Election is decided

Locals have rewarded candidates prioritising integrity and climate in the 2022 Federal Election, with positive swings observed, consistent with a trend observed elsewhere on mainland Australia.

While the vote counting is ongoing, according to the Australian Electoral Commission results of the 2022 Federal Election, on Sunday May 22, Australia is set to have a new government and a Labor Prime Minister.

Electors in the federal electoral divisions of Clark and Franklin have voted to keep their previously elected Lower House representatives in Parliament, however in the Upper House, Liberal Senator for Tasmania, local Eric Abetz may have failed to regain his seat.

Mr Abetz, who entered the Senate in 1994, was placed third on the party's ticket.

House of Representatives - Franklin

Labor's Julie Collins MP has been returned to the House of Representatives. Ms Collins was first elected in 2007.

On her Facebook page on Sunday, May 22, Ms Collins thanked locals for their support.

"I am humbled and thankful to the people of Franklin for the support in yesterday's election," wrote Ms Collins.

"Be assured I will work hard to make sure we get a better future and a better government for all of us as part of an Albanese Labor Government."

The Local Party, contesting the seat of Franklin for the first time, picked up 5.13 percent of first preference votes, meanwhile Liberal and Australian Labor Party have seen swings against them.

House of Representatives - Clark

Independent Andrew Wilkie has won his fifth term, with a strong primary vote.

"I am delighted to be in a position to again hold the seat," said Andrew Wilkie MP.

"I'm an independent MP and don't favour any political party.

"In the event that neither major party win a majority of seats at the election, I will not do any formal deals and instead decide every issue on its merits, including questions of confidence and supply to any particular party.

"What constitutes merit is the sum of many considerations including the views of the community and my conscience.

"Any decisions I need to make immediately after the election will be done so as soon as possible."

In the Senate

The general election, held on May 21 also included a half-Senate election, to elect six Senators for Tasmania.

The Australian Electoral Commission Tally Room on Sunday, May 22, reported provisional quotas for each party, based on first preferences as follows:

Liberal Party 2.1557; Australian Labor Party 1.9081; The Greens 1.1058; and Jacqui Lambie Network 0.5715.

In the division of Clark, group totals for above-the-line votes results saw the Australian Labor Party receive 30.13 per cent of votes, The Greens receive 28.53 per cent and the Liberal Party receive 21.88 per cent.

HARRISS WINS HUON

Voters in the division of Huon have elected an independent representative to the Upper House.

Sitting at my desk beside Simone, I felt happy.

It was the first time that I have ever considered putting off a lunch break to continue working, and to me (and my stomach) that meant something.



Upset for Labor in Huon

Voters in the division of Huon have elected an independent candidate to the Tasmanian Legislative Council.

Dean Harriss received 11,840 votes (52.55 per cent) as a result of the distribution of preferences, ahead of Labor's Toby Thorpe on 10,693 votes (47.5 per cent), after the Tasmanian Electoral Commission closed the postal vote period on Tuesday, May 17.

Harriss, a Huonville builder, picked up the lion's share of votes (3898) from the distribution of Liberal candidate Aldo Antolli's preferences.

In the lead up to the May 7 by-election, the father of four said people in the region were struggling with increasing costs of living and rent affordability.

His entry to Parliament has followed his father's footsteps. Paul Harriss was the elected member for Huon for 18 years. Elected as an independent candidate in 1996, Paul Harriss retired as a Liberal member and Minister for Resources in 2014.

However, Dean Harriss stated he would not be working for a political party.

"I remember going to the Legislative Council with Dad when there were very few party members and my passion comes from seeing proper debates and votes that were not along party lines," said Dean Harriss, on the campaign trail.

"I will work for our community not a political party.

"I will lobby for better access to health care, continued improvement in education outcomes, access to affordable housing and jobs and much greater expenditure on our freight transport corridors that have not been properly recognised over many years.

"Increasing cost of living pressures (rent, fuel, food etc) are affecting many people in our community and this impacts their health and wellbeing.

"Government needs to start looking at and implementing long-term solutions rather than short-term fixes.

"Significant attention needs to be given to planning law red tape, which inhibits housing development," commented Mr Harriss.

"I hope to be a strong, considered advocate for small businesses and industries like agriculture, aquaculture and forestry."

The by-election result was an unexpected upset, as the seat was previously held by Labor's Dr Bastian Seidel, a popular local doctor and former president of the Royal Australian College of General Practitioners, who announced his resignation in August 2021, only a year

after entering state Parliament.

