Kings Quarter breaks ground

Traders In Purple Tasmanian Development Director Jennifer Cooper, Premier of Tasmania, the Honourable Peter Gutwein MP, Mayor of Kingborough, Cr Dean Winter, Traders In Purple Director Charles Daoud and Minister for State Growth, the Honourable Michael Ferguson MP all helped to turn the first sod at the Kings Quarter site when the project officially broke ground on Wednesday, February 17. (PS)

Kingborough residents can look forward to more opportunities to live, work and play in the Kingston CBD after work began last week on Kings Quarter, a section of the Kingston Park development which incorporate homes, office, retail and lifestyle elements.

Several dignitaries joined staff from developers Traders In Purple to break ground on Stage 1 of the \$300m project, which is being marketed as KQ to local and interstate buyers. The Kings Quarter investment by Traders In Purple is expected to stimulate the Kingborough and wider Tasmanian economies over the next 10 years. Long-term projects bring a significant number of jobs, traineeships and offer long-term contracts to local tradespeople, consultants and suppliers.

Council establish complaints system

Mayor of Kingborough, Cr Dean Winter advised the *Kingborough Chronicle* on February 18 that councillors will be establishing a council complaints system.

Details of a confidential Kingborough Ratepayers Association Inc (KRAI) document, regarding oversight and accountability within council administration, were published in the *Kingborough Chronicle* on February 16.

The KRAI document titled *Oversight, Governance and Accountability: KRAI Submission* to Kingborough Council's Audit Panel, stated "insufficient

self-regulation exists to ensure best-practice oversight and good corporate governance and accountability" and "councillors are prevented from whistle blowing about operational matters by legislative restriction".

The *Kingborough Chronicle* asked Kingborough Council's General Manager Gary Arnold to explain why a complaints register does not exist as well as requesting some clarification around the KRAI submission to the audit panel.

Inclusion needed to close the gap

Members of the Kingborough Aboriginal community are among those seeking more inclusive conversations about discussions involving closing the gaps between communities.

The Tasmanian Regional Aboriginal Communities Alliance (TRACA) is calling for a truly inclusive conversation around the four new priority reforms and 16 targets of the National Agreement on Closing the Gap initiative, signed by the State Government in July last year, to ensure that the state is in the best position to see the targets met.

Following a series of emotionally charged round table discussions recently, which included the Minister for Aboriginal Affairs, the Honourable Roger Jaensch MP, various heads of departments, the Tasmanian Aboriginal Corporation (TAC) and representatives from six of the seven Aboriginal organisations represented by TRACA, TRACA co-chair Uncle Rodney Dillon said that meaningful headway could not be made until there was equitable access for all Aboriginal communities.

While TRACA was not consulted during the Coalition of Peaks negotiations ahead of the new National Agreement on Closing the Gap, the state-based round tables provide a new opportunity for true representation for Aboriginal communities from around Tasmania.

"Our regional organisations are not going away," said Uncle Rodney.

"In fact, we are only growing stronger.

"If you look at the number of young people from TRACA who were at the round table meetings, it gives an indication of how important our regional communities are.

"Our young people have great pride in their

Aboriginality, in their culture, in their languages, in their Country, and they are ready to be part of the solution, their voices need to be heard."

In the last Closing the Gap report tabled in Federal Parliament in 2019, only two of the seven previous targets had been met, and TRACA co-chair Aunty Patsy Cameron said that it will require decisive, evidence based solutions over the next decade to ensure that the new Closing the Gap report offers better outcomes for Aboriginal people.

According to the 2016 Census, only just over a quarter of Tasmania's Aboriginal people live in the Greater Hobart area and Aunty Patsy says that regional Aboriginal organisations are in a good position to be able to collate meaningful data to inform decision making.

"We need to get better data," said Aunty Patsy.

"And communities are the ones that are best able to gather that.

"It is also up to the various heads of agencies to assist in gathering reliable and up to date data and to make that available to Aboriginal organisations and government to ensure funding and resources are distributed equitably."

When the State Government signed up to the National Agreement on Closing the Gap, it committed to working closely with all Tasmanian Aboriginal communities to develop the state's Implementation Plan, which needs to address targets across education, employment, health and wellbeing, justice, safety, housing, land and waters, and Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander languages.

Uncle Rodney says that a key measure to ensure that

these targets are met is meaningful land return.

"Our health, our culture, our education, they are all tied closely to Country," said Uncle Rodney.

