

Bumpy start for Huntingfield Park and Ride

Concerns have been raised regarding the design of shelters at the brand-new Park and Ride Facility in Huntingfield.

According to Franklin MP David O'Byrne, a glaring design flaw has seen riders and seats of the newly developed Park and Ride facility exposed to wind and rain.

"One of the most important parts of any park and ride facility is that commuters have somewhere to wait that is out of the wind and rain," said Mr O'Byrne.

"These shelters fail this task miserably."

Minister for Infrastructure and Transport, Michael Ferguson countered in a statement, saying that he had, "Asked the Department of State Growth to look at improvement options".

"The reason I have done this is to support our community with better infrastructure and to support public transport.

"The new facility is part of our commitment to offering the people of Hobart's southern suburbs real transport choice in their daily commute."

The newly opened Huntingfield Park and Ride provides parking for 174 vehicles, including motorcycle and accessible bays.

It offers undercover seating for 30 passengers, modern amenities block with baby change facilities and secure storage for 26 bicycles, and a quick drop-off lane.

MP O'Byrne says he has been "inundated" by complaints from commuters regarding the efficacy of the shelters.

"It only took one southerly weather pattern for this glaring design flaw to be exposed," O'Byrne continued.

"If a bus shelter doesn't provide shelter, what do you call it?"

During question time in Parliament on Wednesday, October 19, Minister Ferguson responded, "I am aware of the negativity from the Member from Franklin, who should be celebrating this because it is something he could not be bothered doing for his local community when he was in my job."

In a media release David O'Byrne reiterated the communities' concerns.

"This government need to be doing everything they can to encourage people to use public transport more, particular in the Kingborough region which continues to be impacted by traffic congestion."

Margate to Huntingfield Pathway Consultation

Public consultation on a feasibility study for a proposed shared pathway from Margate to Huntingfield is beginning on Wednesday, October 26.

Mayor Of Kingborough, Cr Paula Wriedt said the Department of State Growth were conducting the community consultation on the shared pathway through an interactive map and email.

“The community have told me on many occasions that they would like to see greater access to safer, connected pathways throughout Kingborough,” Cr Wriedt said.

“Though at the moment this proposed pathway is not funded, and will come at a significant cost, it is important that we develop a good understanding for what the community wants before investigating funding options.

“Improving alternative transport options and providing safer means for community members travelling to and from Margate is an important investment in our community’s future.

“Tracks and trails are in the top five most important things identified by the Kingborough community in our budget consultations earlier this year, and this path has previously been identified as a priority within Council’s Cycling Strategy.

“The consultation is designed to allow community members to provide feedback on the proposed design as well as the suggested route.

Tinker time at the Kingborough Community Hub

Scott Gibson from Gowrie Training and Consultancy recently delivered two free workshops (Woodwork and Tinkering) at the Kingborough Community Hub thanks to funding provided through the Tasmanian Government's Premier's Fund for Children and Young People.

"These workshops were aimed at engaging local school-age children in hands-on experiences to build confidence and have an outlet for their creative pursuits whilst accessing real tools," Mr Gibson said.

During the Woodworking Workshop children were provided with access to a wide range of timber offcuts and tools including hammers, hand drills, marking out tools and hardware.

Mr Gibson reported that, "The sound of hammering echoed throughout the Kingborough Hub space as they instantly engaged in constructing and creating their work, with many children spending up to two hours on their creations."

Mayor of Kingborough, Cr Paula Wriedt said a lot of imagination and concentration was going into each participant's creation.

"I could see some excellent wooden inventions and a lot of pride in every design," Cr Wriedt said.

At the Tinkering Workshop the children pulled apart a range of pre-used electronic items including old desktop computers, clock radios, phones, keyboards, and gaming controllers to explore their inner workings, then reconstructed pieces into their own creations.

Children used screwdrivers, pliers, wire cutters, drills, hammers, and hot glue guns to create a fantastic array of creatures, vehicles and robots.

Throughout these workshops children developed new skills and built on previous learning.

They developed creativity and critical thinking skills whilst collaborating with each other and formed connections with other children from the community.

The workshops also highlighted the capabilities of

school-age children in performing complex tasks with what some may see as potentially dangerous items.

This was the first round of free workshops by Gowrie Training and Consultancy.

The next round will take place in the January 2023 school holidays with another two-hour Woodworking

and Tinkering Workshop offered at the Kingborough Hub, and a half day Pop-up Loose Parts Play Session taking place at Dru-Point Reserve.

