

War memorial for Kingston Beach

Kingborough Council is currently seeking community feedback, on behalf of the Kingston Beach RSL Sub Branch, for a new war memorial at Kingston Beach.

Mayor of Kingborough, Cr Paula Wriedt said Kingston Beach RSL Sub Branch wanted to update the current memorial to better acknowledge the sacrifices of those who suffered and lost their lives in war.

"The proposed new memorial will be located on the same site of the Gallipoli marker which sits across the road from the Salty Dog at Kingston Beach," Cr Wriedt said.

"This is the location where services are currently held. The current Kingston War Memorial on the corner of Channel Highway and Freeman Street is not a suitable location to conduct large services.

"Large numbers of people now attend commemorative events and the area needs to be more accessible.

"The new memorial is proposed for Kingston Beach which has better access for all.

"The Kingston Beach RSL Sub Branch is proposing two options for the replacement and they want to hear which one the community prefers.

"Council is hosting the survey and will feed back the results by the end of October 2022."

Kingston Beach RSL Sub Branch Secretary, David Taylor said the two bronze plaques from the existing Gallipoli marker would be relocated onto the base of the new memorial.

"2023 will mark the 50th year of the last Australian personnel to leave Vietnam after the war," Mr Taylor said.

"The Kingston Beach RSL Sub Branch thinks it is very important to have the war memorial dedicated in this year."

Mayor Wriedt said Council had agreed to conduct the public engagement with the RSL, agreeing to pay for the design and construction of the memorial at Kingston Beach.

The Council survey will be open until October 26.

The proposed options are:

1. Sandstone Panels:

- The structure consists of three sandstone panels.
- 1.5m high, approximately 2m wide with black granite service badges inset into them (420mm x 420mm each).

2. Obelisk:

- Polished black and grey granite.
- 3.38m high.
- With three service badges engraved on three sides of the lower back section.

50 Year Anniversary

1972 - 2022

Kingston High School's Aboriginal focus

Brenda Hodge and her family have had an extensive association with Kingston High School, starting before her daughter Trisha commenced in Grade Seven in 1995 and her son Eddi started in 1999.

Brenda and other indigenous parents, particularly Maree and Ian Langford, were instrumental in applying for Aboriginal Student Support and Parent Awareness (ASSPA) funding for the school community.

The Langford family involvement started before ASSPA, with Maree and Ian both having been students

at Kingston High.

ASSPA focussed on Aboriginal issues at Kingston High School from 1993 until the withdrawal of government funding in 2004.

During this time, ASSPA developed strategies to attain social justice, worked hard to increase the role of parents of indigenous students within the school and worked to create equal opportunities for these families.

It also had the broader task of creating opportunities for the non-indigenous students to appreciate the value

of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander cultures.

The creation of the Reconciliation Garden at the old Kingston High School Site in 1998 and its relocation to the new school site; the establishment of a Homework Centre at the school for both high school indigenous children and children from feeder primary schools and the Reconciliation Day March of 2002 are examples of the way the ASSPA families worked within the school and the broader Kingborough community.

Brenda remembers Eve Mills creating a cluster between Woodbridge District High School and Kingston High School so that indigenous students could travel to Flinders Island, Melbourne and the Coorong.

These tours had cultural importance and were valuable opportunities for the young people to learn about Country.

ASSPA evolved into the Aboriginal Education strategies of the Department of Education in Tasmania.

A significant focus was on teaching teachers to work in culturally appropriate ways to maximise the learning outcomes of indigenous students.

Aboriginal Education Officers became a normal part of school support strategies offering opportunities for cultural learning, work placement and the creation of links for young people within their community.

Brenda's daughter Trisha has established Nita Education.

Nita means "brother", and Trisha is an educational consultant working with schools and businesses who wish to learn to be more culturally aware.

Brenda is proud of Trisha's work, not only for her own initiative in establishing Nita, but for continuing the focus that parents of indigenous students have pursued since before the ASSPA days of the 1990's.

Our experience with the proposed route of the Margate to Huntingfield shared pathway has shown us that in the past promises can be one thing, performance another.

We found out through the media that one version of the pathway would traverse the length of our property, Inverawe Native Gardens.

This would involve the loss of hundreds of native trees and shrubs, which we planted over the past 20 years.

We have lived with this threat for the past several years.

110 species of birds have been seen at Inverawe and a good few of those call it home, not forgetting pademelons, possums, bandicoots and others.

An alternative route has been suggested by other consultants, who actually visited Inverawe (boots on the ground).

That report is likely to be released for public consultation, soon.

Our people make all the difference

With all the challenges COVID-19 has thrown at Tasmania's residential aged care sector, OneCare's Natalie Neilson has a simple response when asked what helped the Tasmanian-owned, not-for-profit provider get through a one in a generation pandemic.