"The return of land and sea is vital to our healing and must form an integral part of these conversations."

Aunty Patsy said that TRACA's philosophy is based on open and respectful dialogue to achieve positive change.

"TRACA has already had amazing outcomes from the work that we have done," said Aunty Patsy.

"But we have got more to contribute.

"Last week was a good opportunity for the Minister to see the number of people in the room and witness the sincerity of Aboriginal communities from all around the state.

"He can rely on the fact that the people around our table want to find appropriate solutions."

TRACA was formed in 2015 and represents seven Aboriginal organisations and communities:

- South East Tasmania Aboriginal Corporation (South-East Tasmania, including Kingborough, Huon Valley and Far South)
- weetaoona Aboriginal Corporation (Bruny Island)
- Circular Head Aboriginal Corporation (North-West Tasmania)
- Flinders Island Aboriginal Association Inc (Flinders Island)
- melythina tiakana warrana Aboriginal Corporation (North-East Tasmania)
- parrdarrama pungenna Aboriginal Corporation (East Coast and Tasman Peninsula)
- Six Rivers Aboriginal Corporation (Central and North Coast).



Sandfly intersection works to start

Kingborough travellers should notice upgrade works underway on the Huon Highway and Sandfly Road intersection in the coming weeks.

The contract has been awarded to local Tasmanian company Hazell Bros Group and works are scheduled to be completed by the end of the year.

Hazell Bros is a family owned and operated business founded in 1944 by brothers Donald and Rowley Hazell as a transport business operating in Southern Tasmania.

Hazell Bros became involved in earthmoving projects in the 1950s and by the 1970s a civil construction arm began.

Today, second generation brothers Geoffrey and Robert own and operate the company.

The Huon Highway and Sandfly Road intersection upgrade is jointly funded by the Federal and State governments, contributing \$5 million and \$2 million to the

project respectively.

Announcing the awarding of the contract on February 12, Tasmanian Minister for Infrastructure and Transport, the Honourable Michael Ferguson MP said the Sandfly Road intersection design included space for buses and trucks to wait safely in the centre median before turning, plus slip lanes and a deceleration lane to further improve safety and reduce congestion.

"The design also includes pedestrian, cyclist and car parking facilities, better access to the bus stops and improved lighting through the intersection," said Minister Ferguson.

Assistant Minister for Industry Development Senator Jonno Duniham said the Federal and State governments are moving quickly to deliver this project as soon as possible, supporting jobs and getting cash flowing.

"The Huon Highway is a vital link to and from the Huon Valley, connecting major industry sectors such as tourism, forestry, aquaculture and agriculture with Hobart and beyond," said Senator Duniham.

Deputy Prime Minister and Minister for Infrastructure, Transport and Regional Development Michael McCormack said the project formed part of the Australian and Tasmanian Governments' jointly funded \$46 million stimulus package, announced last June, to deliver shovel-ready infrastructure projects and urgent road safety upgrades.

"This critical project will upgrade the busy junction at the Huon Highway and Sandfly Road to improve road safety, better connect world-famous Tasmanian businesses to ports and markets and get people home sooner and safer," said the Deputy Prime Minister.



This time last year, nobody could have comprehended the impact of coronavirus on our society and lives.

As lockdowns continued, thousands of people lost jobs through no fault of their own.

Many people experienced unemployment for the first time in years, or the first time in their lives.

However, even before this pandemic started we had a big unemployment issue.

Southeast Tasmania had the sixth worst youth unemployment rate in the country in 2019, according to analysis by the Brotherhood of St Laurence.

Although we've had years of government press releases boasting about the strength of our economy, many young people have been forced to move interstate to get a job.

Underemployment has also long been a major problem.

The government definition of employment says even one hour's work a week counts as a job.

Clearly that won't help anyone pay the rent, a mortgage or bills.

In Kingborough, about one in five people want to work or work more often but don't have the opportunity.

The private sector alone will never be able to provide enough jobs for everyone.

Even during Tasmania's economic boom of 30 years ago, our private industries just did not have the capacity to employ everyone who wanted to work.

That's why the Greens are pushing to develop a Jobs Guarantee program for young Tasmanians.

A Jobs Guarantee means that if someone can't find work in the private sector, they are guaranteed a job opportunity by the government.

These jobs would be focussed on work that's beneficial to our community.

