Long COVID, long silence

The Tasmanian government's failure to acknowledge and prevent the post-viral disease known as "long COVID" has been described as "highly negligent" by epidemiologist and Member for Franklin, Dr Rosalie Woodruff, as Tasmania recorded more than 6000 active cases of COVID-19.

Dr Woodruff said the post-viral disease can have disabling complications, and the government's failure to acknowledge and try to prevent this "potentially serious outcome" for Tasmanians is highly negligent.

"International evidence, and from Tasmania's North West outbreak, shows a significant number of people will suffer 'long COVID', stated Dr Woodruff on Friday, January 14.

"With only a month since Premier Peter Gutwein kicked off his government's "let it rip" strategy, the serious consequences are stacking up.

"COVID has circulated rapidly in the community, sickening Tasmanians, creating extreme stress for many, buckling the health system, impacting on the supply of essential goods, forcing businesses and iconic events to close.

"We have not yet seen a high level of critical COVID hospitalisations since the borders reopened, but experience from interstate and overseas tells us this is ahead of us.

"The narrative that COVID is 'just like the common cold' or 'just mild' for everyone is not true.

"After two years of collective effort, now is not the time to give up on protecting people.

"Long COVID is a post-viral disease that can have disabling complications, and the government's failure to acknowledge and try to prevent this potentially serious outcome is highly negligent.

"There's no doubt our state and its people will be living with the effects of this government-induced outbreak for a very long time.

"The health system has already been placed under immense pressure.

"Outpatient appointments and elective surgeries have been cancelled, meaning waiting lists are likely to balloon further out of control, forcing more Tasmanians to wait in pain for the treatment they need.

"There is also incredible strain on health workers right now, forcing some to reconsider their career.

"Losing any staff from an already stretched system would have a terrible effect.

"More than ever, we need a Premier with compassion and recognition of the real anxiety, suffering and stress so many Tasmanians are experiencing.

"Every action should be to put the health and safety of our community first," Dr Woodruff said.

The *Kingborough Chronicle* also wrote to the Premier of Tasmania, Peter Gutwein MP, and Minister for Health Jeremy Rockliff MP on January 6 regarding the health impacts and risks associated with Long COVID.

"Has Premier Gutwein and Minister Rockliff MP mentioned health impacts and risks associated with Long COVID in any media statements?"

"What advice has the Premier Gutwein and Minister Rockliff MP received regarding Long COVID health impacts and risks for Tasmanians?"

"Can Premier Gutwein and Minister Rockliff MP please advise the residents of Kingborough regarding Long COVID health impacts and risks?"

To date none of the above questions have been answered.



How many devils need to die?

Dear Editor,
I would like to bring your attention to healthy Tasmanian devils that continue to be killed on roads around Woolnorth, Tasmania's final frontier of facial tumour disease free devils. Over the past year, 80 plus healthy devils have met their demise on Woolnorth Road in Tasmania's north west. Healthy devils continue to be run over at a rate of two per week, yet nothing is being done about it. I'm surprised and saddened at the negligible response by the Circular Head Council, the Save the Tasmanian devil program, the Department of State Growth (Roads) and the Threatened Species unit of the Department of Natural Resources and the Environment, considering that Woolnorth devils have been disease free for so long and represent the only disease-free devils left in the wild in Tasmania.

It seems ludicrous that nothing is being done to mitigate the roadkill. Apparently, there are kilometres of "virtual fences" ready to deploy, but these have been ready to deploy by the Department of State Growth (Roads) for a whole year.

Why aren't other roadkill mitigation measures being urgently deployed such as better signage, road strips, underpasses, overpasses, speed humps, and meetings with locals and truck drivers to advise about roadkill hotspots?

Why do people care so little about this iconic, endangered species, and how many healthy devils need to die before somebody actually does something about it?

Upper house by-election

A by-election is expected to be held on Saturday, May 7 to fill a vacancy in the Tasmanian Legislative Council, following the resignation of Dr Bastian Seidel, representing the electoral division of Huon.

The division of Huon covers Howden, Margate, Snug, Bruny Island, Cygnet, Franklin, Geeveston and Huonville. A popular local GP, Dr Seidel was elected to the upper house of Tasmania's Parliament in 2020, for a term of six years.

Dr Seidel has held the roles of Labor Shadow Minister for Health, Mental Health and Wellbeing and Shadow Minister for Parks and the Environment.

