Health boost for Kingston

The 2021-22 Tasmanian Budget provides \$10 million towards Stage 2 of the Kingston Health Centre, with total funding of \$30 million allocated for the centre located at Kingston Park.

Liberal Member for Franklin, Nic Street said Stage 2 would deliver more community-based health facilities for the growing region.

"The government will work closely with the Kingborough Council and surrounding health services to ensure the benefits of the new centre are maximised," Mr Street said.

The Kingston Health Centre has been providing vital care closer to home for thousands of Tasmanians in Kingborough.

"This has taken pressure off our hospitals, especially the Royal Hobart Hospital," Mr Street said.

"The Tasmanian Government is committed to increasing community-based care in areas like the high-growth Kingborough municipality."

Labor Member for Franklin, Dean Winter pointed out concerns with the announcement.

"The Liberals have already broken their promise," said Mr Winter.

"The budget funds only \$10 million from a \$30 million election promise and they won't complete the project until 2027.

"I'm not sure why the government thinks announcing

they won't deliver their promise for six years is a good thing.

"We actually need improved healthcare services now. "When Mr Street and Premier Gutwein stood on the site and said they'd finally build the next stage, I don't recall them saying they wouldn't do it until 2027, but that's what the budget says."

The 2021-22 Budget includes a record \$10.7 billion investment into health over the next four years.

"Our priority is ensuring Tasmanians get the right healthcare in the right place, at the right time, which isn't necessarily in an emergency department or hospital bed in one of our major acute hospitals," Mr Street said.

"That's why we are investing, not only in our major hospitals, but in community health programs, services and infrastructure, like the Kingston Health Centre."

Mr Winter suggested the funding could be spent more effectively.

"Healthcare isn't about new buildings, it's about doctors, nurses and services that help people get better and stay healthy," said Mr Winter.

"Despite building the new centre, the government didn't actually provide any additional services than already existed in the old centre.

"There is no sign of any new services for Kingston in the budget either," concluded Mr Winter.

Service squeeze here to stay

Labor Member for Franklin, Dean Winter is disappointed the State Government has snubbed calls for more room for the Service Tasmania outlet at Kingston.

Mr Winter says the closure of the Kingston Bendigo Bank branch and vacancy, there is an opportunity to move into a bigger space.

Service Tasmania shares a space in the Channel Court Shopping Centre with Centrelink and Medicare, which are federal services.

The space only has capacity to serve 10 customers at any one time and people regularly have to wait outside.

Mr Winter says the situation is unacceptable and the space is too small to service the needs of the population in a fast-growing area.

Mr Winter recently wrote to Premier Peter Gutwein to express his concern.

The Premier's response states the State Government has no plans to relocate the Service Tasmania shop.

In July, Mr Winter and Federal Member for Franklin,

Julie Collins jointly called for more room for customers at Kingston and pointed out the former Bendigo Bank premises in the same shopping complex had become available when the bank branch closed.

"It is extremely disappointing the Premier won't consider moving the state service so customers would not be treated in this unacceptable manner," Mr Winter said.

"This is an issue that will not go away as Kingborough is one of the fastest-growing municipalities in the state."

Mr Gutwein's response acknowledges that the Kingston outlet is busy but says the situation has been exacerbated by COVID-19 protocols and describes it as a "temporary inconvenience".

Back in 2016, the Federal Government wanted to close Centrelink and Medicare in Kingston, forcing people to travel to Hobart or to Huonville, however, after a public outcry the services moved into the existing Service Tasmania outlet.

Canberra, we have a problem

There is a "large lump of rock" separating the southern boundary of Hobart and the lucrative economics of housing development on the prime farming lands that lie beyond the southern boundaries of Kingston.

Attempts by Tasmanian Governments to accommodate a federal policy of gross immigration, based on Ponzi economics, has reached an impasse here.

With Hobart limited for housing development by an even larger lump of rock to our west, our northern suburbs heading for Launceston and deep water to the east.

Opportunities for further housing expansion are becoming very vertuous.

The effect on the Kingston administrative and social well-being has reached a roundabout of planning conflicts with no exit road of anywhere near sufficient capacity in sight.

State politics, I exclude the professional town planners and engineers, seem to favour pushing in the houses, make some money and to hell the social consequences.

circulating roundabouts, are pathetic compared to the social pressures arising from unfettered ribbon housing development down the Channel.

