

Veterans' health milestone

Kingston Beach RSL Sub-Branch members held a barbeque lunch on Tuesday, October 19 to mark Veterans' Health Week.

Veterans' Health Week officially ran from October 16 to 24, with events being held around the nation.

The day also coincided with the first public hearing of the Royal Commission into Defence and Veteran Suicide.

The Royal Commission was established in July, following agreement by the Governor-General of Australia, to address the high suicide rates among those who have served in the Australian Defence Forces.

Royal Commission Chair Nick Kaldas said on October 19 the date marks an important milestone for those personally affected by the tragedy of suicide.

"Many within the defence and veteran community have lost loved ones, or have themselves experienced suicidal thoughts, impulses or actions during or after their military service," Commissioner Kaldas said.

"As we embark on this inquiry, we hope to learn from the personal experiences of those who have served and their families to identify systemic issues and risk factors that can lead to suicide."

The Royal Commission's media release stated that during private sessions, defence members, veterans and their families are invited to share their experiences with a Commissioner in a confidential setting.

People will be given the opportunity to raise issues

they see as having contributed to suicide and make suggestions for change.

People with lived experience of suicide are invited to apply for a private session, if that is their preference.

Private sessions will run for the duration of the Royal Commission.

The Royal Commission is also encouraging people to share their experiences by making a submission to assist the Commission to understand:

- Systemic issues among defence and veteran deaths by suicide
- Risk and protective factors, and
- The availability of support services.

The Royal Commission acknowledged that it may be difficult for some to come forward and tell their stories, and support will be available each step of the way.

"Counsellors will be on hand for those who engage with the Royal Commission and our staff will work to ensure these services operate in conjunction with individuals' existing health and family support networks," Commissioner Kaldas said.

The Royal Commission is due to produce an interim report by August 11, 2022 and a final report by June 15, 2023.

Survey questioned

Residents of Dynnyrne have raised questions about the State Government's online public consultation survey on the proposed transit lane for the Southern Outlet.

SOS Hobart 2021 representative Tony Dell criticised the survey in a letter to the editor published on September 21.

"On closely examining the design of the "survey", it is quite obviously designed to give the Government the answer it wants," wrote Tony Dell.

The *Kingborough Chronicle* wrote to Minister for Infrastructure and Transport, Michael Ferguson on September 15, asking a series of questions.

"Who designed the public consultation survey?"

"Does the Minister agree that the proposed removal of homes in Dynnyrne has been a major, controversial issue for the community in relation to the Government's proposed Southern Outlet Transit Lane concept design?"

"Why is it that the survey fails to ask respondents to rate their preference regarding the removal of homes?"

"Where a survey appears to systematically favour one outcome, isn't this considered to be a biased survey?"

"Does the Minister agree that "question wording bias" occurs when survey questions lead survey participants toward a favoured outcome?"

Minister Ferguson's response, received September 15, did not address all questions raised.

"The public consultation survey was developed by the Department of State Growth and is consistent with public feedback processes developed for other significant road projects," replied Minister Ferguson.

"The suite of projects under the Hobart City Deal will significantly improve the travel time reliability for commuters in Kingborough and the Huon.

"They include a new dedicated lane to give priority for more people to travel quicker in buses and cars carrying at least three people, from Olinda Grove right through into Macquarie Street, and the removal of parking and the creation of clearways to create an extra lane on upper Macquarie Street.

"In Budget Estimates last week, the CEO of Infrastructure Tasmania explained that he had assured residents who may be impacted by the Southern Outlet works that information about their private properties would not be put into the public domain for comment.

"Matters of property acquisition have always been and will continue to be between the Government and the actual people concerned.

"The Government continues to refine engineering designs on the transit lane and will work to minimise impacts on private property."

"Police will be taking a strong approach in dealing with those in the minority who continue to flout the rules and put other Tasmanians at risk.



The Convenor of BirdLife Tasmania, Dr Eric Woehler said the brochure provided details on the remarkable endemic bird species found nowhere else on Planet Earth, though easily found on these walks.

"The brochure details habitats, access and the birds likely to be seen on 10 easy walks in the Kingborough municipality, including Bruny Island," Dr Woehler said.

"It is hoped that this brochure is the first of more, where BirdLife Tasmania collaborates with councils elsewhere in Tasmania to produce a series for around the State."

Hobart Horticultural Society team members will be there to stage blooms and answer questions.


Entry is free, however a gold coin donation is appreciated. Light refreshments will be available, and a stall will offer plants for purchase.



Art acquisition award

The Art Farm Birches Bay annual sculpture prize exhibition opened on Saturday, October 23.