Whether it's working on local projects, caring for elderly people, preparing for bushfires, looking after landscapes, helping a community group, or something else entirely, there are plenty of opportunities that could provide a job for someone and also help make Kingborough an even better place to live.

Rather than having to choose between moving interstate or being unemployed, a Jobs Guarantee would mean young people could stay in our community, gain valuable skills and work experience, and earn enough money to support themselves.

This is not an original idea, nor is it too good to be true. The idea of increasing employment through government-created jobs was the Australian government's policy for three decades after Second World War.

The economic shockwaves of that conflict were huge. Leaders of the time understood they had to take responsibility for tackling that crisis rather than simply leaving it to the private sector and hoping for the best.

Tasmania's leaders of today should do the same.

Although the serious problems of unemployment have long pre-dated coronavirus, this pandemic has presented us with a unique opportunity to rethink how we view jobs and employment.

We should be doing everything we can to provide opportunities for young Tasmanians.

They have so many other pressures to confront.

Rather than struggling to meet their basic needs, they should have the employment they need to enable them to lead a happy and meaningful life.

Land access for devil monitoring

A team of devil researchers from the University of Tasmania is about to start a monitoring program in Kingborough for Tasmanian devils affected by the transmissible cancer, devil facial tumour 2 disease (DFT2).

The University is looking for land access and suitable properties to conduct monitoring surveys.

Areas of interest include the D'Entrecasteaux Channel and the Huon Valley, from Judbury to Leslie Vale.

Those who have a property in the Huon Valley or Kingborough municipalities and are interested in participating in UTAS monitoring surveys by providing land access can contact researchers to get involved.

Surveys are aimed at determining the distribution and prevalence of DFT2 as well as collecting valuable data and biological samples to assess the impact of this new cancer epidemic.

This information will be vital for developing enduring devil conservation strategies.

The surveys involve setting custom-made culvert pipe traps for 10 consecutive nights.

Traps are checked every morning, and animals are released at the point of capture after appropriate health checks.

Over the last 25 years, Tasmanian devils have been facing their own pandemic.

Researcher, Dr Rodrigo Hamede, advises that devil facial tumour disease (DFTD) is an infectious cancer that has decimated devil populations throughout Tasmania.

Ten years ago, scientists thought there was a real chance DFTD would drive the devil to extinction.

Recent studies indicate devils are evolving resilience against DFTD and the epidemic is slowing down, suggesting that devils could coexist with DFTD.

However, in 2014 a new transmissible cancer, DFT2, was discovered near Cygnet.

Although DFTD and DFT2 look similar and have the same transmission mode, they evolved independently from each other.

DFT2 is so far confined to the Channel region, but data from recent surveys suggest that its prevalence and spread are rapidly increasing.

DFT2 poses an additional conservation threat for the already devastated devil populations, and whether the evolved resilience in response to DFTD is transferable to DFT2 is unknown.

Tasmanian devils need help to overcome this new cancer epidemic.

Kettering footpath needs urgent action

Electors in the Division of Huon are invited to sign a petition calling on the Tasmanian Government to construct 200 metres of path between Oyster Court and Oxleys Road on the Channel Highway in Kettering.

Member for Huon, the Honourable Dr Bastian Seidel MLC is sponsoring the e-petition, posted on the Legislative Council of Tasmania website on February 15, on behalf of Kettering residents.

"Whether it's our children walking to school, people accessing local services and shops or groups promoting healthier lifestyles, we need to do all we can to ensure our infrastructure is safe and fit for use," said Dr Seidel. "What currently exists in Kettering is neither."

"Let's make sure this issue gets the action it deserves." Dr Seidel said he became aware of the issue while participating in a walking tour with the Kettering Walkers in 2020.

"The walking group is part of a wonderful Heart Foundation initiative that encourages healthy living by connecting people to become active, with the benefit of making new friends," noted Dr Seidel.

"Or much worse, are non-existent and require pedestrians to "go bush" next to a busy regional highway.

"This is not only unsafe, but the Kettering community deserves and expects more.

"Time and again, we see regional communities are taken for granted.

"Kettering is a thriving community whose residents pay the same taxes and rates as everyone else.

"In the ethos of the Kettering Walkers, we need to support our communities with infrastructure that allows people to be active and connected.

"That is why I am delighted to be able to sponsor an e-petition on behalf of the residents of Kettering, which calls on the government to construct 200m of path between Oyster Court and Oxleys Road on the Channel Highway."