These events will be advertised early in the new year through the Kingborough Council's Facebook page and other social media outlets.

Achievement and growth for every student, every day

'How do we meet the learning needs of every student to ensure agency and growth?'

This central question drives the work of our school in 2022. Our expert teaching team engage in cycles of inquiry to improve their practice and build the collective efficacy of their teaching teams.

We are better together and we strive to have all teachers doing what the very best do.

Our team are specialists in their field; all our Maths teachers are Maths specialists; all our English teachers are English specialists, all our Music teachers are Music specialists, and so on.

We are a community of learners and learning is for all. The Kingston High School leadership team members are seconded to the Harvard Graduate School of Education as facilitators in their Principal Leadership programs.

We have experts in ways of being with young people - Youth Mental Health First Aid, Trauma-informed Practice, Restorative Justice accreditations.

Staff have PhDs, Masters, and Graduate Certificates in Leadership, Inclusive Practice and Trauma, and awards for outstanding leadership (ACEL) and literacy practice (DoE).

Kingston High School has Teach for Australia graduates and teachers with international school experience. Our practice has been the focus of a UTAS case study into quality inclusive practices and our teaching of writing is used as examples of high-quality practice across Department of Education Schools.

Staff are arts practitioners, writers, athletes, adventurers, chefs, furniture designers - diverse, engaged and empathic role models for our students.

This foundation of teaching excellence is the catalyst for our achievement and growth as a school.

We pride ourselves on the breadth of talent we nurture

and develop, and that achievement and growth is celebrated in its many forms.

In measures that track our progress as a school, Kingston High School's 2022 NAPLAN data is a cause for celebration.

For example, both Grade 7 and Grade 9 students are achieving above Australia in reading in three key areas:

- More students at KHS are reading at or above the minimum standard - we are closing the gap for our most struggling readers!
- More students at KHS are reading at the top 3 levels (Bands) - we are raising the bar for our highest performing readers!
- Our students average score (mean score) is higher - we are making a difference for our whole cohort!

Wellbeing, sports and outdoor education

The mental health, social and academic challenges faced by our young people over the last few years of living with COVID has elevated the importance of developing healthy, active habits as part of lifelong wellbeing.

We have risen to meet this need for our students.

One of the most celebrated outcomes of this revitalization is that students, who may not have found their place within a sport or wellbeing activity in the past, are finding connections in their teen years to healthy activity for maybe the first time.

There are amazing personal journeys, such as one student who had never been involved in any sport up until Grade 8 and now, in Grade 9, is currently representing Tasmania in Volleyball Nationals.

Sport and physical activity in our school is for all - not just those on elite pathways.

Our school's pursuit of sport and wellbeing excellence has seen three important partnerships develop that provide a first-class experience for our students.

Our collaboration with Kingborough Sports Stadium provides access to first class facilities every day, including

courts, ovals, the fitness centre and gym.

We have current formal agreements with both the Tasmania Jack Jumpers and Kingborough Lions United Football Club that provide opportunities for specialist coaching, learning alongside professional physiotherapists and strength and conditioning coaches, sports management and administration internships, and training sessions with athletes.

Outdoor Education and Leadership has a strong research base that confirms the impact of these experiences on the learning of students across all areas of the curriculum.

These outdoor environments demand cooperation, supported risk taking, leadership, problem-solving, stepping outside our comfort-zone and pushing through our own perceived limits.

Our students engage in coaststeering, rock climbing, mountain biking, caving, rafting, bushwalking, search and rescue, kayaking, orienteering, expedition planning, first aid and many other activities across a Grade 8-12 pathway.

Future-proofing our learning

Our vision is to create the learning conditions to ensure we nurture young citizens who are individually and collectively empowered to lead personally, socially and environmentally healthy futures.

We know that developing creative and critical thinkers through inquiry learning is amongst the most prized outcomes of education.

At Kingston High School we strategically and explicitly build the skills of inquiry through our curriculum.

In our Junior School, students engage each term in inter-disciplinary learning that pulls the 'big ideas' of the disciplines together into real-world inquiry projects.

For example:

- In our 'Enjoy or Destroy' inquiry, students evaluate the tourism ventures that engage with Tasmanian landscapes and landforms - Tasman Peninsular, Hastings Caves, Mount Field, kunanyi/Mt Wellington. Students consider environmental, economic, aesthetic, and cultural implications and then demonstrate their understanding by justifying a proposed new Tasmanian tourism venture.
- In our 'How will I know if my business will sink or swim?' inquiry, students create their own business from the ground up. They investigate the evolution and chem-

istry of packaging products over time and demonstrate their learning on a community Market Day where there are profits to be made!

