## Christmas food aid appeal

Kingborough Community Missions has launched a special Christmas food aid appeal for disadvantaged families and homeless people in Kingborough.

Kingborough Community Missions' project co-ordinator Peter Harvey met with Kingston Neighbourhood House manager David Morse on Wednesday, December 1 to present one of the special food hampers prepared for disadvantaged families and the homeless.

Kingborough Community Missions' distribution outlets include Jireh House Women's Shelter, Kingston, Westwinds Community Centre, Woodbridge, Community Care Program Thursday at Kingborough Family Church (vegetables), The Salvation Army Supported Housing Centre for Homeless People, The Salvation Army Huon Valley, Ronald McDonald

House and FoodBank.

The food hampers contain around \$80 to \$100 worth of groceries. Kingborough Community Missions' volunteers also deliver tonnes of fresh vegetables to Food Bank, Kingston Neighbourhood House and other outlets. Kingborough Community Missions' have requested assistance from the community this Christmas.

## Water restrictions announced

Kingston and surrounding suburbs that fall within the boundary of Greater Hobart are to be placed on Stage 1 water restrictions from December 14.

TasWater announced the water restrictions for Greater Hobart on Tuesday, November 30 in an effort to maintain water supply over the summer holiday period.

Other suburbs subject to restrictions include Taroona, Blackmans Bay, Howden, Snug and Margate.

A map can be found on the TasWater website.

Stage 1 restrictions aim to reduce non-essential water use by 20 per cent by encouraging more conscious use of water at home, outside, and at work.

Manual watering systems can only be used between the hours of 6am and 8am and between the hours of 8pm and 10pm.

Automatic watering systems can only be used between the hours of midnight and 4am.

Handheld hoses with a trigger nozzle, buckets or watering cans may be used at any time.

## Motorists who horse around horses

Dear Editor,  
It is with much frustration that I find myself having to write to you again about the issue of how to safely pass a horse rider on our roads.

I can't tell you how many times my horse and I have nearly been hit by ignorant and inconsiderate drivers who seem to think that they are the only ones with a right to be on the road.

They're not.  
Our roads are legally shared by motor vehicles, pushbikes, dog walkers, joggers, families out walking and horse riders, and each and every one of them has the right to use the road safely and return from their outing without being traumatised, injured or killed.

Here are some facts about horses and horse riders on roads.

1. We are legally entitled to ride on the roads.
2. Drivers are legally required to slow down and/or stop if signalled to by the horse rider (when passing) and move to the other side of the road when it is safe to do so. If it's not safe then stop and allow the horse to pass you.

Don't move to the wrong side of the road on a blind corner. It happens all the time.

And don't assume that because the rider hasn't signalled you to slow down that it's ok to roar past them at whatever speed you happen to be going.

The excuse that you were doing the speed limit isn't going to help you if you're dead.

3. It takes 15 to 20 seconds to slow down to around 20 to 30 kilometres per hour and pass a horse safely. Not too much to ask, surely?
4. Horses are flight animals, meaning if they perceive a danger or get a fright, they can react at high speed, running or jumping.

Horses don't stop to think about a car that may be thundering towards them.

Their entire focus is on the thing that's scared them and getting away from it as quickly as possible.

That means they might jump out in front of a car.

5. Because of their long legs, the end result of a car hitting a horse is that half-a-tonne of horse smashes through the car's windscreen with devastating results for the horse, the rider and the occupants of the car.

So, if you think horses shouldn't be on the road, that's irrelevant.

If you think that you shouldn't have to slow down,

that's irrelevant.

If you don't care about the safety of the horse and rider, that's irrelevant.

Surely care about your own safety, and the safety of your family who might be in the car with you?

Is your life worth slowing down for 15 to 20 seconds?

Are your family's lives worth slowing down for 15 to 20 seconds?

I hope so, for all our sakes.

# Input on CBD makeover

Kingston's CBD is having a much-needed makeover next year.

Community consultation on the upgrade has commenced, with Kingborough Council currently seeking feedback on design elements for the Channel Hwy.

In a media release on December 2, Mayor Paula Wriedt said local feedback on the Kingston Place Strategy, adopted by Council in May 2020, highlighted the desire for an attractive, engaging and greener area.

