

Local school staff join strike action

Illawarra Primary School teachers and support staff, members of the Australian Education Union (AEU), stopped work on Thursday morning, August 25, drawing a line for better working conditions and improved student learning conditions.

The Blackmans Bay school teachers and staff are among the increasing numbers of Tasmanian school employees who have taken strike action in recent weeks, to send a loud message the State Government.

Protest placards held by staff outside Illawarra Primary read, "More teachers", "More in-class support", "More school psychologists", "Value our teachers" and "Pay my mum more money".

In a media release on August 25, the AEU stated, "Threats by the Rockliff Government to walk away entirely from negotiations has further angered Australian Education Union members as more schools stop work for respect."

"Union members at Illawarra Primary on Thursday morning stepped out of the classroom to strike for better working conditions and student learning conditions.

"The stop work action follows several recent school walkouts around the state, as the Rockliff Government continues ignoring educators and their Lifelong Learning solutions which were presented to the Government 14 months ago.

In the AEU's statement, Illawarra Primary educator and AEU Rep Nanna Jansen-Munday said AEU members had grown fed up with the State Government "which doesn't seem to take education seriously".

"This Government lacks respect for educators and certainly doesn't support the growth and learning we expect for our students," she said.

"So, it's time for action.

"It's not something we do lightly, but we cannot sit by and continue to watch our valued public education system be neglected.

"We won't be quiet.

"We won't go away.

"Enough is enough."

Workplace Representative Terri Coombes concurred, "We are taking action today because we have decided we are not going to take it anymore".

"Educators are exhausted, stressed and cannot manage their workloads," said Terri Coombes.

"We are simply being asked to do too much.

"The worst part is we feel we are letting our students down."

AEU Tasmania President David Genford said, "We expect the Government to negotiate in good faith so we can achieve the outcomes needed to lift learning for all students".

"Threats to cease union negotiations wouldn't hinder stop-work action as passionate Tasmanian educators seek much needed education reform," Mr Genford said.

"Until that is achieved, educators across the state will continue to act in the interests of their students, which is to improve our education system."

The *Kingborough Chronicle* sent six questions to the Education Minister on August 18, regarding work and learning conditions in Kingborough schools, after stop-work action began in the north of the State.

Clash on Southern Outlet

Three properties are to be acquired as part of the Tasmanian Government's proposed transit lane on the Southern Outlet in Dynnyme.

In a media release on August 25, Minister for Infrastructure and Transport, Michael Ferguson MP confirmed the three "full property acquisitions" and said, "a further four properties will be subject to some land acquisition".

"I can confirm that only three full property acquisitions are required, all of which have now been achieved on a voluntary basis through negotiation by agreement with the vendors," stated Minister Ferguson.

"There have been no compulsory acquisitions.

"We had more people wanting to have the Government purchase properties than were needed.

"A further four properties will be subject to some land acquisition in the usual way, which will be partial land only, and that process is well underway."

However, Meg Smith the spokesperson for SOSHobart2021, representing a group of affected residents in Dynnyme, disputed claims made in the Minister's media release and said the statement had offended the residents.

"Most offensive is Ferguson's claim that more residents wanted to sell properties than the government needed," said Meg Smith.

"For months, households had been consistently told their homes were doomed, they had to leave, and there was no alternative.

"Promises were made to residents that were later, abruptly, reneged on, with no explanation.

"Residents have lost time, resources and money because of this.

"Before this process began, no one on this street wanted to sell their homes.

"Voluntary assumes free will, there has been nothing voluntary in this process.

"The release misrepresents the facts on the community consultation process and his assertion that his project is a practical solution to Hobart's traffic congestion.

"Ferguson's claim of community support is presumably based on 511 responses to State Growth's online survey, meanwhile ignoring over 2500 Tasmanians who signed the Parliamentary petition against the project."

Ferguson claims his goal has always been to minimise home loss, yet, as directly affected residents, this is not our experience.

Most offensive is Ferguson's claim that more residents wanted to sell properties than the government needed.

For months, households had been consistently told their homes were doomed, they had to leave, and there was no alternative.

Promises were made to residents that were later, abruptly, reneged on, with no explanation.

Residents have lost time, resources and money because of this.

Before this process began, no one on this street wanted to sell their homes.

Voluntary assumes free will, there has been nothing voluntary in this process.

It appears that Ferguson has been fixated on making his political mark, attempted to demonise our community and play us against communities in Kingston, the Channel and Huon Valley.

The truth is, this is a complex and interconnected problem, requiring adult conversations and integrated solutions.

Something, it seems, outside the realm of the Minister or State Growth.