It had been a long, 10-day wait for the postman for the top four candidates in this month's tightly contested by-election.

Final first preference results had Labor's Toby Thorpe in the lead (on 5648 votes), with Harriss second (5340), Liberal Antolli Aldo third (5111), Tasmanian Greens fourth (4704) and The Local Party's Pat Caplice placed fifth (1748).

Liberal member for Franklin, Nic Street MP, was quick to welcome Dean Harriss to Parliament, in a media release on May 17.

"Mr Harriss's election has seen Labor lose a seat it held, with a massive 19 per cent swing against the party on the primary vote this election, when compared

with their result in the previous Huon election," said Nic Street MP, who filled the vacancy caused by the resignation of Paul Harriss.

The *Kingborough Chronicle* wrote to Dean Harriss on May 18, inviting further statements on his pre-election commitment to being an independent representative for the electorate, and shall report further when received.

The declaration of the poll ceremony was conducted by the returning officer Graeme Ingram on May 18.

Kingborough is now represented in Tasmania's upper house by two independent members, Dean Harriss MLC and Independent Member for Nelson, Meg Webb MLC.

The Tasmanian Legislative Council now has seven Independents, four Labor and four Liberal members.

Kingborough zoning in early assessment phase

Mayor of Kingborough, Cr Paula Wriedt has sought to reassure the community that changes to zoning have not yet occurred, as the municipality is currently only at the second stage of a six-stage process.

The Tasmanian Government commenced a process in 2015 to roll out a single planning scheme for Tasmania, known as the Tasmanian Planning Scheme.

"The Kingborough Draft Local Provision Schedule (Kingborough's component of the Tasmanian Planning Scheme) is currently with the Tasmanian Planning Commission for consideration," said Cr Wriedt a media statement on May 11.

"Kingborough Council understands that there is

concern in the community regarding the Local Provisions Schedule (LPS) and that some community members believe that their zoning has been changed without their knowledge.

"Once the Tasmanian Planning Commission has completed their assessment of the Kingborough Draft LPS, we will go through a public consultation period informing the community on proposed zoning changes," Cr Wriedt said.

"When Kingborough Council begins to consult with the community, people will be able to confirm what zoning is being proposed for their land and may then also make a representation if they want to indicate support, object or raise a concern with what is being proposed.

"Until we hear back from the Tasmanian Planning Commission about our draft, nothing is confirmed.

"We don't know what zoning will be accepted and what will change, until the Commission has made a decision.

"When the consultation process begins, Council will be able to consider any submissions from the public and where appropriate recommend changes to what is being proposed to the Tasmanian Planning Commission.

"The consultation process will involve community information sessions, appointments, fact sheets, and of course informing the public that this is happening through the media and our website and social media channels," continued Cr Wriedt.

"The consultation period will run for 60 days.

"We know understanding the zoning proposed for your land is important to you, but until the public consultation period begins we actually cannot confirm the zoning changes."

"Presently, the Commission is having to work through the conversion of 29 existing planning schemes across the state to the new Tasmanian Planning Scheme, so different Councils will be exhibiting for public comment at different times.

"Some Councils have already converted to new Tasmanian Planning Scheme, some are in the process of engaging communities about it and some, like Kingborough are yet to be given approval to start the consultation process."

Council rates to rise 2.8 per cent annually

Kingborough Council discussed updates to its Long Term Financial Plan (LTFP) at its May 16 meeting, endorsing an annual rate increase of 2.8 per cent.

Mayor Paula Wriedt said it was "good governance" to have a ten year framework that demonstrated how Council would be financially sustainable.

"Without effective financial planning Council will be unable to meet the community's changing needs," said Cr Wriedt, in a media release on May 17.

"Underpinning our financial direction are six strategic actions that are making sure we are fiscally responsible and good financial managers.

Cr Wriedt said the strategic actions for Council were:

- Delivering an underlying surplus;
- Keeping future increases in operating expenses lower than revenue increases;
- Sustainably funding asset renewal;
- Ensuring Council is a low rating Council amongst the Greater Hobart Councils;
- Using debt only to support strategic investment in new infrastructure; and
- Being open and transparent with the community in relation to financial plans.

Mayor Wriedt said the LTFP assumes a general rate increase of 2.8 per cent annually throughout the life of the plan.

"Despite Hobart's Consumer Price Index increasing to 5.8 per cent this quarter, Council has chosen to endorse the LTFP based on annual general rate increases of only 2.8 per cent," said Cr Wriedt.