• 'How can we take action for a fairer world?' allows students to take action on a social justice cause close to their hearts, particularly around issues of inclusion, belonging, valuing diversity and cultivating empathy. Our Action Day invites other schools and families along for an interactive day of student agency!

In our 9-12 ARC program, students can opt to build on their personal inquiry passions and interests to revolutionise the way traditional curriculum is delivered.

While students in ARC are taught and assessed against the Australian Curriculum or TASC, this curriculum delivery is driven by their individual inquiry projects.

Students in ARC also learn through internships in workplaces or with other education providers (such as UTAS) here in Hobart, across the State and, at times, interstate.

Teachers work as learning advisors in close partnership with families on each individual student's Learning Plan and students share their progress through portfolios and exhibitions of learning to their families.



HARTZ COLLECTIVE

Working together in our Hartz Collective, Years 11 & 12

At the heart of the Hartz Collective is a strong sense of shared purpose to provide a choice of pathway for every young person in the Hartz region that is inspiring, personalised, supportive and aspirational.

The Principals of the six schools comprising the Hartz Collective - Kingston High School, Taroona High School, Hobart College, Dover District School, Huonville High School and Woodbridge School - understand that in 2022 we serve a diverse population of young people, who require a range of possibilities that are accessible, meaningful, relevant but also adaptable to changing needs in a changing global environment.

These two key factors - pathways and diversity - have brought us together, knowing that we are greater than the sum of our parts.

Each of our campuses has a unique context, where a degree of specialisation and focus allows us to provide our students with not only a universal curriculum but also

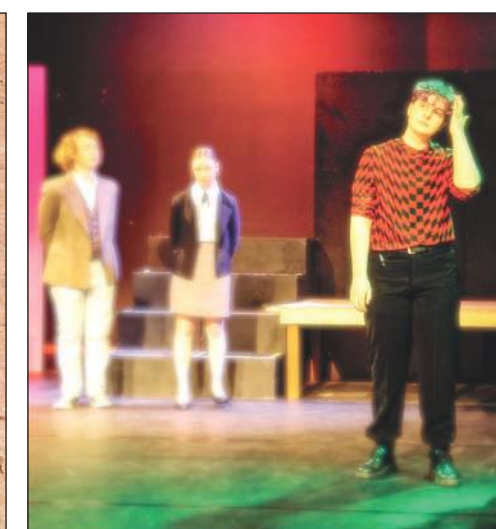
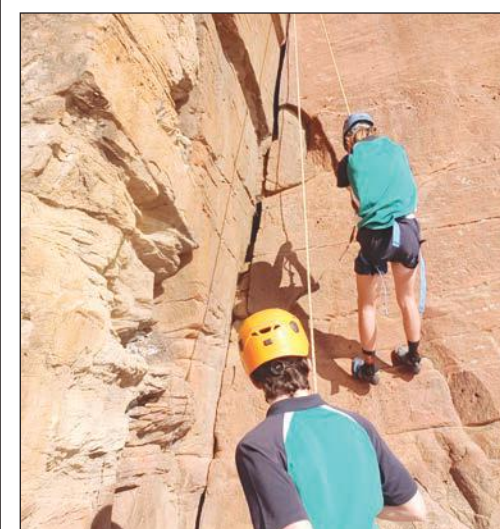
powerful points of difference in our facilities and course offerings.

Each campus has a wealth of partnerships with external resources enabling a 'value-add' to the learning experience of our young people.

Shared enrolments within the Hartz Collective provide an avenue for students to access specific learning programs that are offered by individual schools.

This may allow students to benefit from specialist facilities, such as the Marine Discovery Centre at Woodbridge School, the Trade Training Centre at Huonville High School, Taroona High School's University of Tasmania campus or the Kingborough Sports Centre at Kingston High School.

At Kingston High there are three pathways for students to study Years 11-12: Sport and Wellbeing, Student Directed Inquiry and Internship, and Individual (personalised) Enrolment.



Connecting our Kingborough kids

We continue to evolve based on the preferred futures and identified needs of our given cohort of students.

In 2021, we introduced the Hands on Learning Program that provided greater scope for students to engage in simulated workplace environments, learning valuable employability skills.

This rigorous learning program puts students alongside artisan teachers, such as chefs and horticulturalists.

