Risks hidden as schools reopen

Independent Member for Nelson Meg Webb has called for the release of Public Health Rapid Antigen Test (RAT) advice in relation to the Tasmanian Government's approach to the reopening of schools before public school students return on Wednesday, February 9.

In a media release on February 6, Ms Webb identified a number of apparent disparities between Tasmania's RAT regime for students and staff compared to interstate.

Negative test not required in Tasmania

"A negative test is not required by either Tasmanian students or teachers before they re-enter school gates on Wednesday," noted Ms Webb.

"Tasmanian parents, students, teachers, and other school support staff deserve to know what advice the state government is relying upon and what degree of acceptable risk has been determined on their behalf."

Comparing jurisdictions

"NSW strongly recommended students return a negative RAT test prior returning to school at the resumption of their school Term 1," Ms Webb continued.

"Additionally, other interstate jurisdictions, NSW, Victoria and the ACT, also strongly recommend students continue to take a RAT twice a week in the morning before attending school for at least the next four weeks.

"In contrast, Tasmania is providing each student with two RATs a week, but is recommending these are only used should symptoms develop.

"Also, regular testing is not occurring through the school week."

Call to release Public Health advice

"We know the Omicron COVID variant is more transmissible than the Delta strain," noted Ms Webb.

"Surely it makes more sense to catch potential student and teaching staff COVID cases before they enter the classroom, rather than wait for symptoms to arise?"

"South Australia has reported that at least 300 school staff were absent on their first school day this Term due to COVID, so it stands to reason our school communities may experience a similar situation."

Ms Webb provided the following excerpts of Education Department advice from various jurisdictions.

• Tasmania's approach to the first five weeks of Term 1:

"Each student will be provided with an initial supply of two rapid antigen tests (RATs) before school starts, then with two RATs per week for each student to use if they have symptoms.

"All school staff will be provided with two RATs to use if they have symptoms."

• NSW Education advice:

"Rapid antigen tests will be provided to all students and staff by their schools.

"Before the start of Term 1, it is highly recommended all students undertake a RAT and confirm a negative result before attending school.

"For the first four weeks of Term 1, we recommend students take a RAT twice a week on mornings before attending school."

• Victorian Education advice:

"For the first four weeks of term, twice-a-week testing on school days will be strongly recommended for mainstream primary and secondary staff and students.

"Testing each school day for five days will be strongly recommended for specialist school students and staff.

"This is to provide a higher level of surveillance for students with disabilities because of the greater risk associated with COVID-19 for some students with disabilities."

• ACT Education advice:

"While testing is voluntary, it is strongly recommended that students and staff do a test twice-weekly at home before school.

"This will help us ensure we are identifying cases as early as possible, including anyone who is asymptomatic."

Calling for more police

The state opposition has called for more Tasmania Police resources to tackle rising crime in Kingborough.

In a media release on February 2, Member for Franklin, Dean Winter MP said statistics reveal rising crime in the municipality.

Mr Winter said the latest statistics from Tasmania Police show that the Kingston police division, covering Kingborough and the Huon Valley, recorded an increase of 69.6 per cent in total offences for the year to date, the highest in the state.

"The figures from the latest Tasmania Police monthly performance report show that serious crimes in the Kingston division for the year to date jumped by 250 per cent as the number of incidents went up from four to 14," noted Mr Winter.

"All offences against property went up by 95.1 per cent, again leading all divisions across the state.

"Home burglaries went from six to 15 for the year to date, while business burglaries surged from one to 14 and vehicle burglaries from nine to 31."

Mr Winter said a stabbing in broad daylight in a Kingston shopping centre in late December highlighted the need to boost policing in the fast-growing region.

Mr Winter commented that violent incidents in public places are "very rare", but they are a "real concern".

"Earlier in December 2021, two youths armed with a machete and a hammer were arrested at another Kingston shopping centre in an incident where two members of the public were injured," noted Mr Winter.

"In 2019, a man died after being stabbed at a Blackmans Bay service station and a youth was charged."

On February 6, the *Kingborough Chronicle* asked the
Premier of Tasmania and Minister for Health why the
preventative strategies with respect to COVID testing in
other states, as outline by Ms Webb, were not mirrored
in Tasmania.

The *Kingborough Chronicle* also asked the following questions.
"Will the rapid antigen testing advice received from
Public Health be released before public school students
return on Wednesday, February 9?"

"Why isn't Public Health advice made transparent to
the public?"

Premier Peter Gutwein's media spokesperson said
Public Health "have done dozens of press conferences
in recent weeks to explain their advice in regards to
schools returning".

"At these press conference, journalists are able to ask
any question regarding their advice.

"It is very transparent.