"Understandably any increase to Kingborough's General Rates is going to be undesirable for the community but Kingborough Council operates in the same economic climate that affects everyone.

"Though the cost of operating business is going up, Council understands that directly passing the full cost increases onto rate payers would be difficult for many.

"Everyone is experiencing cost of living increases, but as a Council we are being fiscally conservative and have budgeted for a small increase of 2.8 per cent to the General Rates for the 2022-23 financial year.

"Of the seven biggest Councils in the State, Kingborough has had the lowest average rates per rateable property over the last ten years, and this can only come about through sound financial management," Cr Wriedt said.



Kingborough Council have advised that the Whitewater Creek Track will be closed for an upgrade until Mid-August 2022, with the community requested to follow safety signs in the vicinity. The upgrade will transform the track into a 3-metre wide, concrete, shared path for pedestrians and cyclists. The project is funded through the State Government's Vulnerable Road User Program, the Hobart City Deal and Kingborough Council. The sections being upgraded are shown in red on the above map, with the blue access tracks also to be upgraded. (PS)

A giant, green, happy, daisy chain

A giant, green daisy chain is being crocheted, as a visual reminder of mindfulness and mental health, and is to be installed along the Beach Road path, towards Kingston Beach.

The Yarn Bomb Kingston community art and craft project will hopefully be finished and installed on Mindfulness Day, September 12, in time for Mental Health Week.

The daisy chain will require not only stems, leaves and flowers to be crocheted, but also lady bugs, butterflies and bees. Anyone wishing to participate is invited to register for a free workshop at Kingston Library, offered in partnership with Kingborough Council.

Workshops are offered in May and June for beginners, intermediate and experienced crocheters. Participants must register via Eventbrite, as numbers are limited due to physical distancing requirements. 

Significant Trees

More significant trees will be protected in Kingborough after Council endorsed proposed updates to the list at the 16 May Council Meeting.

Kingborough Mayor, Paula Wriedt said that Council had voted in favour for accepting 10 new listings which would potentially add 245 additional trees to the Significant Tree List if supported by the Tasmanian Planning Commission.

"A total of 22 representations were received from the community, both in support of and against the proposed update of the Significant Tree Register.

"Currently, there are 425 trees listed on Kingborough's Significant Tree Register.

"Once the process is finalised Council staff will meet with landowners of the proposed newly listed trees to provide them with advice in relation to their ongoing maintenance," Cr Wriedt said.

Transforming Kingston

Over the next few months a thoroughfare will be created from Goshawk Way to the Highway and the John Street roundabout will be upgraded.

Council is upgrading the Whitewater Creek walking and cycling tracks and will be delivering an underpass under the Huon Highway to safely connect Kingston Park to the wetlands and beyond for pedestrians and cyclists.

Kingborough Mayor, Paula Wriedt said she acknowledged the community's concerns for the loss of the trees to the entrance of Kingston.

"Future landscaping will include 61 native plantings including a small forest of sheoaks, as well as casuarinas, peppermints, blackwood, yellow paperbarks and banksias," Cr Wriedt said.

"The temporary loss of the leafy entrance is drastic now, but in order to upgrade the infrastructure in this area this tree removal is required.

"All these upgrades support the long-held community desire to have Kingston better connected, inviting people to stay, shop, and access services."

Marina's deep-vessel access

Major dredging works have been completed at Margate Marina, facilitating access for deep draft vessels approaching the fuel and pump-out pontoon.

The approaches are now a minimum depth of two metres at low tide.

In a media release on May 1, Margate Marina said the dredging was undertaken by Tasmanian contractors over a four-month period and involved the relocation of around 5500 cubic metres of material.

"This project enables safer and easier access to the marina's dual fuel and pump-out dock," said Margate Marina's spokesperson.

"The pump-out is the first outside the Derwent area." Partially funded by Marine and Safety Tasmania, the pump-out is a free service during the marina's office hours for all recreational vessels with compatible deck fittings.

The redevelopment work continues at the marina, following the completion of the first phase of floating pontoon berths in 2018.


In recent years the marina has expanded to provide 140 berths and the trailer storage area has increased in area to facilitate 50 per cent more craft.

Other recent projects have included an extension of the marina's attenuator/breakwater and a new laundry for live-aboard residents.

"The marina will continue to expand to the approved 300 berth total," noted Margate Marina's spokesperson.

"Demand for berths continues to strengthen given the marina's unique range of facilities and easy gateway access to the famous cruising waters of the D'Entrecasteaux Channel."