Dr Seidel left Tasmanian Parliament on its last sitting day, on December 3, 2021, after offering his resignation from the Labor caucus and shadow ministerial portfolios to the State Opposition leader Rebecca White in August 2021.

According to the Tasmanian Electoral Commission (TEC), the by-election is expected to be held in parallel with the 2022 periodic elections.

"Following the resignation of Bastian Seidel on Friday,

January 7, a by-election is to be held to fill the vacancy in the Legislative Council division of Huon," stated the TEC on January 10.

"Section 66 of the *Electoral Act 2004* allows that a by-election triggered between January 1 and the day the writs are issued for the periodic Legislative Council elections, be conducted concurrently with those elections.

"It is therefore expected that polling day for the divisions of Elwick, Huon and McIntyre will be Saturday, May 7."

The TEC said COVID-safety measures will be in place at polling places to comply with Public Health advice at time of polling.

"In return, CCYP Ambassadors have lots of opportunities to convey their views to decision makers, often having impact on policy and legislation."

Applications are open to Tasmanians aged 10 to 17 and will close on 18 February, 2022.

Making unusual waves

The Australian Bureau of Meteorology issued a marine tsunami warning for areas of the east coast of Australia and parts of Tasmania, including the D'Entrecasteaux Channel and Derwent Estuary, on Saturday, January 15, after an underwater volcano near Tonga erupted at 3:10pm, generating a tsunami.

Although the marine threat tsunami warning was cancelled for Tasmania at 12pm on Sunday, January 16, the Bureau of Meteorology said some unusual sea level changes from the tsunami may persist for many hours along the coastline.

The Senior Meteorologist Sarah Scully at the Bureau of Meteorology said a 0.48m wave was recorded at Southport Jetty.

At the time of the warning on Saturday evening, Tasmania Police stated that affected areas included the South East Coast, D'Entrecasteaux Channel and Derwent Estuary, where tidal surges were expected.

The Bureau of Meteorology noted that evacuations are not necessary for marine warning zones, rather people in these areas are advised to leave the water and move away from the immediate water's edge.

Changes to RAT testing processes

Tasmania introduced a change to its coronavirus Rapid Antigen Test (RAT) process on January 15, as the State recorded 1139 new COVID-19 cases, with 22 people in hospital and one person in ICU.

"There are 22 people who have COVID-19 in hospital, 10 who are being treated primarily for COVID symptoms," noted Premier Gutwein.

"People are now receiving Rapid Antigen Tests (RATs)

through our contactless next-day delivery service of free RAT kits to people who live in regional and rural areas of the State and have symptoms or are a close contact.

"This service is also available for people who are unable to travel to a collection centre and are unable to have another person collect a RAT on their behalf.

"Anyone wanting to access a RAT through the delivery service or at a collection centre needs to register online

on the coronavirus.tas.gov.au website.

"Vaccination continues to be our strongest defence.

"Another 47,000 vaccination doses were delivered in Tasmania in the week to the 13th of January, which includes more than 42,000 boosters.

"This incredible effort by Tasmanians beats our previous record vaccination week by 7,200 doses.

"The 13th of January was the biggest vaccination day on record with 9,075 doses administered."

Salvation Army to aid COVID support

Minister for Community Services and Development, Jeremy Rockliff said in a media statement on January 14 that community organisations are assisting the Tasmanian government with access to, and delivery of, COVID-Care packages to eligible recipients.

The COVID Care Package provides assistance to eligible vulnerable Tasmanians and community service organisations.

Individuals requiring assistance to access or receive delivery of either:

- groceries and essential items, including for babies and children; or
- medicines and pharmaceuticals;
- and who (or a family member) are either:
- symptomatic and awaiting a COVID-19 test result;
- are a confirmed COVID-19 case;
- caring for someone who is a confirmed COVID-19 case; or
- in quarantine because they are a close contact, may be eligible for the COVID Care Package.

"The Salvation Army and local community partners will assist with access and delivery of items for eligible recipients," Minister Rockliff said.

"Today, we have announced that we are bolstering our COVID-Care package, which provides important social support to Tasmania's vulnerable communities.

"The Tasmanian Government acknowledges the need for additional support for Tasmanians as we transition to living with COVID, and our updated COVID-care package will ensure the continuity of services for our vital community sector organisations.

