## Firearms next door to school

Various members of the Margate Primary School community have come forward to speak with the *Kingborough Chronicle* regarding the sale of firearms next door to the school.

The public was made aware of the story following an article in the Mercury on April 4, titled *Teacher in shock as gun dealer will be selling firearms right next door to the local school*.

The *Kingborough Chronicle* published a letter received from the Mayor of Kingborough, Paula Wreidt on April 5.

Parent, Alice Parker wrote to the Commissioner of Police, Darren Hine, on April 14 and copied the three-page, detailed correspondence, including a clear map, to the Minister for Police, Jacquie Petrusma MP.

In her correspondence, Ms Parker noted, "if someone has a firearm dealer's licence, then they are able to accept surrendered firearms from the general public".

"There is every chance that someone could bring (the) firearms in their

vehicle, unregistered and very likely unsecured, with the intention of surrendering these," noted Ms Parker.

"Of course, it will be difficult for the proprietor to control the activity of those bringing items to his store" admitted the Commissioner of Police, in his reply of April 28.

"Due to the location of the premises, I have taken the additional step of placing a condition on the licence that firearms and ammunition leaving the premises are appropriately packaged to reduce any incidence of visual alarm to the community," wrote Mr Hine.

The *Kingborough Chronicle* has written to Minister for Police, Fire and Emergency Management, Jacquie Petrusma MP and Minister for Education, Children and Youth, Roger Jaensch MP regarding the situation and shall report further in the next edition.

The proprietor has also been contacted for comment.

## Budget for congestion

Labor member for Franklin Dean Winter said any hopes for faster congestion relief in the Kingston area had been dashed.

The State Budget was released last week, with the Altona Road Interchange and duplication of the Kingston bypass scheduled to be completed in 2027.

"Even if the Liberals were to deliver this important project on time, it would be five years away," Mr Winter said in a statement to the *Kingborough Chronicle* on Friday, May 27.

"Everyone in this area knows the existing roundabout can't cope with traffic now, let alone when hundreds of new homes are built in Huntingfield."

"The continued under-investment in the region south of Hobart is disappointing. This area is home to 10 per cent of the state's population," Mr Winter said.

## A new bridge with long lifespan

**Snug River has a new, locally made footbridge,  
providing access for all.**

Kingborough Mayor, Paula Wriedt said the old wooden  
bridge at the mouth of Snug River was built in 1997,  
with an expected life of around 20 years.

"We had that bridge inspected and an engineer's  
report recommended that the bridge be replaced,"  
noted Cr Wriedt, in media release on May 25.

"Council agreed to build a new bridge in this year's  
Capital Works budget for a cost of \$250,000.

"The new bridge has been locally made and is  
aluminium, giving it a life expectancy of 70 years.

"I understand that some community members would  
have preferred a replacement wooden bridge.

"However, with ongoing maintenance costs and the  
limited life expectancy of another wooden bridge, this  
was a better long term option.

"The wonderful part about the bridge is that it is  
totally accessible and DDA compliant, with its gradient  
making it easier to push a bicycle, pram or wheelchair  
across.

"It is made up of two, 20-metre spans also, which  
will allow better access underneath for small boats  
and kayaks.

"Later in the year a \$1.1 million upgrade to the Snug  
Tiers Road and footpath will be scheduled, as well as  
\$212,000 for new public amenities located at  
Kettering Oval.

## Huon Highway feedback

**The Tasmanian Government has released a  
summary report of consultation in August 2021 on  
proposed improvements on the Huon Highway  
between Kingston and Southport.**

Key themes raised included heavy vehicle traffic, turning  
lanes and road width, visibility, speed limits, traffic volumes,  
bus stop safety, pedestrian safety and parking.

### Leslie Road to Kingston

• Issues were raised regarding the condition of the  
road surface.

• Support was shown for a park and ride facility to  
be established, to ease traffic volumes heading north  
to Hobart city.

• The use of air brakes by trucks was identified as a  
noise issue by residents.

• Cyclists want cycleways to be considered in future  
planning.

### Sandfly to Leslie Road

• Many comments were made regarding safety con-  
cerns at the Leslie Road intersection.

• South-bound vehicles turning off to Leslie Vale are  
required to turn at the start of an overtaking lane.

