Townhouses for Kingston Town

A planning application for a five-stage, 36-unit development at the northern end of Kingston Town Shopping Centre was advertised for public viewing and input on July 10.

Kingborough Council received the application for 37-59 Maranoa Road with access over 99 Channel Highway on June 25.

Vehicle access is proposed from the road joining the shopping centre car park with the Channel Highway.

The site of the proposed high-density development is currently covered in mature vegetation which, according to the development application documents, would require clearing.

The proponent for the development is building company Revelstoke Building Solutions Pty Ltd.

The company previously built an adjacent 18-unit townhouse development in 2020 after the Tasmanian Planning Commission approved the rezoning of part of the land at 37-59 Maranoa Road from 'General Business' to 'Inner Residential' and removed the Biodiversity Protection Area overlay in August 2018.

Bendi-goes from Kingston

In a recent email sent to its Kingston banking customers, Bendigo Bank is closing its Kingston branch at Channel Court on Friday, August 13.

"After much consideration and following a detailed review, Bendigo Bank has made the difficult decision to close its Kingston branch, located at Channel Court Shopping Centre, Shop 34, 37-43 Channel Highway, Kingston," the email from Bendigo Bank Regional Manager Jordan Lovell stated.

"The branch will close from 2pm on Friday, August 13, 2021."

Customers of Bendigo Bank will now have to travel to Hobart if they wish to do their banking in a physical branch.

The news has disappointed a number of locals who wrote to the

Kingborough Chronicle about their concerns, including increasing traffic on the Southern Outlet.

"From Friday, August 13, 2021, your accounts at Bendigo Bank Kingston will be automatically transferred to our flagship branch, Bendigo Bank Hobart, located at 109-113 Liverpool Street, Hobart," the email continued.

"An ATM is also available at Bendigo Bank Hobart to provide convenient access to cash.

"You can also continue to make in-person cash transactions using the Bank@Post service at Australia Post in the Channel Court Shopping Centre, Shop 80, 29 Channel Highway, Kingston or continue to transact 24/7 online.

"In coming weeks, as well as providing regular banking services, our Kingston branch staff can provide assistance for passbook customers who don't yet have a debit card to move to statement accounts and debit cards, which will allow transactions directly with merchants or through Bank@Post."

One positive piece of news from the email confirmed that all of the Kingston staff at Bendigo Bank would not lose their jobs, and be given an opportunity within Bendigo Bank at another branch.

"Our Kingston branch staff will be re-deployed to other roles within our business network where they will continue to assist with any lending or other enquiries that you may have."

This is particularly obvious for new subdivisions and roads but
I am noticing more and more of our trees are being removed.

It is already easy to remove trees on grounds (sometimes
spurious) of safety and meeting the often-narrow objectives of
new development.

It is important that council has oversight, decision making and
enforcement of this process.

Developers have an eye on profit but we the people have to
live with the denuding of our environment and the long-term
effects of loss of habitat.

Do you know that Tasmania alone has more than 60 plants
starting with A and B on the threatened species list let alone the
rest of the alphabet?

The complete list is too long to count.

We also have 90 vertebrae animals on Tasmania's threatened species
list and this includes birds and animals in our local environment.

Did you know that the white bellied eagle (one lives on the Alum
Cliffs and frequently flies along Kingston Beach) is also on this list?
We think what we do doesn't matter, but it does.

Every single tree matters.

A solid decision-making framework has a structure.

When I am making business decisions there are a few criteria I use:

Is this good for the environment?

Is this good for the community?

Is this good for our business?

Is this good for me?

An ethical decision is one whereby all decision-making points
are considered.

In this case, I think the consideration of this proposal is only
good for the business of a few.

That does not consider a wider wholistic, ecological, community
-based wellness frame at all.

Imagine where New York would be without Central Park.

Imagine London without Hyde Park.

Both areas are intrinsic to their cities because they bring life
and diversity to the area.

We do not have such a park but we do have the trees.

Weakening of the controls on tree removal may be attractive
to council from a resourcing viewpoint, but the cost of this
responsibility is minor in the context of protecting the future
character of the municipality.