The sculpture *Biotic Forms - Resurgence* by local artist Ulrike Hora was announced as the winner of Kingborough Council's acquisition prize.

Ulrike was the winner of the small sculpture award at the Art Farm exhibition in 2020.

Ulrike moved with her family to Kettering in 2019, after being involved in ceramic art in numerous communities since moving to Australia at age 16.

A panel assessed the works on exhibition and selected the winning entry in accordance with Council's Public Art and Art Collection Policy.

Speaking at the opening, Kingborough Councillor Sue Bastone said the judges found this year's decision-making difficult.

"The fantastic array of sculptures in this year's trail

made the decision-making process difficult for the selection panel," said Cr Bastone.

"We were impressed with the quality of Ulrike's ceramic works and the way they interplay with nature, with the shapes of buds, flowers, stems and seeds.

"Ulrike says the work is inspired by the cycles of nature and describes them as "being at once both earthly and alien", and like me I am sure that will resonate when you see them.

"We plan to exhibit the work in a secure public space, such as the Kingborough Community Hub and have lots of ideas brewing as to the form that exhibition might take," said Cr Bastone

"The Art Farm continues to host our acquisition from last year, *Squall* by Ben Beams, which remains installed [on loan] at the Art Farm until it's new location is ready next year as part of our Transform Kingston project."

Taroona traffic lights

The Department of State Growth is looking into installing a pedestrian crossing with traffic lights and upgrades to the city-bound bus stop (Stop 27, No. 145 Channel Highway), opposite Taroona Primary School.

The installations are aimed at addressing safety concerns raised by the community for bus passengers crossing the Channel Highway to access city-bound services.

The traffic lights will also enable more students to use bus services on the Channel Highway, reducing overcrowding concerns on the dedicated buses entering the school grounds.

The city-bound bus stop will be upgraded to be Disability Discrimination Act 1992 (DDA) compliant


making it easier for people with limited mobility or prams to access bus services.

The passenger waiting area will be widened to enable safer access for all passengers using the Metro general access bus services and a new shelter will be constructed.

The final design for the project will be completed later this year with construction expected to commence in the first half of 2022 for a period of approximately 12 weeks.

Lockdown grants

Payments are available for eligible businesses in Kingborough, and other local government areas, directly impacted by the stay-at-home orders applied in Southern Tasmania recently.

The Southern Tasmania Lockdown Business Support Program was announced by Premier of Tasmania, Peter Gutwein on October 20.

"A \$1000 payment will be made to any business (with a minimum \$25,000 turnover) forced to close for the duration of the lockdown," stated Premier Gutwein.

"Businesses that closed partially, who were able to pivot to takeaway or other service delivery, will receive a \$750 payment.

"An additional payment of up to \$10,000 is available for lost perishable goods which had to be discarded as a direct result of the lockdown order.

"There are also Tasmanian and Australian Government payments available to employees who lost income during the lockdown."

What new skills did you learn during the eight-day exercise at Stony Head?

"At AFX I learnt a lot of new skills.

"Some of these skills include how to take six and eight-digit grid references on a map, which we then used in a two-day navigation exercise to find the locations of activities.

"We also learned how to take a grid bearing, then how to convert these into magnetic bearings.

"We learnt how to set up a hootchie and learned how to pick a good camp site.

"While at AFX I also learned a lot about how to be a good leader and the importance of having high moral in a group, and the effects it has on productivity if it drops.

What did you enjoy the most about the eight-day exercise?

"The part I enjoyed the most about AFX was getting to take part in an Army Cadet field camp.

"I learned new skills from the Army Cadets and applied these acquired skills in a practical way to complete activities."

What was the most challenging part about this holiday activity?

"In my opinion, the most challenging part about AFX was time management and getting everything done.

"At AFX I was a section commander which meant that I had to make sure seven other cadets were organized for the activities, eating and drinking enough, make navigation plans during the navigation exercise and try to resolve any issues these cadets had, all whilst making sure I was organized and finding time for these things.

"So, I definitely had a lot to balance, which was hard, but also taught me better time management and people skills, which I will definitely use later in life."

The pair are wives of veterans who served in Vietnam.

"That era (of veterans) don't talk to anyone, not even their wives, about what happened.

Val Cocker's husband Steve served twice in Vietnam. The couple were engaged to be married before Steve was sent on his first tour.

"We were engaged the first time he went," remarked Val. "Three years later he went again, when our first child was only five months old.

"He was wounded on tour."

Val and the baby were based in Brisbane, and her family was living in Tasmania, while Steve was away.

