No apology for COVID infected schools

The *Kingborough Chronicle* is aware that numerous schools in Kingborough have been affected by COVID-19 outbreaks since opening for the year, with many families impacted.

The full impact is unknown, as this information is not reported by the Tasmanian Government, however daily case numbers of COVID-19 across the State are likely to provide an indication, suggests Member for Clark, Cassy O'Connor MP.

"As of last Friday, daily case numbers were up by almost 50 per cent since the start of school," noted Ms O'Connor in a media release on March 1.

"Just today, the number of confirmed COVID cases has trended up yet again to 957, a jump of more than 200 reported cases in 24 hours."

The Tasmanian Government has defined a school outbreak as "five cases in one classroom".

As State Parliament resumed, the Tasmanian Greens asked the Premier to apologise to students, teachers and families.

"When the Premier made the decision to send unvaccinated, unmasked primary school children back in to classrooms during raging community transmission of COVID, he assured Tasmanian parents, students and teachers his government had a plan to 'return to school safely'.

"Peter Gutwein promised schools would provide a 'COVID safe learning

environment'.

"Within two and a half weeks, eight in ten Tasmanian schools had reported COVID infections.

"Today, on the first opportunity in Parliament, we asked the Premier to apologise to Tasmanian parents, students and teachers for not keeping them safe from COVID.

"Peter Gutwein refused to acknowledge his part in the COVID spread in schools, instead attacking the Greens for raising concerns based on evidence. "Peter Gutwein's plan has not provided COVID safe learning environments for unvaccinated, unmasked primary school students.

"Primary schools are, in fact, where most of the infections and outbreaks have occurred, and subsequently been taken home to infect families.

"Children have been exposed to a deadly virus with known long term health consequences.

"He should apologise for his leading role in facilitating the spread of COVID in schools."

The *Kingborough Chronicle* has contacted the Government for comment and asked how many schools in Kingborough have had COVID cases since opening in 2022, and how many cases have been reported in each school.

The response to these questions shall be reported in our next edition.

Housing crisis prompts promises

As Tasmania's Premier used his State of the State 2022 address in Parliament to promise 10,000 new homes in the State over the next decade, independent federal Member for Clark Andrew Wilkie MP has called for "much more" to be "done now" to address the "urgent need" for homes.

The Premier's statement on Tuesday, March 1 did not go as far as using the word "crisis" to describe the ongoing lack of rental accommodation and affordable housing in Tasmania in recent years, however the Premier conceded rising property values had "impacted" the cost of renting a home.

"We know that the strong property market has made it difficult for some to access rentals and rising property values have further impacted the cost of renting a home," stated Premier Peter Gutwein.

Premier Gutwein said the recently announced statutory authority Housing Tasmania will have the capacity to borrow and invest, and "when established" it will have a balance sheet of "more than \$2 billion" to increase the delivery of new social and affordable homes.

"Over the next decade, Housing Tasmania's Board will be tasked with building and acquiring, as well as partnering with the not-for-profit sector, to deliver an additional 6500 homes and units on top of our current target of 3500 homes by 2027 for a total of 10,000 new homes by 2032," Premier Gutwein said.

**Community organisations are being encouraged to
apply for funding available through Kingborough
Council's 2022 Community Grants Program.**

In a media release on Wednesday, March 2,
Kingborough Mayor, Paula Wriedt said grants were a way
for Council to work with community groups to enhance
community wellbeing through innovative activities.

"Our Grants Program is an important source of fund-
ing for many of our community groups," Cr Wriedt said.

North West Bay Golf Club president Neil Sorensen said
funding received through the Community Grants Program in
2021 enabled the club to introduce a junior golf program.

"The nation-wide MyGolf Program aims to give young

people the chance to learn to play golf from a young
age," Mr Sorensen said.

"This encourages young people to be involved in out-
door activities, provides them with the fundamental
skills needed for the sport and hopefully helps to devel-
op their love of golf."

"There are so many excellent projects funded every
year," Cr Wriedt said.

"It is an absolute pleasure to be able to support our
dedicated community groups."

"Last year we also provided funding to BirdLife
Tasmania's brochure, which was a great resource to
help people get out and enjoy our natural areas and

connect with the biodiversity of Kingborough.

The Community Grants Program supports activities
and initiatives such as community health and wellbeing,
arts and culture, community development, heritage and
history, sport and recreation, festivals and events, envi-
ronmental projects and sustainable living initiatives.

"As well as our Community Grants program Council
also provides a Quick Response Grants program, which

present at short notice," Cr Wriedt said.

Housing crisis continues on

In a message on Twitter on March 2, Independent federal Member for Clark Andrew Wilkie MP that while the Tasmanian Government's pledge of 10,000 new dwellings by 2032 is welcome, "there could be much more done now to address the urgent need for homes".

"Airbnb needs to be limited to spare rooms...so homes stay available for owner-occupiers and long-term rentals," suggested Mr Wilkie MP.

The *Kingborough Chronicle* wrote to the Premier and to the Minister for Housing, Michael Ferguson MP on March 4, requesting the latest figures on homelessness in Kingborough.

"Can the Premier and Minister Ferguson MP please provide the latest figures on homelessness in Kingborough, if available.

"Can the Premier and Minister Ferguson MP please tell the community: What is stopping developers from profiting from the taxpayer-funded Residential Land Rebate?

"Could taxpayers' money potentially be channelled by developers into political donations?"

No response has yet been provided at time of print.

Under the current Residential Land Rebate program, rebates of up to \$10,000 per lot are available to developers to help cover the cost of power, water and sewerage infrastructure.

