

It's on, May 21

The federal political landscape is up for grabs, with the 2022 Federal Election confirmed for Saturday, May 21.

After weeks of unofficial campaigning, Prime Minister Scott Morrison, with the approval of Governor General David Hurley, finally made it official on Sunday, April 4. Soon after, the Australian Electoral Commission (AEC) took to Twitter to remind us all, "an election involves more than just sausages on election day". Indeed, there are cake stalls, however, what the AEC wanted to share, quite urgently, is that time is running out to enrol to vote. "Most urgently, the electoral roll closes at 8pm on Monday, April 18," tweeted the AEC.

To enrol to vote or to check or update enrolment details, visit www.aec.gov.au. Anyone thinking of nominating as a candidate has until April 21 to do so, with all candidates to be announced by the AEC on April 22. Early voting is due to commence on May 9.

Huon candidates

Five candidates are in the running to contest the vacancy in Tasmania's Legislative Council to represent the division of Huon.

Polling day for the division of Huon by-election is Saturday, May 7. The Tasmanian Electoral Commission (TEC) announced the names of the candidates on Friday, April 8, as follows:

- Aldo Antolli (Liberal Party), a Kingston Beach CEO.
 - Pat Caplice (The Local Party), a Margate resident.
 - Cr Gideon Cordover (Tasmanian Greens), a Kingborough Councillor.
 - Dean Harriss (Independent), a construction supervisor from Huonville.
 - Toby Thorpe (Australian Labor Party), a public servant from Huonville.
- Although the names are listed on the TEC website in alphabetical order, the names will be rotated on ballot papers.

Any electors who are unable to vote on polling day, may attend a pre-polling centre.

A pre-polling centre is open from 8:30am to 5:30pm weekdays until Friday, May 6, at Kingborough Family Church, 11 Glory Place, Huntingfield.

The pre-polling centre will be closed over the Easter long weekend and on the Anzac Day public holiday.

An additional pre-polling centre will open in Huonville Town Hall in the final week before polling day.

Postal vote applications close on Friday, April 29.

Voters will head back to polling booths two weeks later for the 2022 Federal Election.

A new Premier

Jeremy Rockliff MP was confirmed as Tasmania's new Premier on Friday, April 8, following the surprise departure of Peter Gutwein on April 4, with Michael Ferguson MP announced as the new Deputy Premier and Treasurer.

Mr Rockliff has served as Deputy Premier since 2014 to former Premier's Will Hodgman and Peter Gutwein.

"I'm excited to be elected today by my parliamentary colleagues to lead the Liberal Party and therefore become Tasmania's 47th Premier," said Mr Rockliff.

Mr Rockliff was the only contender for the top job and will retain the Health portfolio. It is understood Mr Ferguson was the only candidate to nominate for the Deputy position, although Member for Clark, Elise Archer MP had indicated an interest in the role earlier in the week.

Independent Member for Nelson Meg Webb said Mr Rockliff's appointment as Premier, "offers an opportunity for a new inclusive and respectful culture to be adopted by government".

"As the new Premier, Mr Rockliff now has the responsibility to change the tone of government, and to replace glass-jawed defensiveness with positive and open leadership," said Ms Webb.

Kingston CBD design decided

The final design of the major upgrade of Kingston's CBD has been decided by a vote of Kingborough Councillors on Monday, April 4.

Following consultation with businesses and the community, Councillors chose to implement a hybrid of Design Option 1.

Kingborough Mayor, Paula Wriedt said it was an important and difficult decision to make, with a lot of competing stakeholders.

"We deferred voting on this last Council Meeting, to have further workshops on this issue to ensure we get this right," said Mayor Wriedt.

"The design that we have chosen will see more protection for cycling through the heart of Kingston, creates more green corridors and traffic calming measures and invigorates the business sector which will attract more investment to the area."

Mayor Wriedt said Councillors chose to implement a design that gives

Council more flexibility to meet more people's desired outcomes over time.

