RATs coming to Kingborough

The Tasmanian Government has not communicated with Kingborough Council regarding the availability of Rapid Antigen Tests (RATs) for people in Kingborough, according to Mayor, Cr Paula Wriedt.

At a Kingborough Council meeting on Monday, January 17, Cr Clare Glade-Wright asked a question on notice regarding the availability of RAT tests in the municipality.

"I've had a few community members contact me about the availability of the RAT tests," stated Cr Glade-Wright.

"When I was contacted last, the closest place to get hold of them was in Glenorchy.

"Is there something that we can do to try and get RAT tests available here in Kingborough," asked Cr Glade-Wright.

Kingborough Mayor, Cr Paula Wriedt replied that the State Government has not communicated the local Council regarding the availability of Rapid Antigen Tests (RATs) for people in Kingborough.

Tasmania's Department of Health has since advised that from Saturday 22 January, eligible people living in rural and remote areas, including the Huon Valley who require a rapid antigen test (RAT) kit will be able to receive their kit via Australia Post.

"The online RAT request form will be updated on Friday, January 21 to

provide an option for people living in certain local government areas (LGAs) to receive their RAT kit through contactless delivery," advised the Department of Health on January 20.

According to the Department of Health, RAT kits will continue to be available from collection sites for eligible people living in Kingborough.

"When collecting a RAT kit, people are reminded to wear a face mask, remain in their car, and have their confirmation SMS ready to show staff.

"RAT kits are available for free for anyone who is symptomatic, a close contact of a confirmed case or has been directed by Public Health to take one.

"Contactless delivery will also be available to all eligible Tasmanians who are unable to collect their RAT kit from a collection point, or do not have someone who can collect it on their behalf, due to their personal circumstances including people with a disability.

"Anyone who has difficulty filling in the online request form can call the Public Health Hotline on 1800 671 738 for assistance.

"Anyone who returns a positive RAT test result are required to notify Public Health via the online declaration form.

"This ensures they are recorded as a confirmed case and can access the care and support needed and financial assistance if eligible."

New rules for schools

The Tasmanian Government is proposing to reopen schools on February 9, prior to the State's 5 to 11 year old children receiving their second COVID vaccination.

In a media release on Thursday, January 20, Premier of Tasmania, Peter Gutwein MP outlined the government's plan and claimed the return of children to school was "supported by public health advice that it is safe to go back to school".

However, the person (or persons) proving the advice were not identified.

"The plan includes a number of measures to ensure COVID-safety in our schools, in line with public health advice," claimed Premier Gutwein.

"These measures will initially be in place for the first five weeks of Term 1, with any initial adjustments to be made towards the end of this period."

Meanwhile Virologist and Director of Melbourne's Burnet Institute, Professor Brendan Crab expressed concern last week regarding returning children to school too early.

"Oz is in disaster mode", stated Professor Crab.

"Disease, death and social and economic disruption sky high.

"I support doing our utmost best to get kids back to school but it's important to be flexible around the start date when there's so much to be gained by being well prepared before commencing."

There were 39 people with COVID in hospital in Tasmania on Sunday, January 23, three in ICU, with two requiring ventilation.

Of the 39 people with COVID in hospital, 16 were undergoing treatment specifically for COVID.

Tasmania recorded 625 new cases of COVID-19 in the 24 hours to 8pm on Saturday, January 22, with 5650 active cases across the State.

"Just over 32 per cent of Tasmanians have now had their booster shot, and it's vitally important we continue to push this number up as high as possible to ensure people are fully protected from serious illness or death from COVID-19," noted Minister for Health, Jeremy Rockliff.

"And while vaccinations for children are not mandatory, it is strongly encouraged, and just over 33 per cent of 5 to 11-year-olds have now received their first dose.

There are bookings available for every child between 5 to 11 years old to receive their first dose before school returns."

Small businesses impacted by COVID

Small businesses in Kingborough are being asked to have a completed risk assessment in place, among other requirements, in order to be eligible for the Tasmanian Government COVID-19 business impact support funding of between \$1000 and \$5000.

The funding is in response to the downturn many small businesses have seen since mid-December when the State border was re-opened by the Tasmanian Government.

Small businesses must be able to demonstrate a minimum of 30 per cent reduction in turnover, when comparing the period from December 15, 2021 to 14 January 14, 2022, with the same period in the previous year.

The *Kingborough Chronicle* wrote to the Premier of Tasmania and Minister for Health on January 20 regarding whether the State Government completed a risk assessment prior to opening the Tasmanian border.

"Can the Premier and the Minister for Health provide a copy of the risk assessment for the decision to open the State border on December 15, 2021?"

"Was a risk assessment done by the Tasmanian Government prior to opening the State's border on December 15, 2021?"

"By which agency?"