• Animal protection and the prevention of roadkill

using virtual fencing is highly supported in this section  
of road.

### Huon Road to Sandfly

• Comments centred around the intersection with  
Krauses Road, and also the Sandfly intersection (with  
an upgrade currently underway).

• A merging lane takes place on a corner with inad-  
equate length.

• Poorly cambered corners are causing difficulties.

• Comments were made regarding blocked drains  
that were causing water to flow over the road surface,  
potentially leading to aquaplaning of vehicles.

In a media release on May 12, Minister for  
Infrastructure, Michael Ferguson MP said, "the feed-  
back will inform the development of the *Huon Highway  
Corridor Strategy - Kingston to Southport*".

"The next step will be to develop a prioritised list of  
road improvement projects that will improve safety  
and travel time reliability in the short term and plan for  
expected future needs," said Minister Ferguson.

# Local election law stalking horse

**Independent Member for Nelson Meg Webb has called on the Rockliff Government to consider additional parliamentary sitting days to debate proposed local government election reforms.**

"The proposal to change the voting method is new, was not part of the previous 2013 package of reforms and has not received public debate and scrutiny," Ms Webb said in a media release on May 30.

Ms Webb said, "it raises serious concerns the previously Liberal-blocked compulsory voting reform is being used as a stalking horse to introduce further changes which may be perceived as providing an electoral advantage to political parties contesting local council elections".

A *Local Government Amendment (Elections) Bill 2022* was tabled by the Minister for Local Government, Nic Street MP on May 24, seeking to introduce compulsory voting for this year's local government elections.

Member for Franklin, Dr Rosalie Woodruff MP has also expressed concerns the Elections Bill falls short of necessary legislative reforms.

"The Tasmanian Liberals' Bill to amend the Local Government Act to make voting at elections compulsory is a welcome support for longstanding Greens' policy to strengthen our democracy, however we are concerned other necessary legislative reforms needed before October's elections are also not included," wrote Dr Woodruff MP.

"Minister Street has ignored essential democratic amendments needed before the October elections, including one person one vote reforms, and changes to eligibility for voting on the General Manager's Roll.

"At a minimum, this bill should also include reforms to require a person to be Australian citizen to be eligible to vote, and to introduce caretaker provisions for local government elections.

"The Liberal Government's decision to hold off bringing the full suite of widely-supported Local Government reforms to Parliament until the conclusion of the Future of Local Government review is a backwards step for our democracy.

"It is remarkable that key proponents for this change include the Tasmanian Chamber for Industry and Commerce and the Property Council, but the Local Government Association Tasmania has expressed

concern at the lack of consultation with the sector."

The *Kingborough Chronicle* wrote to Minister Street with a series of questions on Wednesday, May 25, however, no response has been received.

### Local government elections loom

Local Government elections are expected to be conducted in October, with polls due to close on Tuesday, October 25.

In Tasmania, Local Government elections are fully conducted by postal ballot, with election material (including the ballot paper) mailed directly to each elector.

According to the Tasmanian Electoral Commission website, postal ballot packs should appear in letterboxes around two weeks following the announcement of

candidates standing in Local Government elections.

The Local Government Association Tasmania (LGAT) has published a Local Government election timeframe is as follows:

- A Notice of Election should appear on September 3.
- The Nomination Period for candidates will commence on September 5 and end on September 19.
- The Polling Period will take place from October 12 to 25.
- Closing Day is October 25.

For Kingborough, the expenditure limit for 2022 is expected to be \$18,000.

Expenditure limits are set by the *Local Government (General) Regulations 2015* and include all electoral advertising.

## Speaking publicly

**Kingston High students Hannah and Ruby Eddleston recently participated in a national public speaking competition.**

The Rostrum Voice of Youth is a national competition for secondary school students from Years 7 to 12, which has been running for 47 years.

Rostrum Australia is a national association of public speaking groups, first established in 1930.

My sister Ruby and I competed in the Southern Regional Final this year.

We were in the Senior Division, for students in Years 10-12. We were given a choice of five topics to prepare an 8-minute speech on.

The topics were *An Error of Judgement*, *Connection to Country*, *Spoilt for Choice*, *A Lesson That I Learned*, and *Changing the Narrative*.

I chose to speak on the topic *Changing the Narrative*, with a speech about how Jane Austen changed the narrative about men and women of her time through her novels.