Val said it's hard for people in the general community to understand and recognise a veteran's mental and physical injuries and how it impacts their family.

"Most other people who don't have any military experience don't understand," said Val.

Val acknowledged there are numerous organisations that provide support, should people choose to access the services offered.

Kingston Beach RSL Sub-branch secretary David Taylor said local exercise physiologist Cathy Creese looks after a number of members.

Anne James from the Australian Government Department of Veterans' Affairs was in attendance on the day and said other organisations and charities supporting and participating in Veterans' Health Week activities included Mates4Mates, Buddy Up Australia and Legacy.

Senator Bilyk urges respect for retail staff

Recent data showing increasing levels of verbal abuse, threats and violence experienced by retail workers in Sydney has prompted Labor Senator Catryna Bilyk to urge the public to show respect for Tasmanian retail workers.

Data released by the Shop Distributive and Allied Employees Association (SDA), the union for retail, fast food and warehousing workers, has shown that some Sydney suburbs have experienced up to 80 per cent increases in verbal and physical abuse towards staff as retail businesses face an influx of shoppers.

"When it comes to Covid outbreaks, Tasmania has had several near misses in the past few months," Senator Bilyk said.

"Should we have to go into lockdown, it concerns me

that the pattern of increased abusive and threatening behaviour experienced in Sydney could be replicated here.

"Regardless of how shoppers feel about the public health restrictions applying now, or in the future, there is absolutely no excuse for threats and abuse towards retail workers who are only doing their job.

"Of course we should be polite and courteous to retail workers at all times, not just while we are experiencing a pandemic."

Senator Bilyk expressed support for the SDA's "No one deserves a serve" campaign, which has been running for several years to highlight the impact of abuse on retail workers and to encourage the public to treat them with courtesy and respect.



Bushfires can lead to extended power outages

TasNetworks owns and operates the electricity network in Tasmania.

With over 15,000 kilometres of powerlines and 232,000 power poles spanning across some of our states most rural and remote areas, TasNetworks assets are extremely vulnerable to bushfires, which can often lead to extended power outages.

On days when a Total Fire Ban is declared, or during a bushfire, TasNetworks take extra precautions such as altering processes to ensure power doesn't automatically

Before

As electric water pumps can't be used when power supply is interrupted, prepare a generator, diesel-pow-

ered or petrol-powered pump instead.

During

Exercise caution when using generators. Never use a generator inside, or try to power the house or "backfeed" supply.

Keep up to date with current outages on the TasNetworks website or listen to your local ABC radio station.

After

Keep an eye out for fallen or damaged powerlines. Report them to TasNetworks on 132 004.

If your home or property has been impacted by fire, have it inspected and certified as safe by an electrician and repairs carried out before power is restored.

If you're returning to your home in a bushfire-affected area, ensure your CablePI is plugged in and switched on. An alarm or flashing amber light indicates a problem. If this occurs, call TasNetworks immediately on 132 004. For more information about preparing for bushfire, visit tasnetworks.com.au. Don't switch off around electricity.



"Debris in gutters acts as kindling for embers to start house fires," said Chris and Therese.

"You don't want full gutters when fires are on the horizon. Just because we've had a wet winter, we can't be complacent.

"Leaves become tinder-dry over summer." Bushfire and Natural Hazards, Cooperative Research Centre CEO Dr Richard Thornton is quoted in an ABC






Thank you for your patience as we repair the road surface on Davey Street.

Detoured access into South Hobart

On 18 - 20 and 24 - 28 October, between the hours of 6.30pm and 6.30am, there will be **no direct access from Davey Street into South Hobart** while we lay new road surface at the intersection with the Southern Outlet. **Please allow for an extra 15 minutes travel time.**

The detour

Light vehicles can detour to South Hobart via Lynton Avenue.

Heavy vehicles will be detoured onto the southbound lanes of Southern Outlet, turning at the Olinda Grove interchange to return into South Hobart via the northbound lanes on Southern Outlet. They can then access South Hobart via the left turn lane on to Davey Street, which will remain open.

Emergency services will be escorted through the worksite to access South Hobart.

Ongoing traffic changes

We will be working nights between **6.30pm to 6.30am** from **Sunday to Thursday**. Starting from the week of Monday 25 October, where a shift is lost due to poor weather conditions, work may be rescheduled to include **an optional Friday night**. Night time lane closures and reduced speed limits will be in place. Motorists should allow up to **eight minutes extra travel time** during the roadworks period.

Two lanes of traffic on Davey Street will remain open during nightworks.