"Can the Minister for Small Business explain why a completed risk assessment is required by small businesses to be eligible for funding of between \$1000 and \$5000?"

Answers to these questions will be published in the next edition of the *Kingborough Chronicle*.

Premier Peter Gutwein and Minister for Small Business, Jane Howlett introduced the COVID-19 Business Impact Support Program on January 14.

"This program has been established to provide support to Tasmanian businesses whose business operations have been impacted since our borders reopened on 15 December, 2021, either because of a loss of staff due to COVID-19 quarantine and isolation requirements, or a significant COVID-19 related downturn in business turnover," stated the media release from Premier Gutwein and Minister Howlett.

"Funding of between \$1000 and \$5000 will be available to eligible businesses, depending on business size.

"Additional support will also be available to businesses that have experienced an unavoidable loss of perishable goods.

To be eligible, businesses must be able to demonstrate a minimum of 30 per cent reduction in turnover when comparing the period from December 15, 2021 to 14 January 14, 2022, with the same period in the previous year.

Businesses must also demonstrate they have:

- a COVID-19 Safety Plan,
- a completed risk assessment in place and,
- where required, a COVID-19 Case and Outbreak Management Plan.

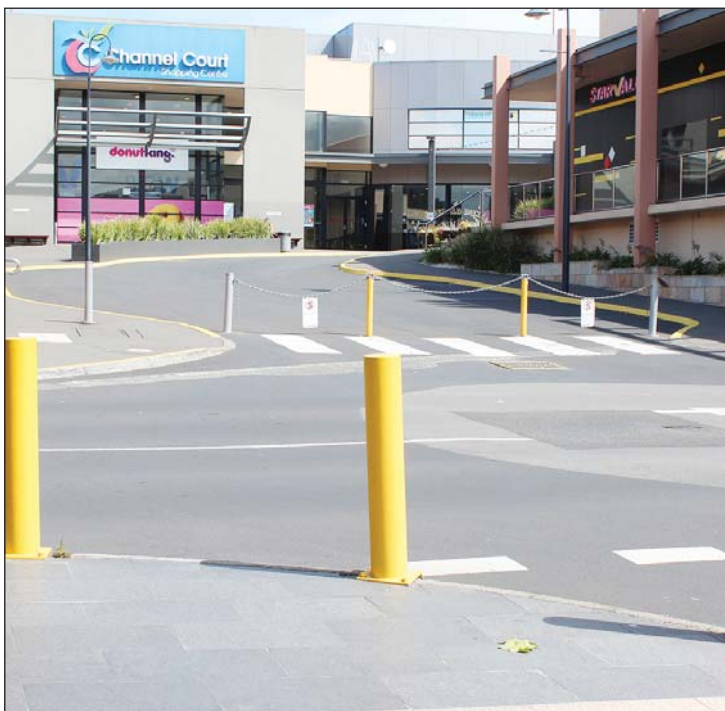

The heavy impact of COVID on small businesses around Kingston in recent weeks has been starkly visible by the absence of the usual foot traffic in shopping precincts during opening hours.

Consultation opens on development near threatened bird habitat at Huntingfield

Public consultation has begun for stages 2 and 3 of the Tasmanian Government's controversial residential development in the vicinity of threatened species habitat in Huntingfield.

The Department of Communities Tasmania said the land to be developed is adjacent to the Peter Murrell Reserve, where threatened/endangered species including the forty-spotted pardalote, *Pardalotus quadragintus*, are located.

The comment period opened on January 19 and closes on February 17.

The existence of threatened species is a Matter of National Environmental Significance under the Commonwealth

Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999 (EPBC Act).

Therefore, public comment has been invited due to the requirements under Commonwealth environmental law.

Stage one of the development received planning approval by the Kingborough Council in October 2021.

According to the Department of Communities Tasmania the completed development will consist of mixed-residential development, totalling 470 lots.

Of the 67 hectares available, 33 hectares will be set aside for public recreation, green space and the protection of natural and cultural values in the area.

Crisis home provided by local bank

People in crisis due to family violence will soon have a safe and secure home in Kingborough, thanks to the Huon Valley Bendigo Bank Community Bank branches and Jireh House.

The bank's owners recently approved the purchase of a three-bedroom home in the Kingborough municipality.

Community Bank Huon Valley's community liaison officer, Samantha Paul said the bank's owners, Huon Valley Financial Services Limited (HVFS), had been investing in the needs of the local region for over 18 years.

HVFS intend to provide the home in partnership with Jireh House.

"After a number of consultations and a lengthy search (exacerbated by a heated real estate market), the HVFS Board recently approved the purchase of a three-bedroom home in the Kingborough Municipality," noted Ms Paul.

