## Kingston Jireh House appeal success

Liberal member for Franklin Nic Street opens his Kingston office annually to donations for the Jireh House Winter Appeal, with this year's drive once more a success.

"Each year my office is inundated with caring community members supporting the appeal; this year was no different," Minister Street said.

"There are a lot more handmade blankets this year which shows how caring our community is and are willing to do what they can to help.

Jireh provides crisis support and accommodation for around 90 women and 120 children each year who are homeless due to family violence, housing stress or other life events.

## New Margate in the making

Feedback is open for Kingborough Council's Draft Margate Master Plan, with submissions open until Tuesday, July 30.

The master plan has developed strategies to create a safer and more inviting main street under four principles: connection (balance local and regional access), environment (enhance the local environment), activation (capture the industrious community spirit) and liveability (support a growing centre).

Margate's main street was measured against the Healthy Streets Approach, which was first developed in the United Kingdom but has since been applied to streets across Australia.

The approach draws on 10 indicators for a healthy street, providing an overall score between 0-100.

The 10 indicators are:

- Everyone feels welcome
- Easy to cross
- Shade and shelter
- Places to stop and rest
- Not too noisy
- People choose to walk and cycle
- People feel safe
- Things to do and see
- People feel relaxed
- Clean air

Margate's main street has received a score of just 9 out of 100 for these indicators.

The master plan has been drafted following input from community members and stakeholders and proposes such solutions as delivering safer Channel crossings, particularly side road crossings with pedestrian priority, footpaths from Van Morey Road to Crescent Drive and defined parking spaces along Channel Highway.

The master plan also proposes to revitalise the main street with a series of green space refuges, bringing more nature along the street and perhaps a 'pocket park,' a small park capable of community and civic gatherings.

Once community feedback has closed at the end of July a final plan will be presented to Kingborough Council sometime in August.

Luckily a Tassal vessel was nearby, and its crew were able to rescue him.

Channel Site Manager Chris Gatward said the crew were just so happy they were there and could help.

“We spend a lot of time in this environment and those waters are so cold, especially at this time of the year,” Mr Gatward said.

“Safety on the water is the number one priority for us and everyone else out there.

“Our marine crews are always aware and seek to support the community in the best way possible when safety is at risk.”

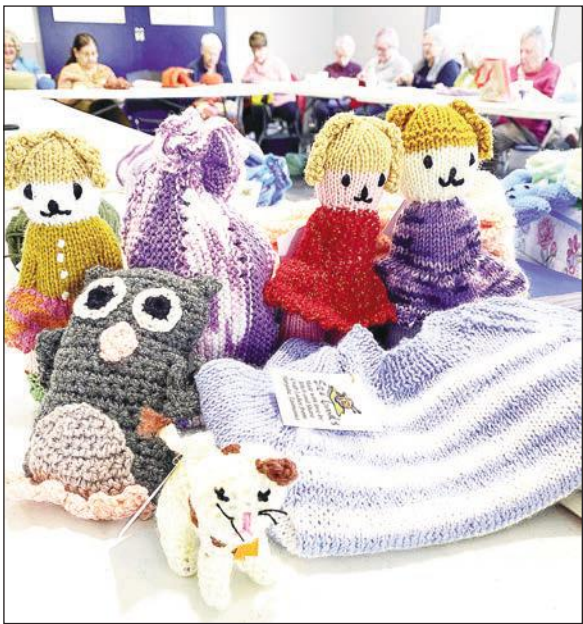

## Information wanted on projectiles

**Police are seeking public information as part of the ongoing investigation into projectiles discharged in southern Tasmania recently.**

"We have determined that ball bearings were discharged from a white Mitsubishi light truck and a white Nissan Patrol utility across the greater Hobart area," said Sergeant Greg Rogers.

Police have received reports of ball bearings damaging 10 homes, four vehicles and six businesses in the areas of Kingston, Hobart, Glenorchy and Cambridge on Tuesday, June 25 and Wednesday, June 26.

"There was potential for significant harm to have been caused in these incidents," Sergeant Rogers said.

"While police are following a specific line of enquiry with the investigation, Taskforce Saturate encourages anyone with information in relation to the discharges to come forward."

# Kingborough schools join statewide inquiry

The Tasmanian Government will undertake an independent review of the state's education system, appointing Vicki Baylis to lead the targeted work.

"We have recently introduced nation-leading structured literacy and phonics programs in our schools but are always open to further improving our education system, which is why the government will undertake a transparent, independent review within the Tasmanian context," Minister for Education Jo Palmer said.

Vicki Baylis - an experienced and well-respected educator with over four decades of experience in Queensland and the Northern Territory - will lead this work in consultation with the Department for Education, Children and Young People and stakeholders.