"The agreed design allows for future growth and represents contributions made by the wider community including cyclists, people with disabilities, pedestrians, businesses and other commuters," noted Mayor Wriedt.

"It includes the future removal of 10 parking spaces on the southbound side of the Channel Highway.

"This option also allows for the installation of on-street dining, a protected cycle land, public art, and street furniture upon completion of a dedicated parking facility in central Kingston.

"Following extensive community engagement, street trees, vegetation and on street parking were the highest priority for the redevelopment," Cr Wriedt said.

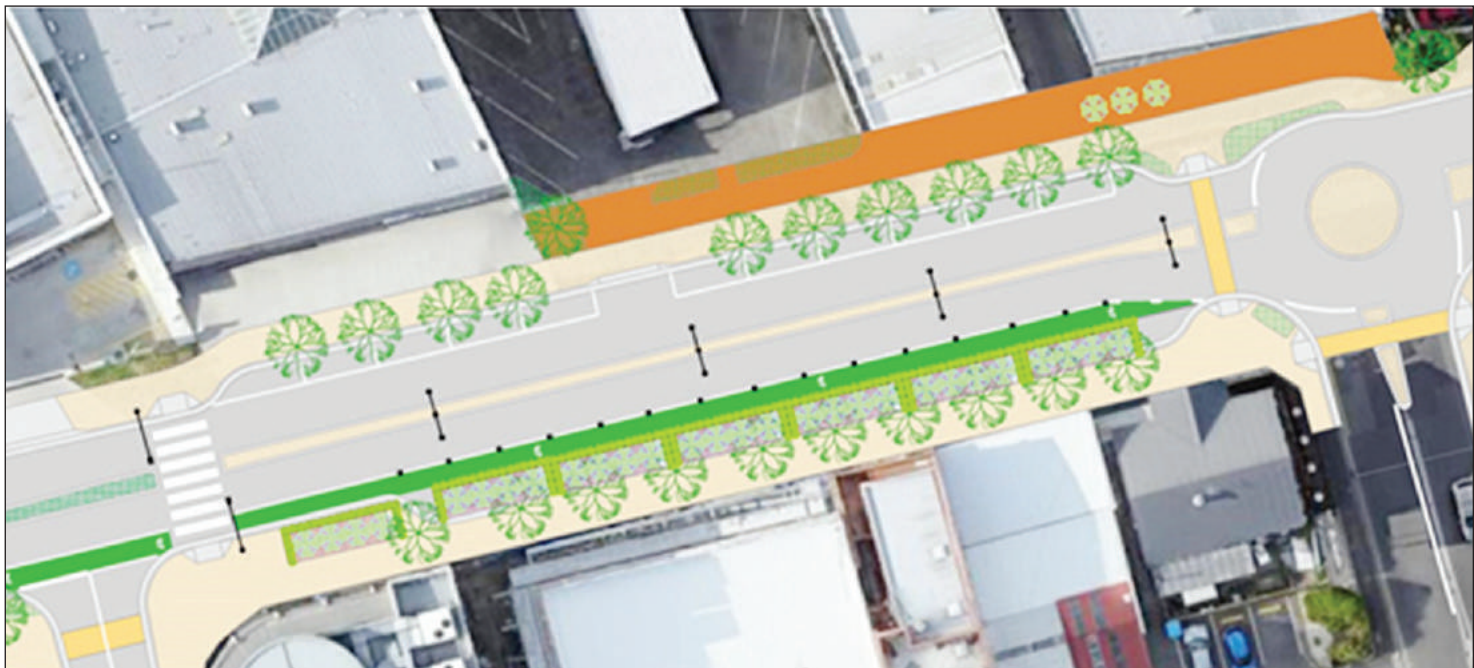

Gutwein quits

It's been said before, a week is a long time in politics. The resignation of Tasmanian Premier Peter Gutwein, announced at 4pm on Monday, April 4, took many by surprise.

Addressing the media gathered in Launceston, Peter Gutwein cited his desire to focus on his family.