"Recent community advice provided by the Huon Valley Domestic Violence Service (HVDVS), identified that up to 60 per cent of victims of domestic or family violence do not report to police.

"In addition, 10 per cent of the families presenting to domestic violence crisis accommodation providers in southern Tasmania in the last 18 months have been from the Huon Valley.

"HVFS Chair, Michael Lynch noted that "many families are turned away, there is a distinct lack of suitable crisis and transitional accommodation available".

"The HVFS Board approached Jireh House, a women's shelter in Kingston to discuss crisis housing options."

Ms Paul said the funding has been generated due to the efforts of the bank's "dedicated staff and the ongoing support of many customers and shareholders".

"Profits generated from the four branches in Geeveston, Dover, Huonville and Cygnet are directed by a volunteer Board to many worthy causes," explained Ms Paul.

"HVFS will provide all initial household goods and grant annual service operating costs of approximately \$15,000 to Jireh House.

"This is to ensure appropriate supports are in place for tenants of the home."

New express bus services for Kingborough commuters

Kingborough Council has welcomed an announcement by the State Government of additional 43 express bus services between Kingborough and Hobart.

The following additional express bus services into the Hobart CBD are due to commence on January 30:

- 14 new Blackmans Bay X07 express services;
- 10 new Snug X13 express services; and
- 19 more X08 express services between Kingston Central and the Hobart CBD outside of peak travel times.

In a media release on January 20, Mayor Paula Wriedt said continued advocacy had paid dividends.

"The addition of an extra 43 express bus services between Kingborough and Hobart is most welcome," said Mayor Wriedt.

"As everyone in Kingborough knows, we are going through an extraordinary period of growth.

"While there are many positives about growth, one of the downsides has been the increase in traffic congestion, particularly at peak times.

"Kingborough Council has been a strong advocate for the municipality on congestion issues, approaching it in a multi-pronged way.

"We successfully advocated for changes to the

Huntingfield Roundabout design and for investment in the Algonia Road intersection and bypass.

"Through our strong readiness to engage in the City Deal we have secured investment in park and ride facilities at Huntingfield and Firthside as well as in our Transform Kingston Project, which focuses on increasing the number of people who work, eat and play in Kingston, reducing traffic flow through to Hobart.

"As a Council we have invested heavily in our active transport infrastructure with an extensive network of tracks and trails, and we have just completed engagement on a bicycle strategy."

In a media release on January 18, Minister for Infrastructure and Transport, Michael Ferguson MP said the additional bus services will be operated by Metro Tasmania and will run weekdays during the morning and afternoon peak periods.

"The new routes are part of the *Hobart City Deal Southern Projects* initiative and will service the Blackmans Bay, Kingston and Channel areas," stated Minister Ferguson.

"The Southern Projects initiative is an end-to-end solution to improve public transport and traffic flow along Hobart's southern corridor.

"To coincide with the new express service, we've also taken the opportunity to adjust other southern bus services timetables, and departure locations from Hobart to improve service reliability.

"Passengers are encouraged to visit the Transport website for more information about these changes."

Regional news inquiry and survey

A new online survey is seeking views on how Australian's living in regional, rural or remote areas access news.

The survey is as part of a federal parliamentary inquiry into Australia's regional newspapers.

Chair of the House of Representatives Standing Committee on Communications and the Arts, Dr Anne Webster MP said news outlets in rural, regional and remote communities have closed their doors over the past

decade, resulting in a "substantial reduction" of articles covering local issues.

"It is important that we listen to our communities about what's important to them," said Dr Webster.

"I encourage anyone who lives in Australia's regional, rural or remote areas to participate in the online survey."

The Kingborough Art Prize, run by Lions Club of Kingborough, has been cancelled for 2022, due to the increase in COVID-19 infections and restrictions.