Vaccine bookings open

Vaccination staff at the Royal Hobart Hospital are undertaking final training exercises in preparation for the first COVID-19 vaccine delivery as vaccination clinic bookings commenced on February 16.

The Royal Hobart Hospital is in the final stages of preparation for the start of COVID-19 vaccination program, which will commence this week before extending statewide in March.

Under Phase 1A of the roll-out plan, the vaccine will first be given to the following people, as they are considered at higher-risk of contracting COVID or likely to become seriously unwell from it:

- Staff working in designated quarantine and border facilities
- Frontline health care staff working in higher risk locations
- Residents and staff of residential aged care and disability care facilities

These people will be contacted directly to make an appointment to receive the vaccine.

On February 17, Tasmania's Minister for Health, the Honourable Sarah Courtney MP advised that the vaccination program is to be expanded to include other

groups of the community, as per the Commonwealth's guidelines, when the early phases of the roll out have been completed.

In Phase 1B of the roll-out plan, the vaccine will be offered to:

- People aged 70 years and over
- Other health care workers
- Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people aged over 18 years
- Adults with underlying medical conditions
- Critical and high-risk workers, including defence, emergency services and meat processing

In Phase 2A, the vaccine will be offered to:


- Adults aged between 50 and 69 years
- Other critical and high-risk workers

In Phase 2B, remaining Tasmanians aged 18 years and over will be offered vaccination.

Children will be vaccinated in Phase 3, where it is clinically recommended.

"It provides hands on experience, enabling recipients to be part of projects with real outcomes benefiting their community," Mr Brewster stated.


"The scholarship also helps shape the workforce of tomorrow, ensuring Tasmanians have the skills to provide their community with essential services in an environmentally sustainable way."

Speaking about the event, Traders In Purple Development Director for Tasmania Jennifer Cooper said that Kings Quarter is a partnership with Kingborough Council and represents the beginning of the revitalisation of the old Kingston High School site.

Mayor of Kingborough, Cr Dean Winter said that council wanted an experienced development partner to deliver the residential and commercial parts of the site.

"Councils are experienced in building playgrounds, roads, footpaths and other public infrastructure but we are not developers," Mayor Winter remarked.

"In order to achieve what we set out to accomplish with the site, we needed to find the right partner to develop it.

"Traders In Purple have the runs on the board with developments like this across Australia.

"They bring great expertise and have brought along local builders, contractors and even local real estate agents to work with them.

"The homes will be close to shops, the playground and parklands area.

"They will be a great addition to the area."

The commencement of housing construction on the site follows the completion of the Community Hub, Health Centre, coworking spaces, offices, meeting rooms and a café on the site, with the playground expected to open in late March.

Ms Cooper said these community elements were important to the Kings Quarter development in many ways.

"Traders In Purple is committed to creating a new community for families and individuals of all ages and lifestyles at KQ and it will offer local contractors and suppliers long-term opportunities over the next 10 years," Ms Cooper said.

"Apart from the 80 homes in stage one of Kings Quarter, the Masterplan also incorporates entertainment facilities and a 10,000 square metre modern, environmentally responsible commercial office space, which has the potential to create 800 full-time equivalent local jobs and be a significant multiplier for the Kingborough municipality.

"The development focuses on community living for all ages and lifestyles with exciting recreation and employment options incorporated into the design."

Premier Gutwein said the development is a bold, innovative project that demonstrates the confidence in Kingborough and the growing economy.

"The first stage of the development will result in the construction of 80 new, environmentally responsible homes, along with associated infrastructure, delivering over 60

jobs per annum during construction and over 600 new jobs once complete and millions of benefits to the local Kingborough community," Premier Gutwein said.

"We are focused on growing our economy, creating jobs, and getting even more Tasmanians back into work as we continue to rebuild a stronger Tasmania and projects like this are exactly what our state needs as we continue to recover."

Despite COVID-19 uncertainty, confidence in the project remains strong with "exceptional levels" of interest in the first stage at KQ and in Kingston in general.

The ground-breaking ceremony marks the beginning of construction and was brought forward due to increased interest and steady sales over the past few months.

Located adjacent to Kingborough Council's new multi-million dollar public park, streetscapes and landscaping in Stage 1 at Kings Quarter was designed by Tasmanian landscape architecture firm Lange Design to integrate seamlessly with its surroundings.