Questions for the Minister on schools

The *Kingborough Chronicle* asked Minister Roger Jaensch:

- “What is the teacher shortage in Kingborough, the Huon Valley and Hobart at present?
- “How many teachers have left the profession in Tasmania in the last 5 years?
- “Why does Tasmania have the lowest paid teacher workforce nationally?
- “Why are teachers performing administrative tasks beyond the scope of teaching, in addition to teaching?
- “Why is pastoral care work in schools performed by general teaching staff, rather than psychologists, counsellors or educators with psychology qualifications?
- “How can teachers concentrate on teaching and providing individual learning support, when they are required to do so many additional tasks? How does this impact Tasmanian students and the community?”

Minister Jaensch did not specifically respond to any question, however a Department of Education spokesperson provided the following response on August 19.

“The Tasmanian Government and the Department of Education are committed to supporting our highly valued teaching and education workforce, all of whom are vitally important in improving educational outcomes for our students,” stated the spokesperson.

“We continue to deliver on our strong commitment to build a workforce of talented people, capable of delivering outstanding outcomes for every learner.

“Since 2014, the Tasmanian Government’s investment has resulted in the employment of an additional 435 FTE Teachers and 421 Teacher assistants (including Education Support Specialists).

“In terms of one example of investing additional resources, the Department understands that there is high demand for professional support staff across our schools, which is why this Government has:

- put in place a Professional Support Staff permanent relief pool in 2021 to triage, prioritise and respond to student and school need;
- provided a further \$3.8 million in the 2022/23 State Budget for an additional eight psychologists and eight social workers; and
- increased Professional Support Staff and School Health Nurses by 100 positions since 2014.”

A Department of Education spokesperson provided the following additional response on August 25.

“Where pastoral care sessions are timetabled, it forms part of the teacher’s instructional load,” stated the spokesperson.

“The key focus for our teachers is delivering learning outcomes for our students.

“One of the goals outlined in the Department of Education’s Strategic Plan, is Wellbeing for Learning which recognises the importance of students feeling safe and supported, and are able to flourish, so that they can engage in learning.

“The Department of Education has invested in additional

professional support staff, such as School Psychologists, School Social Workers, Speech and Language Pathologists and School Health Nurses, to provide health and wellbeing support for our students.

“There are also a range of non-school support teams that provide assistance to schools around student wellbeing, including the Inclusive Practice Team, Student Engagement and Attendance Team and Interagency Student Support Team.

“Each Tasmanian Government school has an established Support and Wellbeing Team, that support the wellbeing of all students, with a particular focus on those students with diverse and complex needs requiring coordinated support.

“These teams include staff with a broad range of expertise including school leadership, professional support staff, support teachers, school health nurses, teachers and other school-based staff, depending on the school’s context and staffing profile.

“Therapeutic support for students is provided by professional support staff.

“All staff in Tasmanian Government schools support the health and wellbeing of their students through building trusted relationships, knowing their students and understanding their needs. Information such as data from the annual Student Wellbeing and Engagement Survey helps schools to understand their student’s wellbeing needs better and respond to these,” continued the spokesperson.

“Student wellbeing is also supported through the delivery of the Australian Curriculum, through the Personal and Social Capability which is addressed in all learning areas and at every stage of a student’s schooling.

“A National Teacher Workforce Action Plan will be developed to address the national challenges of teacher demand, supply and retention.

“The Tasmanian Government and the Department of Education are committed to supporting our highly valued teaching and education workforce.

“Discussions to continue negotiations are occurring, however it’s not possible to continue with good faith negotiations while industrial action is underway.”



Three homes to go for fifth lane

In his statement, Minister Ferguson claimed “the only real solution” to ease traffic congestion on the Southern Outlet was a transit lane.

“Our Government is now moving forward with planning for the transit lane”, Minister Ferguson said.

“Additional consultation will occur with property owners on Macquarie Street who will be impacted by the loss of on-street parking for the extra lane that will continue from the Outlet, an extra lane through the bottleneck and down into Macquarie Street.

“Feedback on the designs for the transit lane on the Southern Outlet and Macquarie and Davey Streets indicated broad support for the project, particularly the need to incentivise bus travel and improve traffic flow in Macquarie Street.”

Minister Ferguson said, the State Government is “investing more than \$200 million into the Greater Hobart Traffic Solution for initiatives to manage peak commuter demand”.

“A key focus of these initiatives is to provide Hobart commuters with choice – private vehicles or improved public transport options and greater travel time reliability.”

Meg Smith said, “The truth is, this is a complex and interconnected problem.”

“The Minister claims to promote public transport / park-and-ride yet provides paltry infrastructure to support these services being effective, long-term solutions for commuters.”