"I have advised the Governor of my decision, and I will remain as Premier until the party elects a new leader, which will take place at the end of this week," stated Mr Gutwein.

"As I am also resigning as member for Bass, and given there will need to be a recount, I will be providing advice to the Governor to prorogue Parliament next week to allow this process to take place."

Mr Gutwein, who has led the party since Will Hodgman's resignation in 2020, said that he can "no longer give 110 per cent" to his role and has been left "drained" from the demands of the job.

"It is with some sadness that I leave, but I know the foundations that have been laid, the path has been laid out that a new leader will be able to make their own, and importantly, make their own decisions moving forward," Mr Gutwein expressed.

"I know that I leave the state in a good place and with a team that can build on the foundations that have been made. The parliament will resume as quickly as possible after Easter and the days lost will be made up as quickly as possible."

"The agreed option recognises that when Kingston has the carparking capacity in the future we can retrofit more on street dining and protected cycling lanes making sure that our communities voice has been listened to," said Mayor Wriedt.

"People overwhelmingly want an attractive and engaging public space and this design will certainly provide this.

"Much of the debate around the designs has centred on the location of the bike lane.

"This design will provide a 1.9 metre wide cycling lane for cyclists travelling south on the Channel Highway,

which exceeds the minimum standard of 1.5 m for a 40 kilometre per hour zone.

"Due to the successful trial of the temporary roundabout at the Hutchins Street and Channel Highway intersection, this will become permanent.

"The current John Street car park will be removed as part of the works to provide a pedestrian link between the CBD and Kingston Park resulting in the loss of a number of carparks.

"Currently there are only seven carparking spaces from Hutchins Street to John Street, which will be increased to 20 through this works.

"The relocation of the city bound bus space has

created the space available for on-street car parking.

"Included in the upgrade will be improved bus facilities, including an off-street Bus Interchange at 40 Channel Highway.

"Council purchased the property which was a Denture Clinic and Podiatrist last year, as after extensive investigation this proved to be the best location for a bus interchange.

"This upgrade will change the heart of Kingston and transform the Channel Highway into an attractive area that people will enjoy visiting, business will want to invest in, and will make the area completely accessible to all forms of transport," concluded Mayor Wriedt.

Goshawk Way roadworks

Work is underway on the construction of a new roundabout and underpass on Goshawk Way in Kingston.

The road construction works also include the extension of Goshawk Way and an upgrade to the existing John Street roundabout.

A second lane is also to be constructed into Kingston on the Huon Highway.

Kingborough Council estimates the works will take six months and anticipates traffic delays in the vicinity during this period.

Council has received and responded to feedback from the community on social media regarding the close proximity of the roundabouts.

"Thank you for all your comments which are focusing on the close proximity of three roundabouts," read