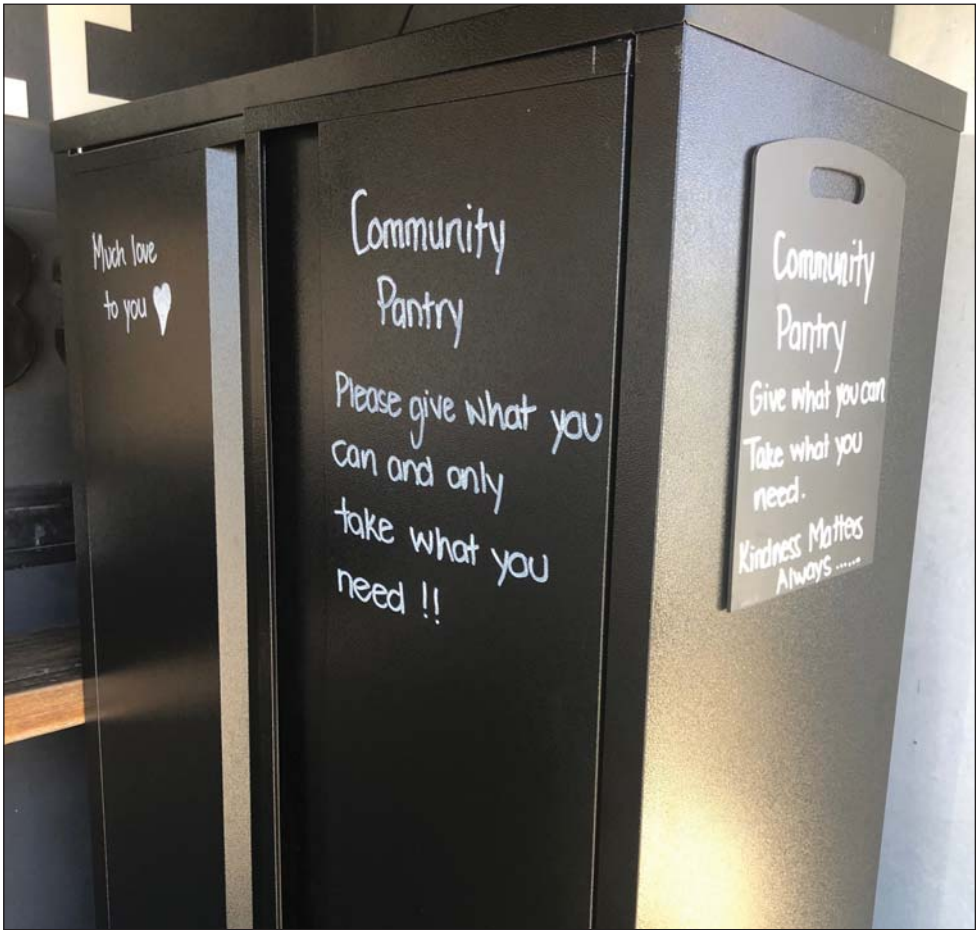
The display of local art runs annually in February, with an exhibition competition and sale.

New rules for Kingborough's domestic cats

Changes are coming for Kingborough's cat owners via the State's *Cat Management Act 2009*, with new rules commencing on Tuesday, March 1.

The amendments bring tighter rules for cat owners across Tasmania.

Mayor of Kingborough, Paula Wriedt said domestic cats will need to be microchipped and desexed and there will be a limit on the number of cats living at one location.

"All cat owners will be required to have their cats microchipped and desexed, in addition to not owning more than four cats," Cr Paula Wriedt said.

"There are significant benefits to these changes in regulations, not only for our environment but also for the cats, their owners and our neighbourhoods.

"A Blackmans Bay resident recently reported to Council staff, that after her cats were desexed they stopped roaming and became much more friendly and sociable.

"Besides increasing a cat's life expectancy, desexing a cat reduces undesirable behaviours such as spraying, fighting, roaming and yowling," said Cr Wriedt.

"Importantly, compulsory microchipping of cats will help reunite owners with any lost pets.

"Thanks to having an up-to-date microchip, a much-loved cat of 16 years was recently reunited with her owners after being missing for a month.

"After being checked for a microchip, her owners were

easily found," reported Cr Wriedt.

"Currently there are no restrictions on the number of cats that can be kept at a property.

"New changes will restrict the number of cats at a property to four without a permit.

"This is similar to the *Dog Control Act 2000*, where a person that has more than two dogs must apply for a kennel licence.

"A limit on cat numbers at a property will help reduce the impact of cats on native animals in surrounding bushland and reserves and also protect the welfare of pet cats."

Kingborough Council summarised other rules under the *Cat Management Act 2009* as follows:

- Only registered breeders can breed cats.
- Cats can only be sold or given away if desexed, microchipped, wormed, vaccinated and over eight weeks of age.
- Cats are not to be abandoned; this includes feeding stray cats without taking full responsibility for their care (including having them microchipped, desexed, wormed and vaccinated).

Council said the Tasmanian Government is developing a permit system for circumstances where owners may house more than four cats at one property.

Close contact re-defined

The definition of 'close contact', as it applies to children and young people in educational settings, has been changed by the State Government.

"Students in schools, early learning centres and child care settings will not be defined as close contacts unless there are five or more cases in a single classroom within a seven-day period," stated Premier Gutwein.

"If a positive case is detected, schools will notify parents and carers that a case has been detected in the classroom, and to monitor for symptoms.

"All students should be at school unless they are unwell or have symptoms of COVID, or have medical advice that they shouldn't attend.

"Students with a disability, or who are medically vulnerable, will continue to be supported on an individual basis, in line with each student's medical action plan.

"Schools will reach out to parents or carers prior to school returning to discuss their child's individual plan prior to the return to school.