"The Premier and Public Health are likely to do a press
conference tomorrow, where you are more than
welcome to join and ask your own questions ahead of
schools returning."

A written copy of the risk assessment, used as the
basis of government decision-making, was also
requested by the *Kingborough Chronicle* on February 6.

"To be clear, can the Premier and Minister for Health
please provide the written advice received from Public
Health," requested the *Kingborough Chronicle*.

"Can the Premier and Minister for Health include a
copy of the risk assessment used as the basis for
decision-making.

"Was a risk assessment undertaken?"

"By whom?"

"Why isn't this Public Health written advice transparent
and available to the public?"

These questions remain unanswered and there was no
risk assessment provided at the time of going to print.

"The police do a tremendous job in keeping the local
communities safe, but they need more resources," Mr
Winter said.

"The State Government must make sure the police can
keep doing their job effectively as Kingborough and the
Huon Valley are growing."

The *Kingborough Chronicle* requested a response
from the Minister for Police, Fire and Emergency
Services, Jacquie Petrusma MP on February 4.

"Will Police numbers and hours of work be increased
in Kingborough in proportion to the increasing crime
statistics," asked the *Kingborough Chronicle*.

"Where will these Police come from?"

Minister Petrusma disputed the trend in crime figures

noted by Mr Winter.

"I am advised that the main crime categories in
Kingston over the past 5 years have been stable, with
the additional reduction in total offences during the
2020-2021 period largely influenced by less activity
due to COVID-19," responded Ms Petrusma.

"Further, that fluctuations will result when comparing
monthly statistics rather than looking at long term trends.

Minister Petrusma said two more police officers were
to be allocated to Kingston Police Station this year, how-
ever not details have been provided on the total number
of policing hours.

In 2022 there will be a total of 25 police officers at
Kingston Police Station, with two more police officers to
be allocated this year.

Local businesses share COVID stories

Reduced foot traffic, staff shortages and reduced revenue are common themes in the stories of local businesses around Kingborough during the COVID outbreak in January and February, following the opening of the State border in late 2021.

The *Kingborough Chronicle* has been hearing from local small businesses from various retail, hospitality and health sectors regarding their recent experiences.

Numerous small businesses owners have said the State government's grant process was too onerous, and hence too expensive, to recoup the \$1000 or \$2000 grant offered.

Other small business owners said although revenue had reduced substantially, it was not enough to qualify for the grant.

Kate Banks-Gorton, owner of Breadd bakery and cafe, opened her Kingston store in 2008, following the

success of her first bakery which opened in Murray Street, Hobart, in 2001.

Kate said the recent COVID outbreak had resulted in observable changes in the way people shop.

"I'd like to thank our customers for continuing to come in," said Kate.

"It's definitely visible that there are fewer people who come in and sit down and have a coffee with friends.

"Our core product is Breadd.

"So now many of our core customers are just buying the bread and taking it home.

"All the local businesses struggle when people don't come.

"We've had to shorten trading hours and are reducing staff when its quiet."

Kate said people were selecting venues to meet with friends based on availability of outdoor dining.

"Businesses that have an outdoor area are probably

doing better," commented Kate.

Manager of Kingdom Coffee cafe in Kingston, Peko Meh, reported a similar experience.

"Our team have poured our heart and soul into this social enterprise cafe, aiming to bless the community with its profit," Peko commented.

"However, with the current covid situation, it couldn't even cover our wages and operational expenses.

"It breaks our heart to see food go to waste due to the low foot traffic these days.

"We know many are doing it tough, so we have a little shortbread to encourage everyone in our community, we're in this together, you can make a difference by supporting local."

Round two of the Tasmanian Government's COVID-19 Business Impact Support Program is due to open at 2pm on Tuesday, February 15.

Over-reported COVID cases in Tasmania

Public Health Services (PHS) has identified that Tasmania has over-reported its COVID-19 case numbers due to data errors which saw duplicate cases wrongly included in the State's daily case total.

In a statement released Monday, January 31, Dr Julie Graham, Deputy Director of Public Health said "In total, 1333 cases have been found to be duplicate cases of existing cases already accounted for."

"These cases will be removed from Tasmania's daily total from tomorrow, Tuesday, February 1.

"The Federal Government is also being notified to

remove these duplicate cases from the national figures.

"There were two causes of the data anomaly.

"An error in the database system used by PHS for case collation incorrectly created some duplicate cases.

"The system vendor was notified and has fixed the issue.

"A second issue was causing duplicate cases to be created in the database when people registered a positive RAT result and then took a PCR test which also returned a positive result.

"Processes have been refined to ensure this no longer occurs," Dr Graham said.

"PHS epidemiologists found the duplication anomaly

while checking case data.