Perhaps the "large lump of rock" has become a problem of national importance and should be dealt with by the federal purse?

Or perhaps we should face the fact the "large lump of rock" is just too large and the promised lucrative sprawling southern suburbs is a bridge, or tunnel, too far.



Outlet plans open for comment

Consultation has commenced on projects aimed at reducing traffic congestion between Kingston and the Hobart CBD, with residents encouraged to have their say.

An integrated suite of projects are planned as part of the Hobart City Deal.

- The projects combine greater capacity with an extra lane:
- On the Southern Outlet from Olinda Grove;
- At the bottleneck joining Davey and Macquarie Streets; and

- Into Macquarie Street.

The extra transit lane will be for the exclusive use for buses, emergency vehicles, motorbikes, taxis and private vehicles with three or more occupants.

This will be complemented by new park and ride facilities at Huntingfield and Firthside and up to 70 extra bus services to improve travel along this road corridor.

The intersection between Davey Street and Macquarie Street will be realigned to include four lanes (up from three) from the Southern Outlet into Macquarie Street,

as well as the removal of parking and an establishment of clearways down to the intersection with Molle Street.

On Macquarie and Davey Streets, plans include improved bus shelters at busy bus stops and a new cycling lane on Davey Street.

Community consultation on the concept designs for the transit lane and Macquarie and Davey Street projects will take place until Monday, 27 September 2021.

Check in on public transport

The Tasmanian Government's Check in TAS app requirements expanded to include more locations on Friday, September 3.

Tasmanians aged 16 or over who use public transport, such as a bus or ferry will be required to check in.

People entering a passenger terminal such as an airport will also be required to check in.

Everyone aged 16 years or older is already required to use the Check in TAS app when entering most businesses and events.

All passenger buses, ferries and airports are required to register for and display QR codes for the Check in TAS app in order for people to check in.

To avoid delays, buses and ferries are not required to have alternative means of checking in.

If anyone does not have a smartphone, or someone with them who can check them in as a guest on a bus or ferry, they should make a personal note of their journey.

Anyone heading to a Tasmanian airport will also be required to check in from Friday, September 3.

Whether it is to pick up arriving passengers, for personal travel, or for work at an airport, everyone must check in.

It is important to note the new requirements do not apply to:

- School students, regardless of their age, travelling on a bus or ferry on a school day.
- Travel on a ferry in a car when passengers remain in the car.
- Travellers disembarking from a plane at an airport terminal.

Penalties may apply for not checking in at a required location.

Bruny Island Bird Festival funded

The Federal Government is investing in Tasmanian tourism by funding four new festivals that will attract more visitors to the state and support local jobs and businesses.

The government is providing \$363,200 to support the Bruny Island Bird Festival, Beaker Street Festival, Great Eastern Wine Week and Junction Arts Festival.

Minister for Trade, Tourism and Investment, Dan Tehan, said this funding was part of a \$13.5 million investment in Tasmanian tourism.

"Our government has a four-stage plan that will see

travel restrictions lifted when 80 per cent of adults over 16 are fully vaccinated," Mr Tehan said.

"We need all Australians to roll up their sleeves and get vaccinated so we can travel freely again.

"We are supporting exciting new Tasmanian festivals because the best thing our government can do for tourism businesses is to get tourists back travelling and spending money."

Assistant Minister for Industry Development, Jonno Duniam, said the Federal Government is also committing \$2.23 million to support the Growing a Skilled Workforce Program, that would help train and upskill

tourism sector workers.


"Our government is funding festivals that will attract more visitors and drive economic growth in our state," Assistant Minister Duniam said.

"We're also supporting tourism sector workers because these festivals will create job opportunities for Tasmanians, with around 15 per cent of all jobs in Tasmania supported by tourism."

The funding is provided through the Recovery for Regional Tourism Program, which is part of the Federal Government's \$1 billion COVID-19 Relief and Recovery Fund.





The history of Saddle Road – Part 2

Lifetime resident of Kettering, Ian King has documented his memories of the people who resided along Saddle Road.

In *The History of Saddle Road - Part 1*, published in the August 10 edition of the *Kingborough Chronicle*, Ian described the early days of the community along Saddle Road, beginning at the foothills west of the village of Kettering and travelling east toward the D'Entrecasteaux Channel.