"While vaccinations for children are not mandatory, it is strongly encouraged, and there are bookings available for every child between 5-11 years old to receive their first dose before school returns."

The Tasmanian Government's plan for school children

- Masks are only required to be worn indoors by students in secondary schools, with all schools to have a supply of masks if the student does not have their own.

- Masks are not required for primary school students or for children in early learning or child care settings. However, primary school students can choose to wear a mask and schools will have a supply to provide if required.

- Parents are to receive a *Back-to-School COVID Care Package*, with two Rapid Antigen Tests, per child, for use if a student becomes symptomatic and requires a test.

- Schools are to be provided with a further two tests, per student, per week (to take home if symptomatic).

- Virtual learning is to be made available for students required to isolate.

The Tasmanian Government's plan for educators and schools

- Access to 1.6 million masks and 1.5 million Rapid

Antigen Tests, with supplies to be replaced as required.

- Each school will be provided Rapid Antigen Tests and masks for teachers, required to be worn indoors. This will also apply to Early Learning and Child Care Centre staff.

- Windows are being adjusted for improved ventilation, and 4500 air purifiers will be supplied to classrooms and learning areas where required before the start of the school year.

- Additional school cleaning will be undertaken, in line with public health advice.

- Outdoor learning spaces are to be used where practical, and breaks are to be staggered where required to reduce the density of children in play areas.

"Should a parent be required to isolate or quarantine with their children, financial assistance is available," stated Premier Gutwein.

"You can receive up to \$750 from Services Australia or the State Government pandemic isolation grant of \$750."

Clouds over COVID school plan

Premier Peter Gutwein's COVID plan for Tasmania's schools is a plan to keep schools open, not keep teachers and student's safe, according to epidemiologist and Member for Franklin, Dr Rosalie Woodruff MP.

"The school start plan doesn't address low vaccination rates, COVID case management, mask wearing, ventilation, or workforce availability," Dr Woodruff MP wrote on Friday, January 21.

"It denies the science of Omicron transmission, and sows seeds of confusion for parents."

In a media release on Sunday, January 23, Labor Shadow Education Minister Josh Willie MLC said "serious questions remain" regarding the State Government's plan to reopen schools and the reasons behind the planning were unclear.

"Serious questions remain about the government's plan to reopen schools with contact tracing and close contact guidelines deserving further explanation," stated the media release issued by Josh Willie MLC.

"It is vital the government explains the measures they are putting in place clearly and the reasons behind them."

"With hundreds of schools and over 90,000 students across Tasmania, will Public Health have the

resources to stay on top of contact tracing or will it be left to our already stretched education workforce?

"There will be families across Tasmania taking a cautious approach to back to school and some may choose to remove their kids from their learning environment if they are notified of a case at their child's school.

"Working parents may not have the opportunity to do this and will be forced to keep their child at school until they potentially become a close contact."

Meanwhile the Centres for Disease Control and Prevention states on its website:

"Anyone ages 2 years or older who is not vaccinated or not up to date on vaccines should wear masks in indoor public spaces.

"This recommendation also applies to people who are up to date on their vaccines when they are in an area of substantial or high transmission.

"CDC also currently recommends universal indoor masking for all teachers, staff, students, and visitors to K-12 schools, regardless of their vaccination status or the area's transmission rates.

"The benefits of mask-wearing are well-established."

How may the situation change as the COVID wave progresses?

President of the Australian College for Emergency Medicine, Dr Clare Skinner said on ABC 7.30 on Wednesday, January 19 that more people who were elderly or had chronic disease were presenting at NSW hospitals as the COVID wave progressed.

"A few weeks ago in Sydney, we were seeing high numbers of people present to emergency departments with mild symptoms," noted Dr Skinner.

"They tended to be in their 20's and 30's."

"So, they were catching COVID because they're quite socially mobile.

"They're also the group that are least likely to have a regular GP.

"They came to ED because there were no other ways to seek support at that stage.

"Unfortunately, now as the wave progresses through Sydney, we're tending to see people who are more clinically-vulnerable presenting with COVID.

"So, people who are elderly, or who have chronic and complex disease.

"And unfortunately, they're more prone to severe COVID, and their more prone to deterioration and

needing hospitalisation and possibly intensive care.

Dr Skinner said it's too early to tell if the situation has reached a peak in NSW.

"It has felt that Sydney has been in a pseudo lockdown," commented Dr Skinner.

"So as people increase their socialisation, we're probably likely to see an upward tick (on the COVID case-numbers graph).

"People who tend to deteriorate with COVID don't do that on day one or two, they tend to do that down the track."

COVID in NSW in the 24 hours up to 8pm on January 22 there were 20,324 new positive cases.

At the time there were 238,645 active cases in NSW, of which 2712 were admitted to hospital, 189 in intensive care and 72 requiring ventilation.