"Duplications occurred from December 15 to January 23.

"There has been no impact on anyone who tested positive for COVID-19.

"All people who had a positive PCR test, or registered a positive RAT test, were recorded.

"Due to the anomalies, some cases were recorded twice, and the duplicate record wrongly included in the total case number.

"PHS is confident this issue is now resolved.

"Epidemiologists continue to check and analyse case data as part of the State's COVID-19 response."

Houses acquired for Southern Outlet lane

The Tasmanian Government is moving forward with planning for a transit lane on the Southern Outlet.

In a statement released in January, Minister for Infrastructure and Transport, Michael Ferguson MP said it was "the only solution to ease traffic congestion on the Southern Outlet."

"The Government quietly got on with the job of positively working with key property owners on Dynnrne Road and the number of properties impacted will be considerably fewer than that repeatedly and falsely claimed."

Mr Ferguson said some negotiated acquisitions have now been agreed.

"Subject to final engineering advice, as few as four dwellings might be acquired," said Mr Ferguson.

Since the statement was released, the *Kingborough Chronicle* can confirm four home-owners have agreed to sell their homes, with no compulsory acquisitions required according to the State Government.

"As the Minister committed to helping Kingston residents with a solution, I have consistently said that any property owners impacted by the new transit lane will be dealt with respectfully and generously and that has certainly been the case," Mr Ferguson continued.

"Greens Leader Cassy O'Connor has demonstrated her hypocrisy on the Southern Outlet.

"She has failed to back this public transport initiative despite her loud advocacy for buses over cars.

"Ms O'Connor could not bring herself to support the transit lane, which will be for the exclusive use of buses and high occupancy vehicles, including 70 extra daily bus services between Hobart and Kingston each day."

Greens Leader Cassy O'Connor responded to Mr Ferguson's comments.

"Minister Ferguson gets very unpleasant when he's challenged, especially over his pet road projects," said Ms O'Connor.

"As he continues to underinvest in modern transport solutions in favour of massive road projects, the Minister remains stuck in the 20th century.

"It's news to the Greens that the new lane will be for the exclusive use of buses and high occupancy vehicles.

"When we asked about this in Budget estimates a while back, there was no guarantee the lane would not also have cars on it.

"Mr Ferguson glosses over the impact on Dynnrne residents of a new lane on the Southern Outlet, and

denies the reality that more roads inevitably means more cars.

"Passenger, pedestrian and cycling infrastructure needs are being ignored all over Tasmania.

"It's time this Minister and this Government put our public money when their mouths are to modernize Tasmania's transport system," Ms O'Connor concluded.

Minister Ferguson also brought up Labor's view on the controversial lane being added to the Southern Outlet.

"The Labor Opposition meanwhile has a policy for permanent congestion on the Southern Outlet," claimed Mr Ferguson.

"Despite the initiative as a part of the Hobart City Deal, Labor want to forever condemn more than 50,000 residents of the Kingborough and Huon municipal areas to time wasted in traffic jams and a network that simply can't cope with interruption."

Leader of the Tasmanian Labor Party, and Shadow Minister for Infrastructure Rebecca White MP said, "more than 2,500 Tasmanians have signed a petition opposing Minister Ferguson's plan to bulldoze homes to widen Hobart's Southern Outlet."

"It's clear this government proposal is not wanted and will not solve the problem.

"Mr Ferguson needs to listen residents and stop recklessly pushing ahead with this plan, a plan that would not actually do what is needed to address the traffic congestion issues on the outlet.

"What it achieves is a short extra strip of road from Olinda Grove to Macquarie Street which is not going to fix traffic congestion and the community can see right through that," said Ms White.

"Mr Ferguson is the Minister responsible for transport and easing traffic congestion.

"So far, he has come up with nothing to achieve that.

"Mr Ferguson is good at levelling criticism and appalling at providing solutions.

"It's time he understood he is the Minister responsible for building infrastructure, not just cutting ribbons and coming up with deeply flawed plans, and got on with the job of actually building stuff that works," Ms White said.

The Tasmanian Government said the next steps for the Southern Outlet expansion will involve on-going discussions with home owners and geo-technical assessments of the land for the proposed fifth lane.

Home warranty insurance to be reintroduced

The Tasmanian Government intends to reintroduce home warranty insurance in Tasmania following the collapse of a local building company.

In a media release on January 25, Minister for Workplace Safety and Consumer Affairs, Elise Archer MP said the government intends to develop a financial support package to assist those negatively affected by the recent failure Tasmanian Constructions Pty Ltd, trading as Hotondo Homes, and Inside Out Constructions Pty Ltd.

"We recognise that buying or building a home is the biggest investment many families will make, and we have already taken action to support consumers by announcing our intention to reintroduce home warranty insurance in Tasmania," said Minister Archer.