It is an essential responsibility in ensuring the ecologically
sustainable development of Kingborough.

Individual landowners and developers rarely have the breadth of under-
standing required when considering removal of trees, and local govern-
ment is the only layer of government that can or will ensure that natural
values are taken into consideration at the scale of individual trees.

I strongly urge Kingborough Council not to remove Part 7 of its
Health and Environmental Services By-law, now or at any time
in the future.

It would be an abrogation of council's responsibilities in meeting
the Sustainable Development Objectives of Tasmania's Resource
Management and Planning System.

remove or lop trees," Mr Arnold stated.

"We already have a list of frequently asked questions and
answers available on our website that addresses this in greater
detail.

"Pursuant to the *Local Government Act 1993* in the making of
a By-law there is a requirement that the By-law be certified by
a legal practitioner that its provisions are in accordance with the
law.

"In order for this to happen, council has appropriately sought
advice from the assisting legal professionals who will certify the
By-law."

Removal of trees at Kingston Town

Dear Editor,

Eighteen townhouses now stand at 99 Channel Highway on the Kingston Town Shopping Centre site on what was once a beautiful grassy open area.

These buildings are bereft of green garden space.

Revelstoke Building Solutions Pty Ltd, the developer of these townhouses, has lodged a Development Application (DA) with the Kingborough Council to build 36 more townhouses behind the existing ones and at the rear of the dwellings at 87-97 Channel Highway.

If approved, this will involve the removal of mature eucalypt trees and the virtual obliteration of the green open-space remaining in this corner of the Kingston Town site.

If built, the townhouses would be densely packed together.

I hope Kingston residents who enjoy the greenery at Kingstown Town will take the time to read the DA, which is available online, and the associated planning documents that are available at Kingborough Council Offices, and lodge a representation against this DA.

The deadline for representations is Friday, July 23.

I appreciate many residents are feeling election fatigued with the Kingborough Council by-election being held so soon after we all voted in the May state election.

Although voting in local government elections is not compulsory, councils play a significant role in the lives of our residents.

So, it's important to have your say on who you believe can continue the momentum for change created by our former Mayor, Dean Winter.

Having lived in Kingborough for over 30 years, I've witnessed the significant growth that has occurred.

While there have been many positives such as attracting new businesses and services to the area, we are all too familiar with the pressure this has put on our many facilities.

Written submission period extended

Written submissions to the Commission of Inquiry into the Tasmanian Government's Responses to Child Sexual Abuse in Institutional Settings will now be accepted until September 3.

The Commission is particularly keen to hear from people who have been affected by, or who have knowledge of, recent allegations and incidents of child sexual abuse in the education system and public schools, the health

system and at the Ashley Youth Detention Centre. The Commissioners have extended the submissions period to allow as many people as possible to contribute. More than 70 submissions have already been received from victim-survivors, organisations and supporters of children who have been affected by current issues in relation to the Tasmanian Government's response to child sexual abuse in institutional settings.

"We greatly appreciate the time and energy that has gone into making submissions, which will be extremely valuable," President and Commissioner the Honourable Marcia Neave AO said. Written submissions are invited from individuals, groups and organisations whose insights, experiences and ideas will inform the Commission's understanding of the current gaps in the Tasmanian Government's responses to child

sexual abuse and help to identify opportunities for change. The Commission is able to provide assistance to prepare submissions. Tasmania Legal Aid has also been engaged to assist people to make submissions on matters which fall within the scope of the inquiry. Huonville express bus

Two new Huonville-Hobart express bus services commenced on July 12.

The new Tassielink services aims to ease traffic congestion and benefit those commuting between Huonville and Hobart during weekday morning and afternoon peak periods. The service will run four times in each direction, with the first bus departing Huonville at 6:05am and then every hour until 9:05am. The first bus from Hobart will depart at 3:17pm and then every hour with the last bus at 6:17pm. Provision of the new services aims to ease traffic congestion and encourage use of public transport. Managing Director for Tassielink Transit, Shane Dewsbury, said the busses had been designed for Tasmanian roads and travel conditions, providing a comfortable travel experience for passengers.