In Part 2, Ian's anecdotes paint a picture of a flourishing group of settlers; individuals and families busy with rural life and livelihood pursuits, including orchardists, cattlemen, shop owners, ferrymen and farm hands, who each contributed in their own way to the establishment of the Kettering village.

Saddle Road is the common thread and the thoroughfare bringing these people together, then and now.

The people who lived on Saddle Road: Len and Daphne Hayers

Len and Daphne Hayers settled on 400 acres in the early 1930s.

Len was a cattle farmer who later grew raspberries.

The couple raised nine children, all boys.

In the 1960s an airstrip was built and used for aerial spraying of fertilizer.

The original homestead was lost in the 1967 bushfires.

Bert and Gwen Flakemore

Bert Flakemore was a real pioneer of Saddle Road.

With the help of his brothers, he cleared most of the land using horses and stump jacks.

Bert also grew small fruits and trapped possums at night to supplement his income.

The Flakemore couple built a house at the eastern end of Saddle Road and established a small poultry farm.

Ned Hughes

Ned Hughes was one of the first residents of Saddle Road to grow small fruits.

Ned played his violin regularly and professed it was one of the original Stradivarius violins of the 17th and 18th centuries.

Gerald and Irene Sward

Gerald and Irene Sward worked on the Bruny Island ferry and also grew small fruits.

Charles and Elsie King

Charles and Elsie King settled on Saddle Road in the early 1940s.

The couple were orchardists and also grew small fruits.

Sadly, their eldest son Robert died in 1957 at 15 years of age as a result of a bicycle accident.

Gradually the couple purchased the neighbouring properties, increasing the size of their orchard.

In the 1950s the Charles and Elsie King built a tennis court, which became home to the Kettering Tennis Club.

The King's three homesteads survived the 1967 fires, likely due to their orchard surrounds.

John and Amy King

John King moved to Kettering in the early 1930s on doctor's advice, for clean air due to lung problems.

The couple ran an orchard on Saddle Road, using horses for carting loads of apples to a spare room in their homestead, where the produce was packed in hand-made wooden boxes.

The boxes of apples were then transported by cart to steamers in the bay.

John and Amy King later built a new home adjacent to the Channel Highway in Kettering, opposite the current community hall.

Derwent Hughes

Derwent Hughes settled on Saddle Road in the late 1920s. He was an orchardist and raised a large family.

Lyall and Betty Brown

Lyall, also known as Inky, worked on the Bruny Island ferry.

Herb and Mavis Woolley

Herb Woolley was a war veteran who ran some cattle on his Saddle Road property.

He later passed the farm on to his son, Bert.

Ron and Margaret Imms

Ron Imms was a returned soldier who owned a large acreage and was also an orchardist.

The farm is still in the hands of his four sons.

Roy Russell

Roy Russell and his wife raised a large family.

Roy was a colourful character and deeply involved in the Kettering football club.

At the time, the club had three teams in the local competition.

Roly and Elaine Proctor

Roly and Elaine Proctor both worked on Roly's father's farm.

In addition to his farm duties, Roly travelled state-wide determining the sex of chickens.

In the 1980s the couple moved to Woodbridge, from where they have run a farm to this day.

Bill and Mick Proctor

Bill and Mick Proctor moved to Saddle Road in the early 1940s.

Bill, also an orchardist, purchased the neighbouring property and expanded the farm.

Bill then established a successful poultry farm with his two sons.

Sydney Jackson

Sydney Jackson was another colourful character residing on Saddle Road, with a large family.

Jim Tame Jnr and wife Daphne

Jimmy Tame Jnr worked as a food van driver for local

shop owner, Mert Hawker.

Jimmy travelled around the district delivering food.

His parent's house, above his on Saddle Road, was destroyed in the 1967 fires.

Myrtle Walker

Myrtle Walker lived on Saddle Road with her father.

Sadly, their home was destroyed in the 1967 fires.


Ray Flakemore

Ray Flakemore moved into his father Bert's house on Saddle Road in the 1980s.

Mert and Bessie Hawker

Mert and Bessie Hawker ran the local grocery shop with the assistance of an excellent employee named Harry Mac.

The grocers proved to be visionary pioneers embarking on a mobile delivery service 70 years ago, travelling to neighbouring districts selling food and vegetables from two vans.

Free cyber risk workshops

The Kingborough and Huon Business Enterprise Centre is partnering with The Project Lab to assist in the delivery of AusIndustry's Cyber Security Business Connect and Protect Program.