"Our COVID-Care package supports Tasmanians by ensuring they can access everyday basics of food, medicines, or housing if they have been directed to isolate because they are symptomatic and awaiting a test, are COVID positive, are caring for someone who is COVID positive, or have been advised to isolate as a close contact.

"We want to ensure that Tasmanians are connected to the help they need which is why we're providing the Salvation Army and its many local community partners with further funding to ensure this vital seven-day-a-week service can continue supporting those who need it.

"Affected individuals or families can access these additional supports by contacting the Public Health Hotline on 1800 671 738, and COVID-Care will be provided on request to those who need it through a flexible, individualised response.

"Additionally, we are providing a new pool of ready-to-access funding which will secure day-to-day services for essential community sectors workers and volunteers,

including the purchase of RATs, masks and PPE.

"This funding will be distributed by TasCOSS.

"We also know that the national shortage of RATs is impacting our community organisations and their dedicated workers," noted Minister Rockliff.

"To ensure that our community care sector can continue to provide support for our most vulnerable, organisations will now be able to contact Worksafe Tasmania to receive an initial allocation of RATs for essential workers.

For people with disability, we have moved to make N95 masks available on request through community service providers, as well as their workers or carers, and for those who are immunocompromised.

"Tasmanians with disability are also continuing to be prioritised in our state-based vaccination clinics, alongside Commonwealth-operated vaccine hubs and group home in-reach services, which are being progressed.

"Further, disability service providers and their workers will have access to a dedicated contact point to access a range of advice and support, alongside a new information streaming service that will be established to ensure local services are provided with the latest advice

and guidance.

"Finally, we are providing additional funding to further boost community awareness of the suite of mental health supports which are currently available, and where to go to get help if they need it.

"These new supports come on top of existing individual funding for those who have lost work as a result of COVID-19, through testing positive or isolating, which are available through Services Australia or the re-shaped Tasmanian Government's Pandemic Isolation Assistance Grant.

"We recognise that not everyone has support networks to assist them while isolating which is why it's so important that Tasmanians continue to help each other, as they always have.

"Importantly, if you know a family member, neighbour or friend who is isolating, ask them if they'd like any assistance."

Questions about individual circumstances will be asked in order to check eligibility.



Kingborough's award-winning volunteers for 2022

Kingborough Council recognised some of the municipalities most dedicated volunteers at this year's Kingborough Award ceremony, on Saturday, January 8.

The Council have provided the following details on the sword recipients in the following categories.

Citizen of the Year – Jude Lennox

Jude Lennox has been a wildlife rehabilitator for over 35 years.

Jude is on call 24-hours a day, seven-days-a-week, as nocturnal wildlife are more likely to be injured at night than at more convenient times of the day.

Jude assesses the animals' health and provides reassurance to the human rescuer.

She also feeds and cares for injured wildlife around the clock.

Jude was a driving force in establishing a wildlife rescue at a time when many people didn't believe it was possible.

Today the service sees over 14,000 animals per year across Tasmania.

Young Citizen of the Year winner – Sam Lohrey

Samuel Lohrey began volunteering in 2011.

As a young man he volunteered at the Kingborough Gymnastics Centre with the Gymsports team.

During this time Sam completed the three-year Youth Leadership Program and attained his Gymnastics Australia coaching accreditation before going on to become a paid coach.

Sam has also been a patrolling member of the Kingston Beach Surf Life Saving Club for 10 years and a patrol captain for the past four years.

Additionally, Sam is a first responder with the Kingston Beach Surf Life Saving Club's Emergency Response Team, where he is available to respond 24/7 to police call outs.

This ever-readiness has been a six-year commitment to date.

Sam is also a qualified Inflatable Rescue Boat trainer and assessor, and a trainer of community surf life-saving programs.

Sam has also represented Tasmania for four years in underwater hockey and was an Australian representative for two years.

Certificate of Appreciation – Sajini Sumar

Sajini Sumar is a founding member and the current chairperson of the Multicultural Women's Council of Tasmania, as well as a member of the Premiers Women's Advisory Council.

Sajini has been part of International Women's Day celebrations for the past 17 years.

Sajini represents Kingston as part of Hobart's Networking for Harmony group, of which she was a founding member.

Sajini is also a member of the Aboriginal Reconciliation Committee.

Currently Sajini is a member of TasCollab, the TasCOSS Community Voice Partnership Program.

