the policy could potentially impact on existing coastal infrastructure, including boardwalks through the dunes, fencing, lookouts, boat launching facilities, bridges and jetties," Minister Duigan said.

"It has also impacted on the approval given to the Robbins Island Wind Farm which needs clarification."

Submissions on the draft bill can be made until Thursday, August 1.

A Page from the Past - Kingborough News

Fifty-seven years ago the Huon Newspaper Company published *Kingborough News*, a weekly newspaper that circulated from 1967. The below page is taken from *Kingborough News*, July 25, 1974.

Weather pattern reversed



HEAVY rains on Saturday and Sunday gave about three and a third inches and the Huon and its tributaries ran a 'banker'.

Recreation grounds which had already received more than adequate water since early June have been soaked again and there will be more damage to turf next weekend, no doubt.

At Franklin, as our picture shows, the high tides, consequent on a very low glass, combined with the flood to raise the river almost to ground level and a pool extended on the east side of the oval from goal posts to goal posts.

The little stream which drains the Temperance Lane Gully normally passes under the Highway through a foot pipe. Over two inches on Sunday night exceeded the capacity of the culvert pipe and water spread several inches in depth over the road between the Federal Hotel and Salmon's shop. At the shop it was within two inches of floor level, but fortunately stopped at that.

Across the road however, they were not so lucky. Water came under their shop and invaded the living room of Mr and Mrs Michael Doyle's home and damaged floor coverings. The flood also spread over the floor of Mr Crosby Dance's Garage and to Mr G. Flakemore's house.

Residents will be requesting installation of a much larger culvert pipe under the road.

Franklin water supply from the New Road dam was practically cut off for two days owing to silt blocking the strainer at the dam.

For the first five months of 1974 rainfall was unusually light; the total to May 31st being only about 7 inches at both Franklin and Geeveston. In June there was an abrupt reversal. The frosts of late May gave place to about 5 inches of rain. By July 23, there was over 8 inches in a little over three weeks.

AT their meeting on July 17th, Esperance Councillors unanimously approved a statement of objections to the amalgamation of the three Huon Municipalities prepared by a sub-committee comprising the Warden (Cr. A. H. Thodey) and the Council Clerk (Mr C. J. Halton).

Despite a common assumption, the area of the proposed municipality would be inconveniently and uneconomically large. Extra machinery would be needed.

And as Awards require council employees to start and finish work at the Council Depot, the number of depots would have to be increased.

Experience of the Public Works Dept., the Hydro-Electric Commission and the Postal Department point to a decline in efficiency under Centralisation.

Although the present population is somewhat depressed the potential for increase in numbers is good. For one thing the southern municipalities have extensive coastlines. Water front land is in demand for development.

Also urban expansion of Hobart and suburbs is resulting in residential expansion in the Huonville and Cygnet areas which will increasingly become urban in type. This leaves the large areas in Esperance likely to be sought for extensive residential use on larger blocks. The natural centre of administration for this area is Geeveston.

The Municipality of Esperance is in itself an economic unit capable of carrying out all the functions of local government.

The 1974 Municipal Report was compiled at a time when the Municipality did not have a Health and Building Inspector. But the Report did not mention that Esperance had been trying for a considerable time to convince higher authorities that the practical thing was to share such an officer with adjoining municipalities.

This joint service is now being successfully operated.

The Report mentioned the population decline since 1971. But the upsurge in building in the last two years should also be investigated.

Vacant houses are rare. The Council does not agree that administrative staff is not used to capacity.

Amalgamation proposed would not decrease administration costs. Additional staff would be needed including a Deputy-Clerk, a Rates Clerk and an Accountant. Engineering Staff would be much more elaborate with a permanent Engineer, Draftsman, Inspectors and office staff to swell the wages costs.

Centralisation of administration would lower efficiency in significant areas. Local Government is

buildings and overall increase in staff.

"This Council urges the Government not to implement the Municipal Commission's Report."

Also, it is noted that the Commission is not unanimous. Two of the five members do not agree to amalgamating Esperance with the Huon. Messrs B. T. O'Halloran and N. G. Abercrombie state their reservations in their Minority Report (page 74). They point out the effect of the mileage of roads on road maintenance and communications.

Kingston High School crossing dangerous

THE newly erected crossing for the Kingston High School pupils situated on the Channel Highway between the entrances to Channel Court and Freeman St., Kingston, is proving a hazard for pupils and motorists alike, especially at peak traffic in the morning.

Motorists travelling to Hobart from Summerleas Road, Maranoa Road and Freeman St. wishing to gain access to the Channel Highway are being delayed because of the difficulty involved in merging with traffic from the south due to the crossing being placed in the position it is. A future problem will also arise on the completion of a drive-in dry cleaning depot as the crossing is situated on the end of their drive way.

The crossing is about 50 metres below the brow of the hill which

curves as you drive towards the Kingston shopping centre and there are no warning signs to indicate it is there.

Any motorist who was unaware of its existence could quite easily knock down a child before he knew it. Last week an accident did occur there, and the motorist ran into a garden fence to avoid hitting someone. Six years ago there was a fatality on the same spot.

In the summer months anyone travelling towards Margate from Kingston in the

afternoons has difficulty in seeing on this particular section of the highway because of the position of the sun so this will be an added danger.