Ms Baylis will consider Tasmania's demographic profile, socio-economic characteristics and the relationship of all levels of education, as well as learning from other jurisdictions.

The review will be future-focused, with the intent of further improving Tasmania's education system, including literacy and numeracy outcomes over the next decade.

The Tasmanian Government will release the Terms of Reference in the coming weeks.

TASSO, the Tasmanian Association of State School Organisations, has voiced support for an independent inquiry.

"The Tasmanian education data should greatly concern everyone," TASSO President Krissy McCance stated.

"Retention to Year 12 is at 53 per cent, attendance is decreasing, NAPLAN results show Tasmanian students lagging behind other states in almost all categories, school refusal is increasing, students studying STEM are decreasing, students are entering Year 7 with poor literacy and there is a massive shortage of teachers."

Direct student retention rates from Year 10 to Year 12 in government schools were recorded to be 58.4 per cent in 2023.

The attendance rates for Year 7 to Year 10 students at Kingston High School were 78.5 per cent, 84.4 per cent at Tarooma High School and 80.8 per cent for Woodbridge School.

"An education inquiry should encompass education from birth to the completion of university, TAFE or apprenticeships/traineeships," Ms McCance said.

# Kingston Neighbourhood House digital support boost

The Foundation for Rural and Regional Renewal (FRRR), in partnership with Telstra, has awarded \$200,000 via 27 grants to not-for-profit organisations, including Kingston Neighbourhood House (KNH).

The projects are spread across the country and grants range from \$953, which will be used to purchase back-up drives for the computers of staff at Hughenden Kindergarten in Queensland, through to \$10,000 for projects like enhancing KNH's community digital support to ensure well-resourced service provision to community members.

Regional Australia Executive at Telstra Loretta Willaton said Telstra's Connected Communities Grant Program continues to meet rural Australia's ongoing need for improving digital capability and connectivity with both training on and access to, new technology.

"We launched last year knowing that there was a strong demand for funding to support digital connectivity," Ms Willaton said.

"This was confirmed by the high levels of interest and we saw similar demand this year, reaffirming that this is an important and much needed program for digital support.

"We're proud to be able to support these groups and their grassroots initiatives which are improving community disaster preparedness, increasing digital literacy to support both organisations and individuals navigating cybersecurity and building digital capability that will improve service delivery for more sustainable social and environmental outcomes."

FRRR CEO Natalie Egleton said that grant programs like Telstra's Connected Communities Grant Program are key when it comes to enhancing the liveability of remote, rural and regional Australia.

"These grants aren't just about getting people online; ultimately, they're about providing equitable access to services and boosting the overall liveability of non-metro communities across Australia - particularly remote places where there is often very limited access to digital connectivity," Ms Egleton said.

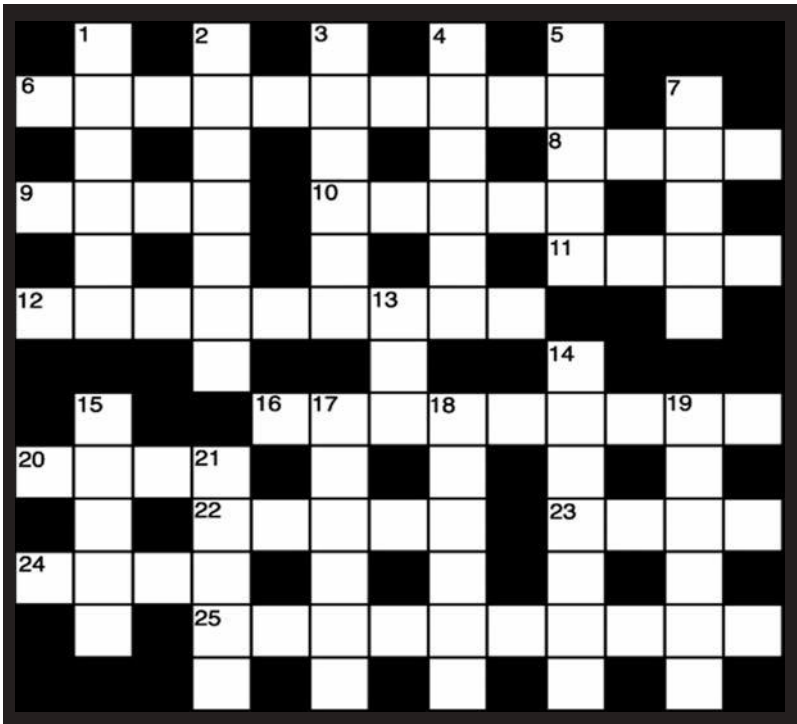