"We just hope that the Huonville community jump on board, use the services and make it one of their first choices of getting in and out of Hobart," Mr Dewsbury said. Huon Valley Mayor Bec Enders offered her support for the service. "This is what our community have been asking for and certainly those that work in Hobart," said Mayor Enders. Mayor Enders also commented on the prospect of travel being less daunting for those frequently travelling between Hobart and Huonville, with a potential saving of 40 minutes each day, and easing stress and traffic congestion. Attending the launch on July 7, Infrastructure and Transport Minister Michael Ferguson MP commented that an affordable express service with no stops will become a comfortable service for those needing to travel to and from Huonville during peak hours.

Outpouring over tree protection law lopping

An outpouring of concerns regarding proposed changes to Kingborough Council's tree-clearing by-laws were received by the *Kingborough Chronicle* last week, including from community group leaders and several councillors.

Councillor Gideon Cordover said the proposed removal of Part 7 of the Environmental Services By-law would mean trees in urban areas not covered by the biodiversity code overlay would no longer have "the degree of protection they currently enjoy".

"The outpouring of submissions imploring council not to abandon Part 7 of the Environmental Services By-law is a testament to our community's interest in maintaining protection for high conservation value trees on private property," wrote Cr Cordover.

"This is particularly relevant in urban areas that are seeing unprecedented levels of development."

President of Howden Progress Association, Leslie Frost, is also concerned regarding proposed changes.

"I wish to express my concern that council is proposing to delete Part 7 of Kingborough Council's Environmental By-law," wrote Ms Frost.

"I understand that exemptions will increase, thus making it easier to clear land under the coming Statewide Planning Scheme (SPS) and that our by-law will become invalid.

"We all know that the SPS is designed to 'remove red and green tape' for developers to enable them to maximise their profit at the expense of the environment and the community.

"Just look at the rooftop suburbia created by Spring Farm, Whitewater Creek and soon Huntingfield.

"Parts of Kingborough are still beautiful, but uglification is proceeding apace and we are rapidly losing the character that makes our municipality desirable and ecologically sustainable."

Councillor Cordover said tree protection is critically important to the community and proposed by-law changes also impact the municipality's funds.

"The Kingborough Environmental Fund, which has been receiving financial offsets for the removal of vegetation since 2004, will no longer receive the same amount of money once Part 7 is removed," said Cr Cordover.

"Removing Part 7 from the by-law will impact council's ability to increase the tree offset from \$250 per

high conservation value tree and \$500 per very high conservation value tree when people or businesses seek to damage trees on private property that are; deemed to be of high or very high conservation value, or on the significant tree register as per Kingborough's Biodiversity Offset Policy."

"It remains to be seen what impact removing Part 7 of the Environmental By-law will have on council's ability to enact this aspect of the Long Term Financial Plan."

Cr Cordover said in the Kingborough Council Long Term Financial Plan, adopted on February 16, 2021, council agreed to include the statement "there may be an opportunity to increase revenue for the Kingborough Environmental Fund by reviewing the Biodiversity Offset Policy against alternative tree valuation frameworks such as the City of Melbourne Tree Valuation method".

Councillor Flora Fox says council should seek further legal advice before making changes to the by-law.

"I believe this change will remove important regulatory aspects that currently provide some degree of environmental protection for high conservation value trees and trees considered significant across our Kingborough community," said Cr Fox.

"This decision [to remove Part 7 of the Environmental By-law] is apparently based on legal advice.

"Given the complexity of the documents and the potential negative outcomes across our municipality from these changes, I would strongly support council seeking a second legal opinion, and also canvassing the approaches of other municipalities to what must be a shared problem.

"If the proposed by-law is adopted, council will not have an appropriate regulatory framework for exempt and no-planning-permit-required (NPR) vegetation removal," continued Cr Fox.

"And, as also stated in council's Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ) document on this matter, in the event Part 7 is removed, the removal of high conservation value trees and some trees listed on the Significant Tree Register will no longer be regulated.

"In addition, as there is a time gap between when a tree is listed on the Significant Tree Register in accordance with council policy and the planning scheme being amended to include this tree.