Ruby spoke on the topic *Spoilt for Choice* with a speech about decision paralysis.

In our division of the Southern Regional Final there were nine competitors, split between two rooms.

Competitors were from The Friends' School, Elizabeth

College, Kingston High School, MacKillop College, St Michael's Collegiate, and Hobart College.

Ruby said, "This year I was a lot more prepared, I knew my speech by heart."

"I presented a speech in a way that the audience could enjoy and relate to."

Another component of the competition is a short notice or impromptu speech.

Competitors are given three topics, and 15-minutes to prepare a 3-minute speech on the topic of their choice.

I always find short notice terrifying. It is easy to reinforce the same point, without presenting different arguments to support your overall opinion.

Each room has a panel of three adjudicators who judge each speech and present the overall winner, and the encouragement award.

Ruby and I were in different rooms and were very proud to both receive the encouragement award.

"I was happy that I'd made an improvement on last year," remarked Ruby.

The Rostrum Voice of Youth competition is a great way to improve confidence and hear great speeches from your peers.

I would like to thank all involved.

I'm ready and excited for next year's competition!

## A fresh plunge for fresh food

**Kingston Neighbourhood House staff and volunteers will be among the swimmers taking part in the Winter Solstice Splash at Kingston Beach on Saturday, June 25.**

The group are taking a fresh plunge to raise funds for the emergency food relief charity Loaves and Fishes Tasmania.

Kingston Beach Surf Lifesaving Club will provide first aid, water safety and run a breakfast barbecue fundraiser.

In a media statement on May 11, Loaves and Fishes Tasmania noted Kingston Neighbourhood House is "one of 346 community agencies who receive free,

fresh produce, ready-to-eat meals and school breakfast supplies" from the registered charity.

Loaves and Fishes community partnerships manager Paul O'Rourke said more Tasmanians than ever before were seeking help.

"We have a waiting list of agencies wanting fresh produce and ready-to-eat meals," he said.

"Winter is the time when many Tasmanians have to choose between heating and eating.

"Loaves and Fishes has had to reduce services in some areas due to rising costs, and the Solstice Splash is an important event to restore these services and meet the ever-growing demand.

"Almost one-in-five Tasmanians rely on food support, with Loaves and Fishes supplying 65 per cent of emergency food relief in the state."

Solstice Splashers have to raise a minimum of \$50 for the privilege of taking a morning dip at Kingston Beach.

"Last year we had two entrants raise more than \$5000 each to help us fight hunger," Paul O'Rourke said.

"Plucka Duck and Bananas in Pyjamas took a dip, while a team of women sewed neck-to-knee costumes in a nod to the 1920s."

From swims being held around the Apple Island, Loaves and Fishes aim to raise \$50,000, equivalent to 100,000 hot meals, for Tasmanians doing it tough.

# Public invited to sharpen watchdog's teeth

**The Integrity Commission Tasmania are interested in hearing the public's views on the lobbying of elected representatives.**

Lobbyists seek to influence decision making on behalf of special interests, including influencing laws and policies, the granting of funding and awarding of contracts.

Integrity Tasmania wrote to the *Kingborough Chronicle* on May 19, regarding the launch of an 11-page consultation paper, titled *Have your say: Reforming oversight of lobbying in Tasmania*.

The consultation paper is accompanied by a 43-page research report, titled *Reforming oversight of lobbying in Tasmania*.

The Commission noted lobbying can be "a source of distrust in government when more powerful interests are seen to have the most influence", while oversight via "tools such as a publicly available lobbyist register, can be a way of increasing transparency and accountability".

There are currently a number of lobbying activities that are exempt from the *Tasmanian Government Lobbying Code of Conduct*.

The consultation paper contains questions and includes a summary of the major issues.

Questions for the public include:

- Should all Members of Parliament be included under the lobbying code of conduct?
- Should all public servants and bureaucrats be included or only those most senior?