The free program will deliver cyber risk management plans for Tasmanian businesses and not for profits to raise workforce awareness.

Scott Dufty from the Kingborough and Huon Business Enterprise Centre spoke about the concern for cyber safety.

"The amount of cyber fraud at present is rife," said Scott.

"I spoke to a local just this week who is caught up in this and we hope to educate businesses to minimise the risk and not lose money from fraud and

- Free cyber consultancy services for businesses to develop cyber risk plans.
- Additional co-funded cyber advisory services (70% funded by AusIndustry and The Project Lab)
- Free on-demand learning delivered through an online platform.
- Other value-adding tools from program partners.

Pedestrian safety campaign

A pedestrian safety campaign has been launched in Kingborough to remind pedestrians and drivers to look out for each other.

Kingborough Deputy Mayor, Jo Westwood said the Road Safety Advisory Council (RSAC) campaign's aim was to improve pedestrian safety and to reduce the number of serious casualties.

"Twenty per cent of serious pedestrian casualties occur at intersections," Cr Westwood said.

"Three quarters of accidents with pedestrians occur in speed zones of 60 km/h and under."

Cr Westwood said the aim of the campaign was to highlight to pedestrians that even though they may have the right of way when crossing the road, they need to watch out for cars regardless.

"The campaign uses the 'green walk signal' as a caricature to convey the message that people are vulnerable on the road when it comes to oncoming vehicles.

"The walk character is well-recognised, which helps with the messaging in the campaign.

"The green safety person will appear around Kingborough as chalk stencils on the footpaths and on traffic signal poles.

"When you are crossing the road, stop and check that the driver of a vehicle has seen you before stepping out."

The campaign is a state-wide campaign with safety messages displayed on traffic signal poles, bus backs and mobile and billboard advertising.







Tigers earn Team of the Year stripes

The 2021 Tasmanian State League (TSL) Team of the Year has been selected with Tigers represented among the state's top footballers.

All seven TSL clubs were asked to nominate players they believed worthy of Team of the Year consideration with a TSL panel then selecting the best 22 of the 2021 season.

The selection panel picked the team and positions as if the team were to play a game.

The TSL Coach of the Year was voted on by the seven TSL coaches, who all submitted their votes to TSL management, with Kingborough coach Trent Baumeler coming out on top.

Luke Graham, Marcus Gardner and Eddie Cole from the Tigers joined their coach after being selected among the state's best.

Player summaries for their Team of the Year selection were written by Simon Andrews, Sam Kenny and Paige Thompson.

FP: Luke Graham (16 games, 28 goals, second time TOTY)

Graham has continued to show why he is one of the most exciting forwards in the league, stepping up in the absence of the injured Tyler Carter to lead the Tigers' forward line throughout the back half of the campaign.

One of the most competitive and creative players in the league, Graham averaged over three tackles and five contested disposals a game, as well as 2.4 marks and 1.6 goals.

Graham kicked 28 goals to rank among the league's best.

Graham is also reliable in clutch moments, as demonstrated by his matchwinning effort against the Roos in round 19.

RU: Marcus Gardner (17 games, 12 goals, first time TOTY)

Gardner has stood out as one of the most improved players in the competition during season 2021, where he has dominated the ruck position for the Tigers, despite often playing a lone hand.

The big man's marking ability is of the utmost value to his side, offering an outlet target down the line, as well as a tall target inside 50.

Marcus averaged over 37 hit outs per game.

RO: Eddie Cole (18 games, 5 goals, first time TOTY)

Cole's decision to return home to the TSL is one that has been very popular with fans of the yellow and black.

Essentially filling the midfield role left by Kieran Lovell, Cole brought serious tenacity and hunger to his duties in 2021.

Cole is in the top five in the competition for contested disposals, clearances and hard-ball-gets whilst also dominating the tackles count with 9.4 a game.

You know what Cole is going to bring to the table any given weekend. One of the recruits of the year.

Selection headaches

Selection headaches were aplenty, with a number of players unlucky to miss the cut.

The competition's midfield depth made on-ball spots difficult to finalise, with Tigers Lachlan Clifford and Will Campbell and Roo Jarrod Harper stiff to miss.

Young Tiger Zach Adams was strongly considered for a wing spot after a consistent season, while teammate Elijah Reardon was unlucky to miss in defence.