"The removal of Part 7 could see trees listed on the Register but not yet listed, removed without any permit requirements," noted Cr Fox.

"Reliance on the cumbersome and totally ineffective process of the Significant Tree Register appears fraught and provides no confidence to me as to its part in any meaningful future tree protection.

"Cumbersome because council's Strategic Planner has previously advised [there's] a time gap of up to 12 months to get a Significant Tree registered in the planning scheme.

"As of February 2019, a total of only 43 trees plus two groups of Italian Poplars on the outskirts of Margate were on the Significant Tree Register across all of Kingborough," said Cr Fox.

"This totally reinforces the ineffectiveness of this tool for tree protection in our municipality, and the almost zero care factor shown by council to encourage nomination and subsequent progression to this register through a flawed and under-resourced process.

"Once the new Tasmanian Planning Scheme and LPSs come into effect, council's FAQ sheet says the urban-type zones will no longer have tree provisions for most of Kingborough, the ability to require offsets for tree removal will become unclear, and exemptions will also increase.

"As well, inappropriate tree removal is at odds with the implementation of Kingborough Council's Climate Change policies, where shade and canopy cover will become more important in a warming climate.

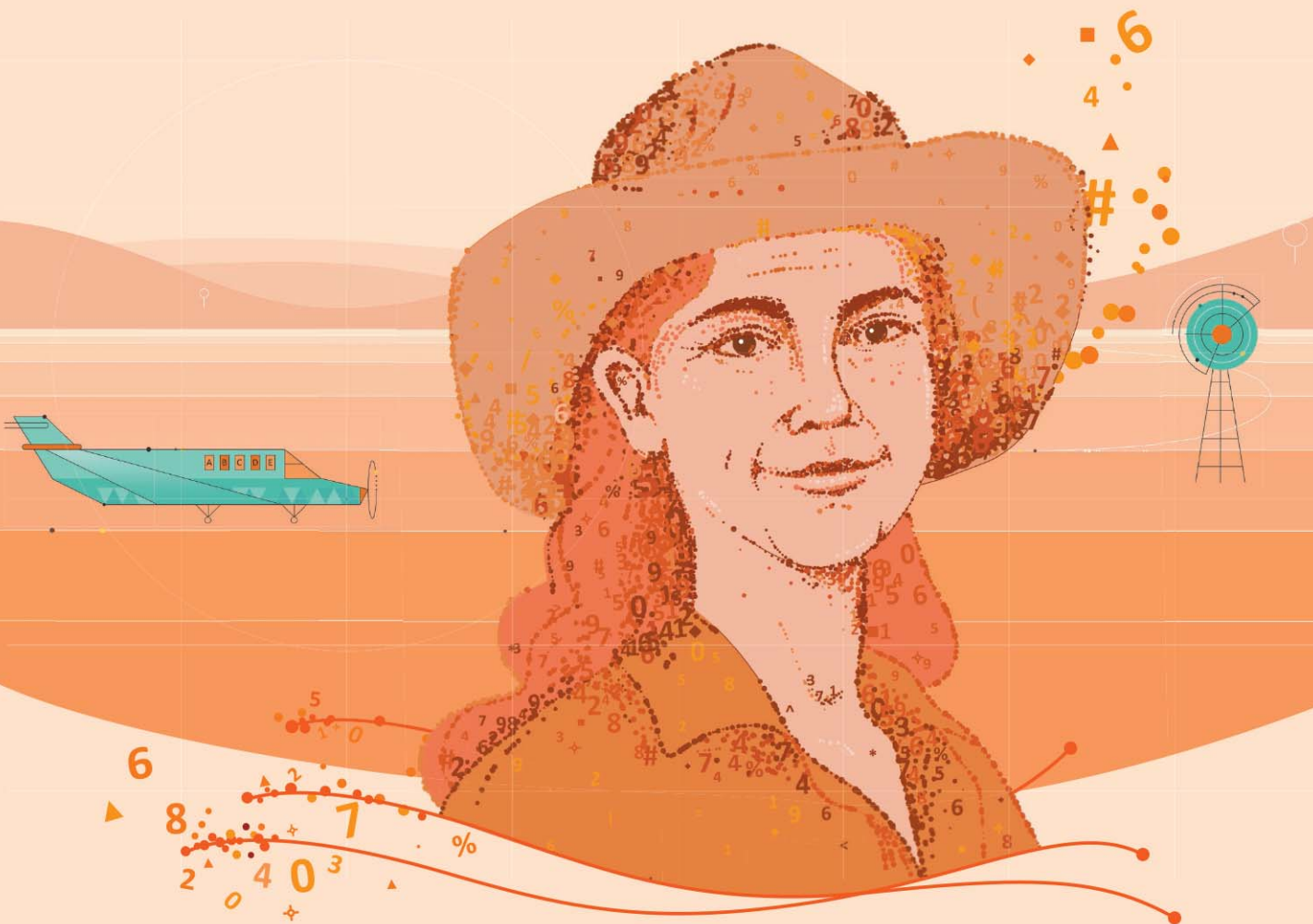
"All very unsatisfactory," concluded Cr Fox.