NSW Health defines active COVID-19 cases as people who have tested positive for COVID-19, are in isolation and are being clinically monitored.

Cases are considered active for 14 days after their symptom onset date.

Cases who have been hospitalised are considered active until they are discharged.

Meanwhile on January 20, Unions Tasmania Secretary Jessica Munday said the Australian Nursing and Midwifery Federation's Tasmanian branch is lodging a safe staffing grievance in Tasmania's industrial commission.

"Nurses are exhausted and running on empty, they're in full PPE and can't take breaks.

"They deserve better than the situation the Government forced on them."

On January 19, Aged and Community Services Australia (ASCA) called on the Australian Prime Minister to deploy the Australian Defence Force to provide emergency support to nursing homes.

"Aged care providers and unions have united to call on the Prime Minister to deploy the Australian Defence Force to provide emergency support to nursing homes across the country and the federal government to fund additional direct payments for staff.

"This is an emergency situation.

"Aged care needs more Omicron support from National Cabinet.

"The escalating crisis in aged care has left services around the country reeling, putting care for older Australians at risk due to chronic staff shortages."

Checking-in still part of the plan

Correspondence recently sent to Tasmanian businesses that have signed up to the State Government's Check-in TAS App has reiterated the importance of continuing to use the check-in tool.

"It is still important that customers check into your business using Check-in TAS each time they visit, no matter how long their visit may be," noted the Business Tasmania service team.

"Public Health are continuing to use the Check in TAS data to advise customers who may have checked into events or venues where there was significant

transmission.

"There may be other instances when Public Health will use the data to support contact tracing if there is a risk of significant exposure.

"For customers, they can track their individual Check-in TAS history should they need to identify their own close contacts if they become COVID-positive.

"Check-in TAS is just one of the many COVID-safe behaviours that individuals can continue to do to ensure they keep themselves and the community safe."

The Business Tasmania team also reminded businesses that Check-in TAS cards are also available to customers who do not have a smartphone or are unable to use the Check-in TAS App.

"The card features a unique QR code that customers can show to businesses, who then scan customers in using the Business Profile on their business device," wrote the Business Tasmania team.

"Please note that when the Check-in TAS card is mailed out, the included 'Welcome' letter outlines the use of the card and emphasises that not all locations will have staff available with a device to scan the QR code for check in.

"It is not expected that businesses add further staff, or purchase a device, for this purpose.

"Where there is no-one to assist with scanning of a card, alternative check-in methods including someone else in group checking in with their phone or using pen and paper can be used.

