

Local council leading on climate policy

Kingborough Council is leading the way on climate change policy with a unanimous vote committing Council to sequentially reducing its carbon footprint and targeting net zero emissions for its activities by 2035 or earlier.

The historic vote took place at a meeting on Monday, December 6 with Council passing an amendment to set a net-zero emissions target by 2035, instead of 2050 as originally proposed.

The ambitious amendment was proposed by Councillor Gideon Cordover. The original proposed policy included a slower target, sequentially reducing Council's carbon footprint and targeting Net Zero Emissions for Council activities by 2050 or earlier.

Councillor Cordover said the unanimous agreement by Councillors to adopt the amendment reflected calls from the community.

"The Kingborough community has been demanding stronger climate action from all levels of government," said Cr Cordover.

"In a climate and biodiversity emergency, when our Federal Government has dropped the ball on climate, it falls upon all of us in local government to do what we can to slow climate breakdown and implement plans to protect nature and foster more resilient communities.

"The original motion set a target for net-zero emissions for Council activities by 2050.

"I proposed an amendment for a more ambitious target which was accepted by the mover, Cr Amanda Midgley, and seconder, Cr David Grace.

"I hope that this enhanced target will see a range of positive climate solutions resourced and implemented such as reducing waste to landfill, switching the Council fleet to electric vehicles, and more solar across the municipality."

Mayor Kingborough, Paula Wriedt said she was pleased with the unanimous vote.

"I am really pleased that the Council unanimously voted to approve the Kingborough Climate Change Policy which includes a commitment to a target of net-zero emissions for Council activities by 2035 or earlier," said Mayor Wriedt.

Councillor Flora Fox said Kingborough Council has always been a climate change leader.

"Kingborough established the first Climate Hub in Australia and motivated the Whitsunday Council to now become the National Climate Hub," noted Cr Fox.

"Kingborough has built solar panels on the council chambers in 2001 and is currently installing them on the sports centre roof.

"Council has been a leader with environmental adaptation, biodiversity protection, off-set legislation, tree planting and environmentally responsible waste disposal.

"Kingborough is trialling an electric fleet car, with the aim to convert the Council's entire car fleet to electric.

"The next 10 years will be critical, and I am proud of the unanimous vote by Councillors to support the updated climate change policy, setting a net-zero emissions target by 2035."

Vaccinations for children

Appointments will be available from January 10, 2022 for children aged 5 to 11 years old to receive the COVID-19 vaccine.

The Tasmanian Government announced that appointments can be booked for children at special children's clinics, after the Therapeutic Goods Administration's provisionally approved the Pfizer vaccine in Australia for children aged 5 to 11.

Children are required to be accompanied by a parent or guardian who will be asked to provide written consent for the vaccination.

The choice to vaccinate children is voluntary, with children receiving a paediatric dose of the vaccine that is one-third of the size approved for people aged 12 and over.

Cards now available for check-in
A Check in Tas Card is now available when checking

in to businesses or premises, for the purposes of providing contact tracing information.

The free card is for people aged 16 years or over, to assist people who aren't able, or choose not, to use a smartphone.

However, the card does not allow proof of vaccination to be recorded.

Methods for providing proof of vaccination are outlined on the Services Australia website.

The card was announced by Tasmania's Minister for Health, Jeremy Rockliff, on December 6.

"We know that COVID-19 will soon reach our shores," said Minister Rockliff.

"Check in TAS is a tool that will support our contact tracking by identifying people that may have been exposed to a positive case of COVID-19.

Applications can be made on behalf of an individual if they are unable to do so.

Jab needed for stand-up drinking
Patrons at Tasmanian venues where there is stand-up

drinking are now required to be fully vaccinated to enter.

The new Public Health Direction came into force on December 6 and applies to pubs, clubs and events or areas of these locations where alcohol is served and patrons are not exclusively seated.

The requirement does not apply to restaurants, cafes, clubs or licensed venues where patrons are required to be seated.

It does not apply to guests at weddings and funerals, sports or community clubs, cinemas or stadiums.

From this Wednesday, the requirement will extend to staff at locations where there is stand-up drinking.

The responsibility is on individuals to ensure they do not enter an event or premises unless fully vaccinated.

Licence holders, venue managers and event organisers are required to display signage identifying the premises is subject to the vaccinated entry requirement.

There is no obligation for business owners or event organisers to monitor or enforce compliance, but they can choose to check vaccination status and refuse entry as part of their own workplace risk management.

Police may enforce compliance, request evidence of vaccination and fine individuals for breaches.

Consultation on Kingston bypass

Public input is invited on options for the proposed Kingston Bypass duplication, which includes upgrading the Algona Road roundabout.

The Tasmanian Government project relates to a 3.5-kilometre section of the Kingston Bypass from Algona Road to the Groningen Road overpass, including connections with Summerleas Road and the

Huon Highway.

The proposal includes duplicating the Kingston Bypass to provide two traffic lanes in each direction and upgrading the Algona Road interchange to be fully grade separated and to remove the current roundabout.

The group of students had their hair shaved to help support Maddy who was diagnosed with leukaemia for

the second time in three years.

At eight-years-old Maddy was first diagnosed with leukaemia, finishing treatment two-and-a-half-years later in October 2020.

In October this year, Maddy's mother Sarah was informed Maddy had relapsed.

Maddy and Sarah are currently at the Royal Children's Hospital in Melbourne, where Maddy is receiving treatment.

Staff from Cyber Hair donated their time to help shave the student's hair.

In a post from the St Aloysius Facebook page the school said "the College community could not be prouder of the support you have shown for your friend Maddy."

Donations have now closed for the Brave Shave with a total of \$24,212 raised.