Along with the existing state-of-the-art health centre and the award winning Kingborough Community Hub, Kingston Park forms a new centrepiece for the Kingston Community.

"We attribute the growing interest in Kings Quarter to the fact it is located in the heart of Kingston and it is offering a diverse range of housing types including free-standing homes, townhouses and apartments," Ms Cooper explained.

"Kings Quarter is all about lifestyle and community.

"New homes, situated next to award winning community facilities and Kingborough Council's new park and playground, are designed to attract new residents of all ages to live in Kingston, close to the beach, great shopping centres and services and within commuting distance to Hobart."

The fully landscaped residential and planned commercial and entertainment precincts will serve to interconnect with the four hectares of natural and curated public space that feature throughout the development.

Kings Quarter is intended as an innovative residential, retail and lifestyle destination, with the potential to reinvent Kingston and is part of the Kingborough region's most significant urban regeneration project to date.

Step towards a fair and impartial government

Mayor Winter responded to the questions on behalf of Kingborough Council.

"I am not aware of a complaints register existing at any council in Tasmania," replied Mayor Winter.

"It's not a requirement of the *Local Government Act*.

"That said, councillors considered the [KRAI] complaints policy suggestion to be a good one and will be establishing one."

Mayor Winter also explained that the audit panel is an internal process and wasn't able to deal with KRAI's submission.

"The Audit Panel ensures that there is an adequate and effective system of internal controls throughout council," replied Mayor Winter.

"The Panel decided that public submissions should be dealt with by elected members, as they are accountable to our community.

"I support that view."

Regarding KRAI's statement that current mechanisms within council's administration are unable to resolve oversight gaps, Mayor Winter responded that Kingborough Councillors "agreed with a number of points" made in KRAI's submission.

"Councillors considered the [KRAI] documents and agreed with a number of points," said Mayor Winter.

"As a result of the submission, a complaints policy will be developed, human resources and legal matters are now routinely reported to council."

In relation to councillor's being prevented from whistleblowing on operational matters by legislative restriction, Mayor Winter's responded that councillors do not get involved in council's operational matters as that is not their role.

"Councillors, like a board, do not get involved in operational matters," said Mayor Winter.

"It is not just a legislative restriction, it is the way governance works.

"We set the vision, the direction, the projects and policies on behalf of the community.

"Our General Manager and staff deliver them."

The KRAI submission made 19 recommendations, including that council policy enable community members to make Code of Conduct Complaints.

In a presentation document given to Kingborough Councillors on February 9, KRAI president John McDonald OAM summarises KRAI's submission, including recommendations, the basis for each, the process undertaken and status of outcomes to date.

Recommendations 4, 5 and 18 deal with Code of Conduct matters, including that "Council review the employee Code of Conduct Administrative Policy with a view to it becoming endorsed Council policy to enable community members to make Code of Conduct complaints, if and where necessary, for impartial assessment".

McDonald's presentation summary says "no public evidence exists that the violations of Employee Code of Conduct" as documented in KRAI's June 2020 submission to Kingborough Council "have been actioned by the General Manager".

"Current Employee Code of Conduct Administrative Policy is a mechanism that cannot be accessed by ratepayers with a legitimate complaint regarding staff conduct," noted Mr McDonald.

"Staff can make a complaint against a councillor under the Councillor's Code of Conduct Policy but councillors or ratepayers do not have a similar mechanism to do likewise against staff."

Mr McDonald's presentation summary notes KRAI's submission has details of instances where employee conduct has infringed council's Administrative Policy, allegedly without caution or reprimand.

Further, Mr McDonald claims "verifiable complaints" were "not given fair and impartial assessment".

The *Kingborough Chronicle* also invited a response on KRAI's statement that the *Local Government Act* is "skewed in favour of management".

Neither Mr Arnold nor Mayor Winter responded regarding this matter.

Saltmarsh restoration

Brown River Saltmarsh restoration efforts are progressing, with federal politicians showing their support, meeting Mayor of Kingborough, Cr Dean Winter and council staff on site recently to discuss the project.

In 2019, Kingborough Council was successful in its application for a \$20,000 grant to work on the area from the Communities Environment Program through Federal Member for Franklin, Julie Collins' office.

This money will be used to assist restoration efforts of the Browns River Saltmarsh near Kingston Beach.

"It's obviously a valuable community asset and one which we're pleased to support."

The site also aims to raise awareness of the importance of saltmarshes to the environment and provide details of the impact of climate change on these sites.