"Our people, they made all the difference," Natalie said.

Ms Neilson, who is OneCare's Executive Manager People and Systems, said she could remember a point during the height of COVID that exemplified the spirit of OneCare's people when faced with the immense challenges of lockdowns and infection control in a highly vulnerable care setting.

"I was at one of our facilities where we were locked down and adhering to Public Health advice.

"Our staff were under as much pressure as I'd ever seen, anyone with so much as a sniffle, or who had been in close-contact with anyone even suspected of being a case couldn't come to work.

"It made resourcing our operations extremely difficult.

"It was late, and I saw one of our staff preparing to finish her shift and head home.

"I knew she'd already had a big week, had temporarily moved out of her own home, and was staying with friends because her partner and one of her children had developed symptoms.

"I asked her how she was going?

"She managed a smile and told me she was okay, and we had the conversation about how we couldn't wait for all of 'this' to be over and get back to normal life, which was a fairly common conversation among staff," Ms Neilson said.

"She was just about to leave when another staff member called to say we'd probably have to cancel one of the COVID-safe activities we'd organised for residents the next day because with all the short-term sick leave, we hadn't been able to get the room set up.

"The woman smiled again, stood up, and slipped off her jacket.

"I asked her what she was doing because she was due to head home.

"She told me she was going to set up the room because the residents didn't deserve for COVID to take it away from them, and with that, she headed off to set up the room.

"From all accounts, the next day the residents had a ball at their activities.

"It's just one simple example but it demonstrated to

me just how dedicated our people are to our residents, even when the chips were down and we were all having to deal with the added layers of difficulty COVID was placing on us, not just as a single provider, but as

a sector as a whole.

"To me it highlighted in a real-life sense how our staff are dedicated to giving residents all that they can and helping in any way to enhance their lives."

Ms Neilson said OneCare valued its employees, their diversity, and their different talents, with every single one sharing the organisation's commitment to put their residents' needs first.

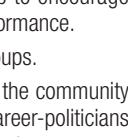

"Improved facilities at the venue will be utilised by all levels of players, from grassroots to the elite level, helping to boost participation in the sport.

"The project also received funding from our Government's Levelling the Playing Field grant program and Kingborough Council," said Mr Street.

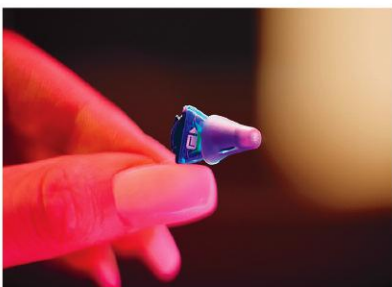

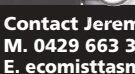

Sport clubs send message to Council

Eighteen Kingborough sports clubs, representing 2802 junior and senior players, have submitted a joint letter asking the Council to reconsider its new ground user fees policy.

The new fees policy was passed by Councillors on May 16 and means clubs will for the first time be charged hourly fees to use grounds.

At the end of Stage 1 the hourly fee rises to \$15 per hour.

As a result, Council will raise \$100,920 per year from Kingborough's cricket, athletics, soccer clubs and junior footy clubs.

Further, Council's report into fees states "Over the

long-term it would be reasonable to estimate that \$220,000 of new revenue could be generated from sport ground user fees in Kingborough".

The joint letter submitted Thursday, September 29, is a result of a meeting facilitated by Kettering Cricket Club Vice-President, Kaspar Deane on July 27.

"The meeting we held in July made it clear that clubs felt left out of Council's decision to start charging hourly fees," said Mr Deane.

"What was also clear was that clubs are open to a sensible fee-structure that contributes to the maintenance of our grounds.

"Clubs feel that a fixed seasonal fee is the way to go

rather than an hourly fee."

Mayor of Kingborough, Cr Paula Wriedt said if re-elected she would be more than willing to meet the sporting clubs to hear their points of view.

Cr Wriedt said she would try to pull together meetings either by the end of the year or by early next year.

"I've got an open-door policy when it comes to meeting with any organisations or individuals to talk about Council decisions that affect them," Ms Wriedt said.

"The current Council decision will not come into effect until July next year, so there's plenty of time to deal with this."

The joint letter highlights clubs' concerns that the hourly fee doesn't offer a concession for hire involving juniors as is common practice among other fee-charging Councils.

Clubs also point out that any new fees will likely result in higher registration fees for players which will risk participation in sport in Kingborough.

"Cost of living is a major issue right now," said Mr Deane.

"Council needs to be especially careful to not

impose any further barriers to sport participation.

"That's why this letter calls on Council to sit down with clubs and work with us to develop a sensible fee structure that works for everyone," said Mr Deane.