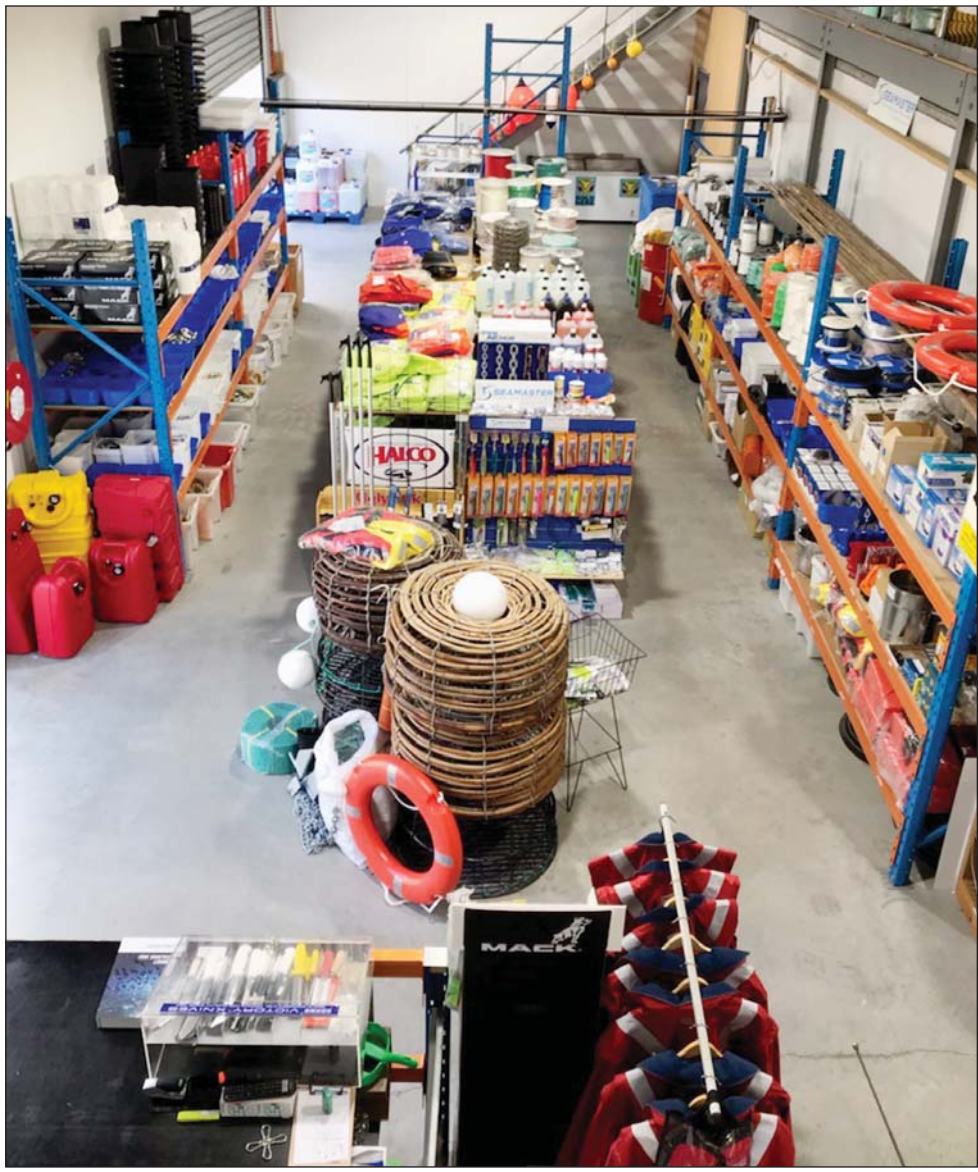

Paddle safely in summer

Hundreds of kayaks, canoes and stand-up paddle boards are bought each year by Tasmanians, so popular is paddling.

Marine and Safety Tasmania (MAST) is focused on Tasmanians enjoying all aspects of life on the water, safely.

MAST wants everyone to come home safely, every time. The popularity of kayaking has seen more people paddling, further offshore.

Sadly, a recent coronial investigation outlined what can happen when things go wrong.

Coroner Simon Cooper said a man who died in Frederick Henry Bay during October 2020 had attempted a journey well beyond his capabilities and experience, noting this was another example of a completely avoidable tragedy.

The coroner said the kayak used was wholly unsuited to the trip; it did not have a leash to ensure it stayed in contact with the deceased man, nor could he retain control of his paddle, which was also inadequate.

The man who lost his life was also inadequately clad. The coroner recommended all recreational paddlers have regard to the easy-to-follow Paddle Safe guidelines published on the MAST website and distributed at major Tasmanian retailers.

Paddle safe tips:

- Prepare your craft.
- **Ability.** Don't push your capabilities
- **Don't** paddle alone.
- **Don't** cross paths and be aware of other vessels.
- Lifejackets, wear the right type.
- **Experience.** Consider this when purchasing a craft.
- **Stick** close to the shore.
- **At** night, paddle with a light.
- Forecast and environment.
- Enter the water safely.

- Tides and times. Know the tide times and tell others when you will be back
- **Yourselves.** Are you ready?

MAST also have a guide on the correct safety equipment to carry in Smooth, Sheltered or Coastal Waters.

A life jacket is required to be worn at all times on any paddle craft.

A tether must be used, to connect you to the paddle craft, if venturing more than 200 metres offshore.

A light, with 360-degree visibility, must be carried if paddling at night in any waters.

And in Coastal Waters, paddlers must carry an EPIRB or PLB, plus a compass and flares, as well as VHF Handheld Radio.

In a kayak, a canoe or on a stand-up paddle board:

- Always wear a life jacket.
- Tell someone where you are going and when you expect to return.
- Never venture too far offshore, as weather changes can be quick and severe.
- If setting out paddling with the wind or tide, remember these may be against you on the way back.
- Spend time close to shore to get used to your craft.
- Try to paddle in company.
- Check your craft for leaks or cracks prior to each trip.
- Seek local knowledge if paddling in new and unknown waters.
- Use a tether, it may save your life.
- Carry the required safety equipment.
- Check the latest weather forecast through BOM on MetEye or download Deckee.

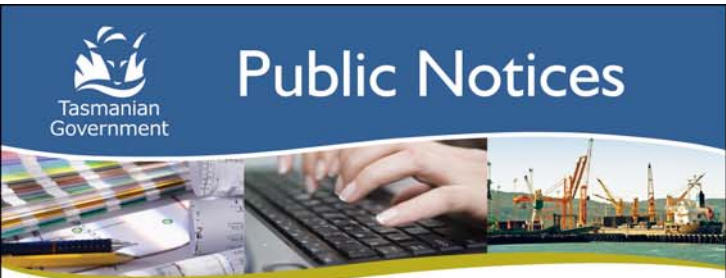

The following notice is published pursuant to section 95A(3) of the EPBC Act. The Director of Housing is seeking approval to undertake stages 2 and 3 of the Huntingfield Master Plan, Channel Highway, Huntingfield, Tasmania (EPBC 2020/8869).