Sajini was board member for 15 years on the Tasmania

Committee of the International Wall of Friendship.

Sajini has held national representation on:

- National Ethnic Disability Alliance as a member and treasurer for 5 years.
- Federation of Ethnic Communities Council of Australia holding the position of National Disability Chairperson.
- Department of Home Affairs community engagement in Tasmania and Victoria, ongoing.

Community Group Award winner - Parkrun

Parkrun is a collection of five-kilometre events for walkers and runners.

Kingston Parkrun started in September 2019, with almost 300 people arriving for the very first run.

Since that first event, even after it was shut down in 2020 due to COVID-19, there have been 11,658 finishes, with 150 people, on average, completing the course every Saturday.



Preparation packs for pets and livestock

One of the main reasons people refuse to leave their homes in an emergency is because they don't know what to do with their pets and livestock, according to Kingborough Council.

Such delays can cost people their lives.

A pet emergency kit package is available on Council's website, including a useful template to record details for each pet in a household.

Mayor of Kingborough, Cr Paula Wriedt said it's best to plan ahead for what to do with pets and livestock in a fire situation, before an emergency happens.

"Knowing where you can house your pets and livestock before disaster strikes was an important part of being bushfire ready," Cr Wriedt said.

"You might be able to house your animals at either a friend's or relative's house or a boarding kennel.

"If your pets can't stay with relatives or friends and you have no alternative than to go to an evacuation centre, having your pet's needs organised beforehand can reduce stress and ensure you can evacuate quickly.

"If an evacuation centre can cater for domestic animals, these animals are generally accommodated within the grounds of the centre or in a facility adjacent to it.

"Preparing in advance your pet emergency kit will help you if the time comes to leave.

"There are some basic items you should always include in your pet emergency kit and some specific items unique to your pet's needs that should be added."

Bushfires can lead to extended power outages

TasNetworks owns and operates the electricity network in Tasmania.

With over 15,000 kilometres of powerlines and 232,000 power poles spanning across some of the State's most rural and remote areas, TasNetworks assets are extremely vulnerable to bushfires, often leading to extended power outages.

On days when a Total Fire Ban is declared, or during a bushfire, TasNetworks alter processes to ensure power doesn't automatically restore when a fault is detected.

Without power, you may not be able to operate cordless phones (including NBN), automatic doors, water pumps and other electrical devices, so it is important to be prepared.

Before

Prepare a home emergency kit with items such as spare batteries and a charged power bank to ensure radios, phones and torches can be used.

As electric water pumps can't be used if power supply is interrupted, prepare a generator, diesel-powered or petrol-powered pump instead.

During

Exercise caution when using generators. Never use a generator inside or try to power the house or "backfeed" supply. Keep up to date with current outages on the TasNetworks website or listen to your local ABC radio station.

After

Keep an eye out for fallen or damaged powerlines. Report them to TasNetworks on 132 004. If your home or property has been impacted by fire, your home will need to be inspected and certified as safe by an electrician, and repairs carried out, before power can be restored.

When returning to your home in a bushfire-affected area, ensure your CablePI is plugged in and switched on. An alarm or flashing amber light indicates a problem. Roof guttering professionally cleaned by Gutter-Vac

"Debris in gutters acts as kindling for embers to start house fires," said Chris and Therese.

"You don't want full gutters when fires are on the horizon. Just because we've had a wet winter, we can't be complacent. Leaves become tinder-dry over summer."

Bushfire and Natural Hazards, Cooperative Research Centre CEO Dr Richard Thornton is quoted in an ABC news article advising that "any day in an environment where it is dry, where you have high winds, warmer temperatures, low humidity, will be a day that a fire can start that could potentially impact on communities".

Fire authorities recommend gutters are cleaned regularly to help protect properties and reduce the spread of fire.

"Residents who live in high-risk areas are urged to put together a fire plan and take practical steps around the home," said Chris and Therese.

"Scarily, 90 per cent of homes in a bushfire are lost due to an ember attack, whereby spot fires are ignited by twigs, leaves or bark embers carried by the wind.

"These embers can land in a home's guttering and ignite the property.

"Vacuum cleaning your gutters prior to bushfire season will ensure that this flammable fuel is removed and your property is safer.

"It is a busy time for gutter cleaning, so book early and get the job done."



Three further club games were played on Thursday, with a large spectator field staying to watch the action.


New Year Triples Tournament