"Council's initial focus has been how we can incorporate as many of the strategy's recommendations during the design process," Cr Wriedt said.

"One of the challenges however is the width of the street, particularly the lack of space to accommodate street trees, wider footpaths, on-street dining, bike lanes and carparking.

"It is not possible to include all of these elements and so we are keen to get community feedback on the most important priorities for the upgrade.

"Residents will be able to have their say in a number of ways.

"These include a community survey, business workshops and engagement stalls in Kingston during Summer."

The survey is open until Wednesday, January 19, 2022.



As part of efforts to protect our unique native wildlife, Kingborough Council have declared Alcona, Coffee Creek and Huntingfield Reserves to be Cat Prohibited Areas.

The declarations, which took effect on November 30, mean cats can now be trapped by Council if found within these areas.

In a media release on November 26, Kingborough Mayor Paula Wriedt said the Council Reserves provide important wildlife habitat for threatened species, such as the eastern quoll, eastern-barred bandicoot and forty-spotted pardalote.

"These Reserves all lie adjacent to Peter Murrell Reserve which is managed by Tasmania Parks and Wildlife Services and is prohibited to cats.

"Monitoring for the last ten years within Peter Murrell Reserve has consistently found cats throughout, and especially close to areas of dense housing."

A stray cat is a pet cat that has been lost or wandered from its home.

"Owning a cat though, comes with a serious responsibility as well as consequences in Kingborough," Cr Wriedt noted.

"Across the Kingborough Municipality at least 627,100 native animals are killed each year from domestic cats alone.

"There have been a number of cases reported across Australia, of a single pet cat wiping out a native species in a local area."

# Learning skills for the real world

## Kingston Primary School students have put their learning into practice with a barbecue fundraiser.

As part of their focus on money and persuasive texts, a grade 3/4 class held a fundraising barbecue on Monday, November 29. Teacher Samantha Dobson said the students were excited to be doing a 'real world' task and commenced by working together to create a persuasive speech. "It started with a persuasive letter to the principal to convince her that this was a great idea" explained class member Yi. "I think it was a really fun idea, it helped us with our learning and it taught us what it would be like when we

are grown-ups," said classmate William. Class member Isabella concurred and said it was "an amazing idea, to feel what it might be like to work in a store". Ms Dobson said the students then went around to each classroom in small groups to communicate the details of the fundraiser to their peers, meanwhile incorporating public speaking experience. "Some students were especially nervous about speaking in front of the other classes," noted Ms Dobson. "Challenging themselves in this way proved what they were capable of."

Students also petitioned local businesses for assistance, creating another persuasive letter and were appreciative of a bread donation from Banjos in Kingston. On the day barbecue, the grade 3/4 class and parent helpers completed all the preparations, cooking and food service. "There was a great buzz around the school in anticipation," said Ms Dobson. "It was wonderful seeing students take on different roles and demonstrate maturity and responsibility with tasks. "Best of all, we managed to raise just over \$800 for the school association."

Acting assistant principal Mrs Hughes said the class had demonstrated "an outstanding ability to combine their inquiry learning from the classroom with a real-life fundraising opportunity" of benefit to the school and community. Ms Dobson said the students asked when they could do it all again and were probably unaware of just how much valuable learning took place. "I am really proud of all the students and hope they can draw on this experience when they are feeling nervous, when they are using money, or when they are thinking about how their in-class learning translates to the real world."

## Davey Street Rehabilitation Work

Thank you for your patience as we repair the road surface on Davey Street.

### Detoured access into South Hobart

From Sunday, 5 December until Friday, 10 December, between the hours of 6.30pm and 6.30am, there will be **occasional detours for traffic from Davey Street into South Hobart** while we lay new road surface at the intersection with the Southern Outlet. Please refer to local signage and allow for an extra 15 minutes travel time.

### The detour

Light vehicles can detour to South Hobart via Lynton Avenue.

Heavy vehicles will be detoured onto the southbound lanes of Southern Outlet, turning at the Olinda Grove interchange to return into South Hobart via the northbound lanes on Southern Outlet. They can then access South Hobart via the left turn lane on to Davey Street, which will remain open.

Emergency services will be escorted through the worksite to access South Hobart.

### Ongoing traffic changes