As part of the announcements on March 1, Premier Gutwein said the government would double the Residential Land Rebate program for developers from \$15 million to \$30 million.

"Already more than 820 lots state-wide have been approved and another 127 are being assessed, and to keep the supply of land flowing, we are extending our funding commitment, while all other criteria for the program will remain the same," said Premier Gutwein.

Other housing related commitments announced include.

Land tax thresholds reset

"We will again reset land tax thresholds, doubling the tax-free threshold to \$100,000, meaning no land tax will now be paid on land valued under \$100,000," said Premier Gutwein.

"We will also lift the upper tax threshold to \$500,000 and lower the tax rate for land valued between \$100,000 and \$500,000 from 0.55 per cent to 0.45 per cent.

"The changes mean around 70,000 Tasmanians will save on average approximately \$800 every year, up to a maximum saving of \$1625, with close to 12,000 taxpayers no longer needing to pay any land tax at all."

Rezoning for residential development to be considered "on merit"

"One thing that will be a critical factor in increasing housing supply and improving affordability is the availability of land," stated Premier Gutwein.

"While recent estimates indicate there is already around 5000 hectares of vacant land zoned for residential use, which could yield up to 60,000 residential lots, much of it remains undeveloped.

"That's why we are continuing to incentivise landowners to activate this land.

"However, we recognise that there is more that we can do, this includes providing amendments that will allow the Tasmanian Planning Commission to consider more contemporary growth forecasts when rezoning land.

"Rezoning proposals for residential development will be able to be considered on their merits without needing to wait for the full review of our regional land-use strategies to be completed and without compromising sound planning processes."

"Government intervention" to facilitate medium-density infill housing

"Currently, there is a lack of centrally located medium-density infill housing occurring in our cities.

"I believe active Government intervention is required, to not only identify areas for infill development, but to make it happen.

"As a first step, through the Hobart City Deal, we will prioritise this focus area and work with our City Deal

partners to provide innovative solutions, including legislating if required so that we can open up the corridor sooner and build more homes."

Home Share program extended

"We will be extending the thresholds and expanding the eligibility for our successful Home Share program, which will now be called the *Housing Market Entry Program* allowing more Tasmanians who meet our very reasonable income and assets tests access.

"We will also double the State's equity contribution to a maximum of \$200,000 or 40 per cent of the purchase price for purchasers of new homes or units, and up to a maximum of \$150,000 or 30 per cent of the purchase price for eligible established homes or units.

"We are also opening up access to eligible First Home Buyers, who would otherwise be unable to obtain finance, to enable them with our help to purchase existing homes rather than have to build a home."

First Home Owners Grant program extended

"We will extend the First Home Owners Grant of \$30,000 for another 12 months from July 1.

"The First Home Owners Grant will also be available to

those who use our Housing Market Entry Program to build a new home."

Private Rental Incentives Program scheme extended

"The Government will also double the Private Rental Incentives Program, which encourages property owners to make their homes available for affordable rent to low-income households, with low or no support needs.

"We will extend this Scheme from its current limit of 200 homes to 400 homes, creating another 200 affordable rental properties for the next two years."

Ancillary dwelling program extended

"An additional \$2.5 million will be invested making 250 more places available on top of the initial allocation of 250 and the program will be extended until the end of next year," continued Premier Gutwein.

Thresholds on concessions on property transfer duty Stamp Duty

"We are today also announcing that all Stamp Duty and First Home-Owner grants and concessions will be increased to a \$600,000 threshold, which including the previous changes last year, results in a 50 per cent increase keeping in line with rising property prices."

Ogilvie joins Cabinet

Member for Clark, Madeline Ogilvie MP is the latest addition to Tasmania's Cabinet.

Premier of Tasmania, Peter Gutwein announced the ministerial appointment in a media statement on Monday, February 28.

Ms Ogilvie was elected to the House of Assembly as a Labor Party candidate in 2014, representing the electorate of Denison (later renamed Clark), and was defeated at the State election in 2018.

Ms Ogilvie re-entered Tasmania's Parliament as an independent in 2019, then joined the Liberal Party in 2021 and was re-elected in the seat of Clark.

"I'd like to congratulate Madeleine and welcome her

to our Cabinet," stated Premier Gutwein.

"Madeleine will become the Minister for the following portfolios: small business; women; hospitality and events; disability services; and racing.

"She will be sworn in at Government House shortly. "The changes follow the resignation of Jane Howlett for personal and family reasons.

"Madeleine is an experienced Member of Parliament who was first elected in 2014.

"Madeleine has an extensive background in business and law, including having worked for UNESCO, Allen's law firm and as a general manager with Telstra.

"All other Ministerial portfolios will remain as they were allocated on February 17."

"We learn about Australian culture."

The group celebrated the end of 2021 with everyone bringing food from their various cultures.

"There's lots of giving from the students as well, said Sandy von Allmen.

"It's so satisfying."

Sandy will deliver a talk to the group on March 24 about the 1967 bushfires and how it impacted Tasmania, particularly the Channel area.

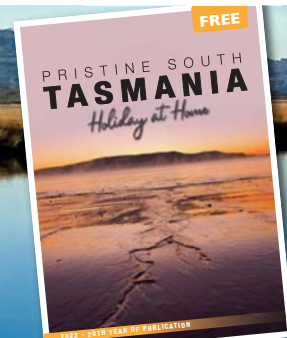

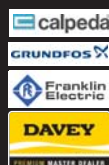

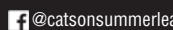