Jenny Leitch, mother of St Aloysius participant Campbell, noted the bravery shown on the day by the students having their hair shaved in front of their peers and said the experience was spiritually uplifting.

"It really was a wonderful event, with so much

community spirit and a lovely vibe," said Jenny Leitch.

"Most of the students turned up to watch/get involved in the proceedings during their lunch break.

"There was a lot of cheering for the boys as they stepped up for their turn under the clippers, then again as they ended their go.

"It was so uplifting."

Our unique conservation partnership succeeds

The achievements of a unique program between the Tasmanian Land Conservancy (TLC) and Kingborough Council were celebrated at the site of the program's first conservation covenant on Monday, December 6.

The partnership has protected over 240 hectares of native bushland in Kingborough since the program was established in 2004.

The Kingborough Environmental Fund (KEF) supports the preservation of biodiversity and threatened species within the municipality using financial payments, known as "offsets".

The payments are from local developments that result in the loss of native vegetation.

The program sees the financial contributions reinvested into local revegetation, research and weed control and the protection of land through conservation covenants.

The fund has received over one million dollars to date. Council is interested in hearing from landowners who have areas of good quality native vegetation on their properties, and who would like to see it protected for future generations. Applications for the conservation covenants are submitted

to the Department of Primary Industries, Parks, Water and Environment (DPIPWE) on behalf of the landholders.

Mayor of Kingborough, Cr Paula Wriedt attended the celebration, held at the Oyster Cove property that received the first conservation covenant under the program.

"The KEF collects financial offsets for the loss of high conservation value vegetation and trees in Kingborough," Cr Wriedt said.

"The offsets are required for those developments which result in the removal of high conservation value vegetation

where an offset reserve can't be achieved on-site.

"Most offsets are for the loss of habitat for threatened species, such as the swift parrot and forty spotted pardalote, or for the loss of threatened vegetation communities.

"The fund also provides the opportunity for protection of land through covenants, like this property here at Oyster Cove."

"It's a completely unique scheme to our municipality and helps Council balance development in Kingborough with the conservation of important and threatened biodiversity."

North West Bay River catchment plan launched

A plan with a vision to preserve the natural values of the unique North West Bay River catchment has been launched at a picnic in Longley.

Mayor of Kingborough, Cr Paula Wriedt opened the picnic and launched the *North West Bay River Catchment Action Plan 2021 – 2031* under a blue sky on Sunday, December 5.

The community picnic, organised by the Friends of Longley-Area Group (FLAG), and attracted around 200 members of the public.

The North West Bay River catchment contains the largest river system in the municipality of Kingborough.

Areas covered include properties in Longley, Lower Longley, Sandfly, Neika, Leslie Vale, Allens Rivulet, Kaoota and Margate.

The catchment's natural features, significant vegetation and plant species make it unique.

The river is 25 kilometres long, extending from the southern end of kunanyi / Mt Wellington to the northern part of North West Bay, with the river catchment covering an area of around 9600 hectares of land.

Around half the North West Bay River catchment remains in its natural condition.

The *North West Bay River Catchment Action Plan 2021 – 2031* is a working document that outlines the values contained within the catchment, describes the ongoing threats and the specific actions to be taken to improve the health of the catchment's values.

The natural values include 13 threatened plant species, 11 threatened fauna species and five threatened vegetation communities.

Threats include clearing of habitat associated with population growth, increasing weeds, erosion, sedimentation and increases in extreme weather events associated with climate change.

FLAG committee member Mike Brough thanked everyone involved making the picnic event a success.

"Yesterday's Picnic in the Paddock was a great success," said Mike Brough.

"Kids had great fun on the jumping castle and sharing time with Crazy Daisy, which included face painting and learning circus tricks.

"Al Dermer led a great conversation around traditional burning, weed management and other issues of interest and concern to local residents.

"Many interesting discussions also took place with stallholders around landcare, fire-preparedness and more.

"Talented musician Hamish Holen provided great music throughout the day, supported by Phil Wise who provided PA services.

"The coffee van and barbeque were well-patronised and gifts of vanilla slice and other goodies donated by the Bush Bakery vanished quickly," noted Mr Brough.

"FLAG would like to extend thanks to many others who contributed to what was an outstanding success, including Scott Fairbrother and the team from Sandfly

fire brigade, Michelle Allen, Liz Quinn and Rene Rainchert from Kingborough Council, Jason Andrew Smith from Patula Nayri Traditional Fire Workshops, alongside so many others.

Kerbside Collections and Waste Management Facilities:

The normal scheduled kerbside collections will remain in place over the Christmas period.

The Baretta and Bruny Island Waste Management Facilities will be closed on Christmas Day only.

FOGO was introduced in October, transforming green waste bins into food and organics bins. This transition has the potential to reduce Kingborough's waste to landfill by approximately 50 per cent. Diverting this waste from landfill helps mitigate climate change and reduce toxic methane gas which is harmful to the environment.

Kingston Beach Access has been improved for all with a new DDA compliant beach ramp, level pedestrian crossing, and two new disability parking spaces. The area has been designed to improve access to the beach, shops, parking and toilet facilities for users of all abilities.



Cat Prohibited Areas have been declared at Alguna, Coffee Creek and Huntingfield Reserves. The new areas apply to cats owned in these areas and will further protect Kingborough's wildlife.

The new Cat Shack was opened on Bruny Island in March. The facility provides a shop front for residents to bring in any stray cats to be assessed.

Detoured access into South Hobart

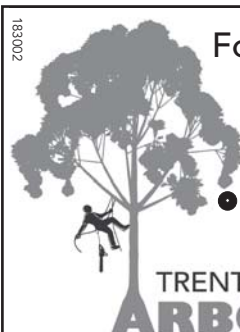