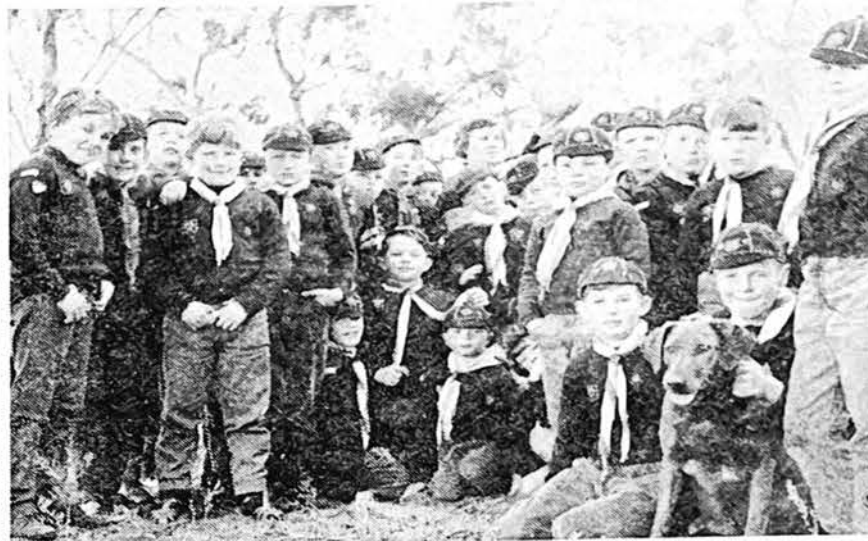

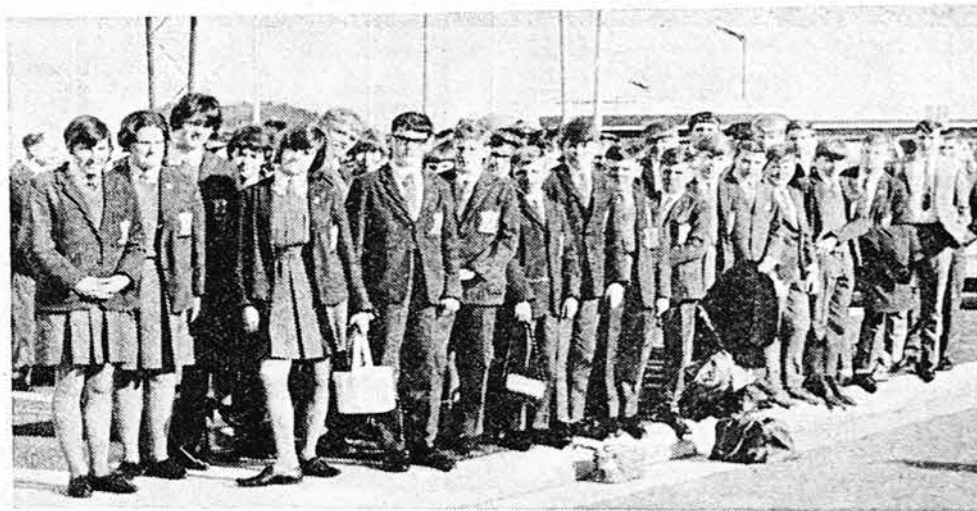

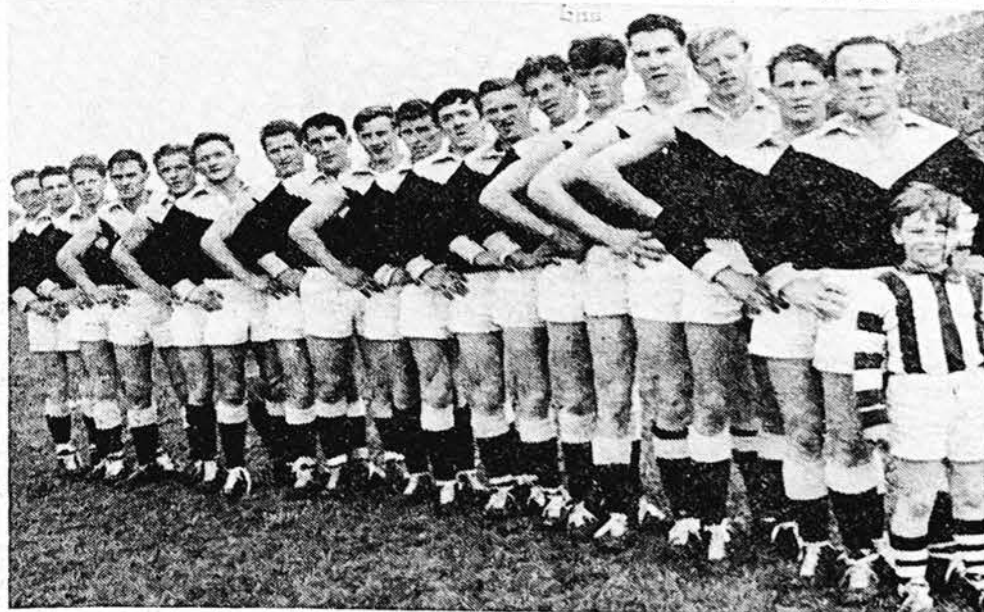