The headmaster of the Kingston High School, Mr Eldridge, expressed his concern over the allocation of the crossing, and while he agreed that it was very hard to find a suitable position for the crossing in relation to the school, other than John St., in his view he could only contribute that all accesses to the Channel Highway at Kingston

within the 200 metres that formed the shopping centre was bad highway planning.

An approach has been made to the Minister for Transport by the Kingborough Council regarding an overpass and a reply has been received. After receiving the negative reply, the Council have decided to take the matter further and refer it to the Minister for Lands and Works, advising him that the Council is concerned at the location of the crossing and suggesting that it be re-located further south.



Checking in on Kingborough

R U OK? is calling on Kingborough residents to ask R U OK? Any Day because life happens every day.

The reminder comes as 72 per cent of Australians are reporting elevated levels of distress.

However, new R U OK? research has found an overwhelming majority (90 per cent) of people who are regularly asked R U OK? feel more supported, connected and cared about.

"There is an increase in supporting behaviours around R U OK? Day, our national day of action," said R U OK? CEO Katherine Newton.

"However, we don't want people waiting until September 12 to reach out to the people in their world who might be struggling, because life happens every day."

Dr Justin Coulson agrees there's a need for R U OK? conversations throughout the year.

"I was always the first to say R U OK? Day is great, but people don't just struggle on one day of the year," said Dr Coulson.

"It wasn't until we lost my nephew Logan that I looked further into R U OK? and began to understand this message is about regular, meaningful conversations.

"Losing Logan has felt unbearable at times. Friends provided practical support such as dropping off meals, which was helpful, but not nearly as helpful

as the hour-long conversation we had when they dropped the meal off - and they have continued to make space to listen to us in our grief.

"Conversations, words, opening up, laughing, crying, sharing, storytelling, celebrating, these are all ways we can make our relationships meaningful and ensure the people in our world feel seen, heard and valued."

More than half of Australians experience a stressful time at least once a year, and nearly two in five Australians report high or very high levels of distress.

"A lot can happen in a year, a month, a week," Ms Newton said.

"Whether it's your friend, family member, colleague, partner or teammate, the people you care about go through life's ups and downs every day.

"By checking in regularly with the people close to you, you can help prevent small things from becoming big things."

Kingborough gymnasts take on Portugal tour

Eight local gymnasts have recently returned from a two-week Gymnastics Australia national squad tour of Portugal where they competed in three competitions, including the final FIG World Cup in the 2024 World Cup series.

The gymnasts took part in three competitions as part of a developmental tour organised by Gymnastics Australia to help build competitive experience for the 2028/2032 Olympic Games.

Leuca McLeod, Braida Thomas, Matthew French, Rohan Wilcox and Amber French all took part in the final FIG World Cup for the 2024 series in the city of Coimbra on July 6 to 7.

Leuca and Braida were amongst the world's best in the double-mini trampoline, finishing in the final eight in the men's (sixth) and women's (eighth) events respectively.

Leuca also competed in the men's individual trampoline, finishing in 32nd position with a personal best score

and difficulty.

Given this event was being used as a preparatory event for the 2024 Olympic contenders, Leuca, 18, who finished just outside the semi-final round, shows he is to be taken seriously as a contender for the 2028 Los Angeles games.

Held alongside the FIG World Cup, the Coimbra Gymfest, a tournament for junior and developing senior athletes, was held from July 6 to 8.

Tasmanian's Amber French and Braida Thomas helped Australia to win the team gold in the 17+ years women's trampoline team competition with Rebekah Thomas from South Australia, while Matthew French and Rohan Wilcox secured a second gold in the 17+ years men's trampoline team event with Harrison Lee from Queensland.

Billy French performed solid routines on the double-mini trampoline, contributing to a third gold as part of the 17+ years men's double-mini team with fellow Australians

Josh de Beer and Harrison Lee of Queensland.

The team also took part in a third event, the FIG endorsed Scalabis Cup, in the city of Santarem from July 11 to 13, this time picking up individual medals as well as team medals in both individual trampoline and double-mini trampoline.

Leuca McLeod and Rohan Wilcox once again helped secure a double gold for Team Australia, this time in the senior men's trampoline team event with Harrison Lee and in the double-mini team event with Josh de Beer.

Leuca qualified for the semi-final of the senior men's individual in first position, but was unable to complete his routine in the semi-final to move through to the final round of competition.

In the individual double-mini event, Rohan and Leuca performed strong routines to qualify for the semi-final round, this time performing world class routines in the final round of competition to finish in second and third

position respectively, with Argentinian gymnast Santiago Ferrari taking the gold.

In the women's competition, Amber French and Braida Thomas once again helped Team Australia secure the gold medal in the senior women's trampoline team event with Abbie Watts from South Australia.

Braida continued on to win an individual silver medal in the senior women's double-mini final.


Finishing with the same final score as Alexandra Garcia from Portugal, Braida finished with the silver medal based on the FIG tie-breaking rules, which favour the highest scoring routine in the previous round.

Other Tasmanians who competed in Portugal include Jacob Smith who competed in the 17+ years and senior men's tumbling competitions and Axel Murden who competed in the senior men's double-mini and 17+ years trampoline events.