- What activities, if any, should be exempt from the definition of lobbying?
- Does Tasmania need specific legislation to empower the Integrity?
- Commission to provide compliance measures?
- Should lobbyists be prohibited from giving gifts to people who are lobbied?
- Should registerable lobbying activity be triggered by one communication only?
- What sort of contacts, communications or other actions should be included as lobbying activities?
- Should the regulatory system include only third-party lobbyists or be extended to include in-house and other lobbyists?
- Should receiving or paying success fees be prohibited?
- Would disclosures be more likely or reliable if they were made by government representatives rather than lobbyists?
- Should public officers disclose diaries or other information disclosing communications with lobbyists?
- How long should the 'cooling off' period be before public officers can become lobbyists?
- What information should be disclosed on an online register?
- Should public officers disclose diaries or other information disclosing communications with lobbyists?

Integrity Commission Chief Commissioner Greg Melick said the Commission hopes to hear from "anyone who has an interest in this vital democratic process". "It is the perfect time for this review, as responsibility for administering the existing Tasmanian Lobbyist Register and the associated Lobbying Code of

Conduct will transfer from the Department of Premier and Cabinet to the Integrity Commission in July this year," Mr Melick said.

"The Tasmanian community needs to have confidence that public administration and government decisions are made fairly, transparently, and in the public interest."

"The submissions we receive will inform recommendations to improve accountability of lobbying practices and associated decision-making within Tasmania."

"Effective regulation increases confidence that no particular individuals or groups exercise undue influence over government."

"It sits alongside a full research report for those interested in understanding how lobbying, and lobbying regulation, works in Tasmania, across Australia, and internationally."

# A 30-year growth plan

**A 30-Year Greater Hobart Plan, developed by the Greater Hobart Committee was released on May 9 for public consultation.**

The plan covers the four cities of Hobart, Kingston, Clarence and Glenorchy and prioritises infill development.

The proposed strategy for growth and change includes 30,000 additional dwellings within the metropolitan area over 30 years, to cater for an expected additional 60,000 people.

In Kingborough, the document proposes primarily infill in and around the Kingston CBD, greenfield development at Huntingfield, and a mix of infill and greenfield development in already identified future growth areas at Margate and Snug.

The proposed strategy across the Greater Hobart includes:

- a compact city while protecting character and heritage;
- ensuring growth complements the city's natural setting;
- prioritising infill development and urban consolidation;
- modest increases in housing densities within inner urban metropolitan areas;
- encouraging urban renewal of underutilised land;
- promoting choice through a greater diverse and affordable housing mix;
- supporting innovative and quality design solutions to meet community needs;

- prioritising urban consolidation to create a more walkable and accessible compact city;
- encouraging medium-density developments within new and existing southern Tasmanian neighbourhoods;
- unlocking land suitable for development and help build emerging communities;
- protecting environmental values and accommodate future climate change impacts;
- reducing environmental impact and increase renewable energy use;
- increasing density to increase efficiencies and greater social and economic interaction;
- encouraging investment for urban renewal and redevelopment of underutilised parcels; and
- encouraging more mixing of residential and commercial zones to increase interactions between people and business.



# Check for charity registration

As the temperature drops and the cost of living continues to rise, locals are reminded to be alert to groups masquerading as charities.

Senator Catryna Bilyk is reminding locals to "exercise vigilance so they know the money they donate is being put to good use".

Senator Bilyk said that while there are no laws against donating to organisations that aren't registered charities, donating to registered charities is a good way to ensure you are maximising the impact of your donation.

"The amount of charity fundraising that takes place in Kingborough shows that residents are extremely generous when it comes to supporting good causes," noted Senator Bilyk.

"By registering as a charity, an organisation commits to certain obligations, in the knowledge they can be deregistered if they don't meet their obligations.

"These include adhering to certain governance standards, reporting their finances and activities annually to the ACNC, and directing the funds they receive towards the

charitable purpose for which they were established.

"Another red flag that an organisation is not a genuine charity is its governance structure," continued Senator Bilyk.

"Registered charities must be either incorporated associations or public companies limited by guarantee.

"These structures provide the kind of financial transparency that you just cannot get from entities like a sole trader or partnership."

To check if an organisation seeking donations is a genuine charity, visit the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission (ACNC) online at [acnc.gov.au](http://acnc.gov.au) or call 13 22 62.

If a registered charity is not meeting its charitable obligations, it can be reported to the ACNC.

To check an organisation's governance structure, visit the Australian Business Register at [abr.business.gov.au](http://abr.business.gov.au)

If an organisation engages in misleading or deceptive conduct or other breaches of Australian consumer law, it can be reported to the Australian Competition and Consumer Commission.