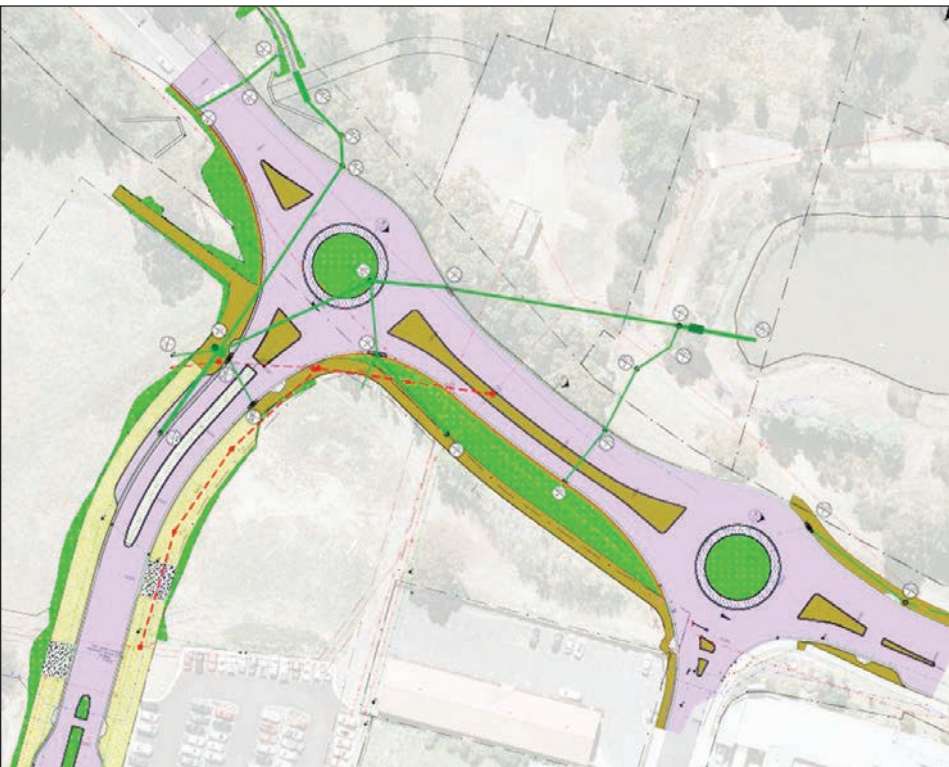
Kingborough Council's Facebook post.

"In addition to the traffic studies and reports undertaken to underpin the original design, extensive modelling and information confirms the design of the three roundabouts as the ideal solution for managing the traffic both currently and into the future.

"The second lane into Kingston on the Huon Highway has also been incorporated to future proof traffic flow in the area.

"The roundabouts will futureproof the Kingston CBD, enabling commuters to bypass the main street of Kingston Channel Highway and travel along John Street or Goshawk Way to the Huon Highway.

"Both roundabouts (Goshawk Way and Johns Street) will alleviate traffic build up in central Kingston, allowing the CBD to become a greener, more pedestrian and cycle-friendly environment."

Youth survey opens

It’s time for the young people of Kingborough, aged 15 to 19, to have their say.

Mission Australia’s Youth Survey 2022 is now open. The environment, COVID-19 and mental health were identified as the top issues of importance to young people in Tasmania last year, scoring 55, 37.6 and 36.3 per cent respectively. In fact, environmental concern more than doubled in one year, from 20.9 per cent in 2020 to the highest importance among respondents in 2021. Regarding personal issues of concern, coping with stress, mental health and school or study problems were the top three concerns last year, scoring 46.4, 45.1 and 34.9 per cent respectively. The Youth Survey has been running for over two decades and is the largest of its kind. Mission Australia’s State Director, Mychelle Curran, said today’s young people have been faced with challenges never encountered by previous generations. “Results are provided to government and non-government organisations to inform design and delivery of policies, initiatives

and services that impact young people’s lives,” noted Ms Curran. “We know from our Youth Survey that young people are extremely resilient and they care about their futures, as well as the people and world around them. “We also know that they’re experiencing unique challenges, such as high levels of psychological distress and are less happy than they were just two years ago. “Teenagers have borne the brunt of the economic and psychological consequences of the pandemic and they must be included in planning and decision-making that affect them, their peers, families, communities and Australia. “Young people are also navigating the ever-evolving pressures of things like social media, the global pandemic and are likely concerned about the uncertainties of what is currently occurring in Eastern Europe,” said Ms Curran. “None of these events were occurring when we started this survey over two decades ago.” Young people can respond, either through participating schools or groups or individually through Mission Australia’s website at www.missionaustralia.com.au/youthsurvey

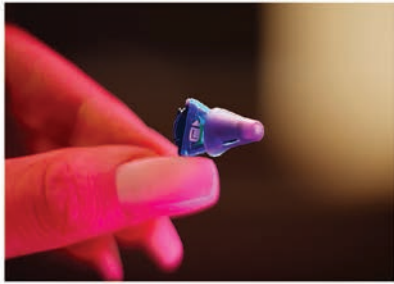