The proposed action is stages 2 and 3 of the master plan for the Huntingfield subdivision. The total development will deliver around 470 residential lots including 250 lots in stages 2 and 3. The Huntingfield development will also include some lower cost, smaller blocks of land for affordable home ownership and the retention of at least 15 per cent of the lots for social housing.

The land lies east of the Channel Highway, between Huntingfield and the North West Bay Golf Club and includes 34 hectares of Open Space Zone and 34 hectares of General Residential Zone, Inner Residential Zone and a strategic pocket of the Local Business Zone. The land is adjacent the Peter Murrell Reserve in which some threatened/endangered species are located.

The proposed action is a controlled action under the EPBC Act. The controlling provisions are listed threatened species and communities (section 18 and 18A), and include potential impacts to the endangered Forty-Spotted Pardalote (Pardalotus quadragintus). Assessment is by Preliminary Documentation.

There will be some temporary, nightly disruptions to bus stops. Please follow your service provider's alerts and look for any local signage.

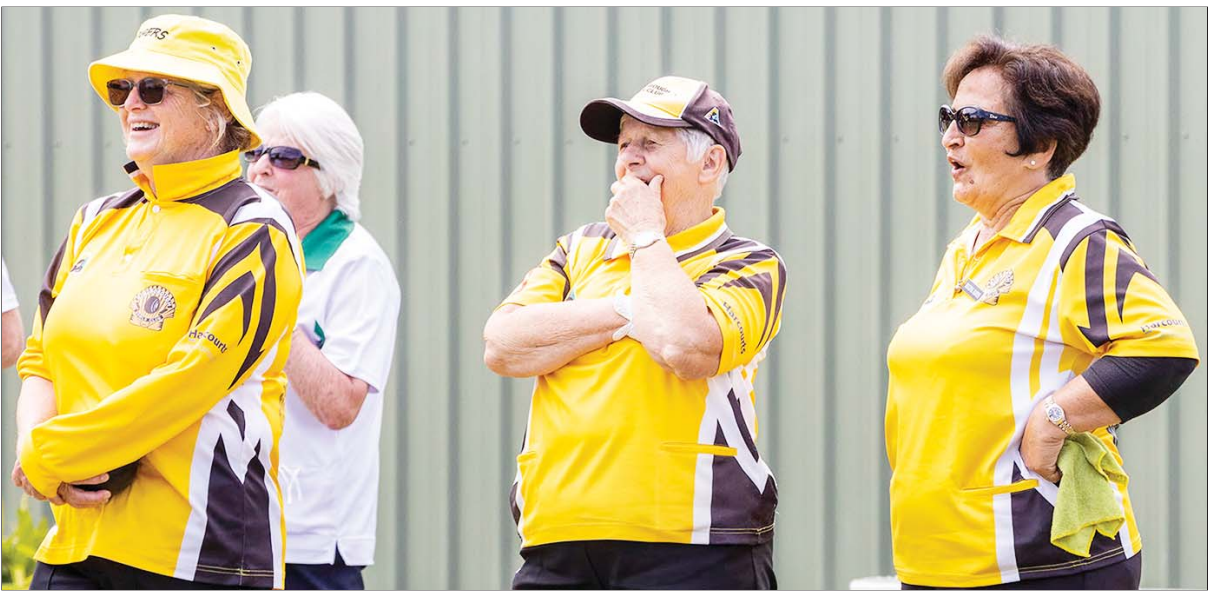

Vaccination mandated for bowlers

A COVID-19 eligibility to play protocol has been produced by the Bowls Tasmania South (BTS) board of management, after the board resolved to endorse the recommendation of Bowls Tasmania to make it mandatory that players be fully vaccinated (double vaccinated), by February 1, to be eligible for events under the control of BTS, including Bowls Tasmania's Statewide Challenge series.

From February 1, players 12-years-of-age and over must show proof of vaccination to be eligible for selection in pennant sides participating in BTS competitions.

Players who have a medical exemption from COVID-19 vaccination must provide evidence of this to be eligible to participate in events for which BTS is the controlling body.

After suspension of the Bowls Tasmania South Pennant Competition for a week due to COVID-19 concerns, southern bowls club members were keen to recommence play on Wednesday, January 19.

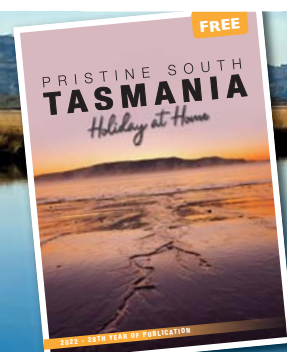