"Home warranty insurance covers incomplete or defective building work in the event that a builder has

died, disappears or becomes insolvent, and a is currently being developed by the Department of Justice and Department of Treasury and Finance.

"This model will be the subject of consultation with stakeholders in the coming months.

"Once implemented, home warranty insurance will provide Tasmanian property owners with greater protection when building a home.

"However, we recognise that more needs to be done to help those affected by the recent failures, and it is our intention that the financial support package will operate similarly to home warranty insurance, if it was already in place."

Further details of the scheme are expected to be provided in the coming weeks.

The diaries of Harriett Gore Browne, Tasmanian Governor's wife, 1861 - 1869



Beware of Mrs Browne

For the last four years Fiona MacFarlane has transcribed, edited and annotated the diaries of Mrs Harriett Gore Browne, wife of former Tasmanian Governor, Thomas Gore Browne. "My work culminated in a book *Beware of Mrs Browne*, and this unpublished manuscript is now freely available via the Libraries Tasmania website," explained Fiona MacFarlane. "I would love to promote this new resource to Tasmanian history lovers. "The diaries include a detailed and a rather scandalous description of the Duke of Edinburgh's visit to Tasmania in January 1868, the first Royal Tour in Tasmania. "It also details Harriett's amusing struggle to integrate into 1860s Hobartian society. "Brown's River, now Kingston, is mentioned several times." Fiona has provided a brief piece from her 284-page book, *Beware of Mrs Browne*. "Tuesday was not fine enough for our picnic with

Lady Dry to Brown's River, so it was put off till the following day, when all our family, the Drys, Chesneys and Des Veaux drove to the station buildings at this side of Brown's River and had a regular Webbs luncheon with the pleasant addition of ice champagne cup and claret. The position of our table was lovely, Commanding the Derwent and opposite bank and after we had eaten, we went down a steep patch to the rocks, which lay by the sea-side and which flat by the sea were bounded by beautiful cliffs and precipices. It was very pleasant to watch the waves rolling in, but Gore was angry with me for venturing down. Fred stayed behind with me, and I did not find it very tiring. Harold, Willie and Frank were perfectly happy making a great bonfire in the prisoners' old yard and May gathered wild-flowers."

Forum for mental health at Kingston Beach Hall

Kingston resident, registered nurse and health educator, Sue Carlyon, has written a book titled *Blitz the Blues - Tough Talking and Truth Talking for Peace* and is hosting public discussion forums on February 12 and 26.

The free public forums will present mental health and wellbeing through spiritual insight and the need for a more holistic approach in addressing the underlying causes of these issues. "Mental health issues were high on the list of priorities for the Tasmanian Government to address long before COVID-19 was on the radar, and so too was family violence," said Sue Carlyon. "In fact, in 2005 the incumbent Labor Government published a progress report in *The Mercury* newspaper titled *The State We're In - Tasmania Together* in which

Premier Lennon acknowledged there is still concern about family violence and the number of children on child protection orders." "With the coronavirus pandemic now entering its third year, the issues of mental illness and domestic violence have been exacerbated throughout Australia as a result of the additional stresses and challenges individuals and their relationships have been subjected to. "In Tasmania there is now a crisis within the mental health sector as practitioners struggle to deal with their burgeoning workload. "Clearly, all is not well," said Sue. "Without there now being a whole of society effort to address the underlying causes of domestic violence and certain mental health issues, and more effective solutions implemented, lives will continue to be detrimentally impacted and the service providers stretched even further beyond their capacity."

Sue's time living and working with the First Nations people of Utopia in the Northern Territory, reaffirmed for her the significance of the spiritual aspect of life. Sue had identified with the spiritual aspects of life during her religious education, her experience growing up on a dairy farm on the north-west coast of Tasmania, and through her nursing experiences and research. These experiences led Sue to establish *Blitz the Blues* in 2010, for the purpose of addressing mental health issues and domestic violence through public forums and meetings, to discuss these issues more broadly. Sue's public meetings will be held between 6:30pm and 8pm in the Kingston Beach Hall. COVID protocols will be adhered to and attendees will receive a free copy of her book. The heart of the house is the Rayburn multi-function slow-combustion stove providing cooking, hot water and hydronic heating.

It is connected to a 380-litre hot water cylinder.

Three tanks hold 35,000 litres of rainwater storage for all the buildings.

A short distance from the main home is a second, separate and self-contained, one-level, two-bedroom accommodation cabin, with galley kitchen, shower and high-quality composting loo, all serviced by the property's main off-grid facilities for solar power and hot water.

A separate open-plan music studio completes the trio of buildings on this remarkable property.