Public submissions on the proposed changes to the environmental by-law closed on July 19.

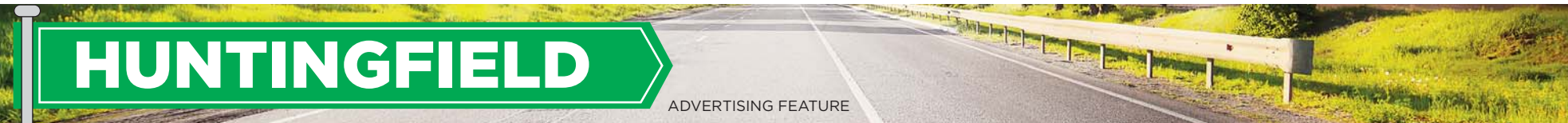

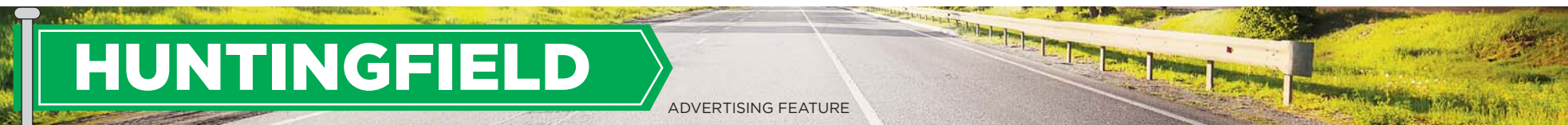

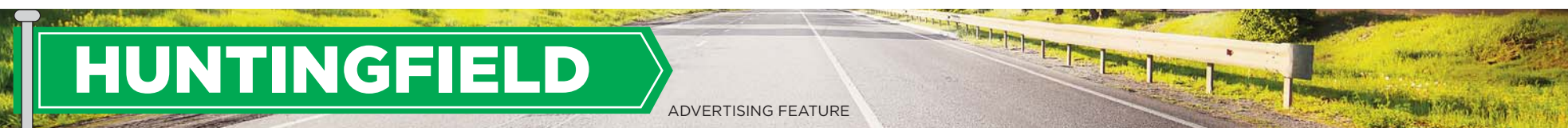

"Members in this diverse group come from not only all over Tasmania but also from further afield, with connections through a passion for fabric, fibre and threads, colour and texture and a desire to share ideas and knowledge collected over many years and from varying backgrounds."

Stitching and Beyond's exhibition coordinator Karen Stack said pieces from the annual challenge tour Tasmania every year and a biennial exhibition of new works is due to be unveiled in September.

"The Stitching and Beyond biennial exhibition *Out of Hand* is to be held in Hobart, in the Long Gallery at the Salamanca Arts Centre between September 24 and October 4," said Ms Stack.

"This exhibition aims to showcase the broad approach we take to textiles from traditional quilting and embroidery, painting, dyeing, mixed media, to three-dimensional pieces and wearable art.

"The diverse group includes spinners, felters, shoemakers, basket weavers, printers, calligraphers, quilters and embroiderers."