We currently run two branches - Café and Construction - which have a point of connection through the development of our 24 Carrot Kitchen Garden in partnership with MONA.

This project continues from the planning into the implementation phase in 2023, where we look forward to paddock-to-plate hospitality experiences, and horticulture and gardening pathways.

We work closely with the PCYC providing opportunities for students to gain a range of qualifications from industry White Cards to First Aid certificates.

We also partner with local Kingborough Church groups who support our Breakfast Club, and Strength and Shine wellbeing programs within the school.

We foster an environment where 'our kids' belong to and build connection with our wider Kingborough community.

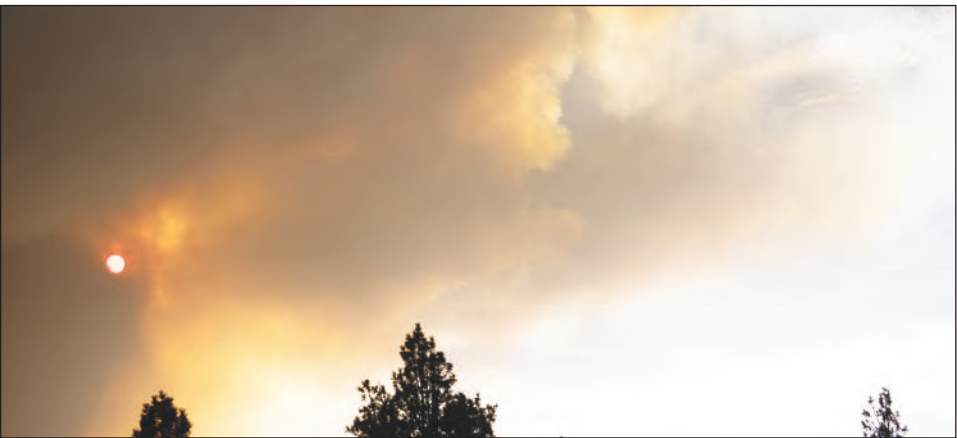

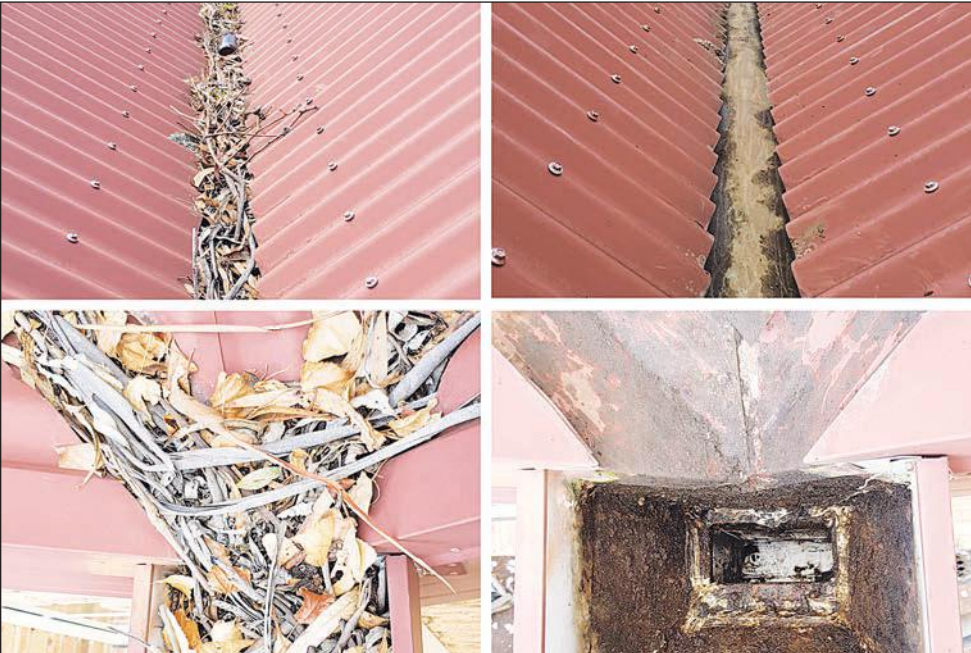

Additionally, 11 existing plans have been updated in Strahan, Zeehan, Molesworth, Tinderbox, Campania, Eagle Hawk Neck, Ansons Bay, Claude Road, Taranna, Cradle Mountain and South Hobart.

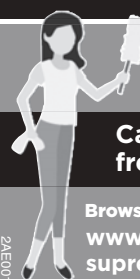

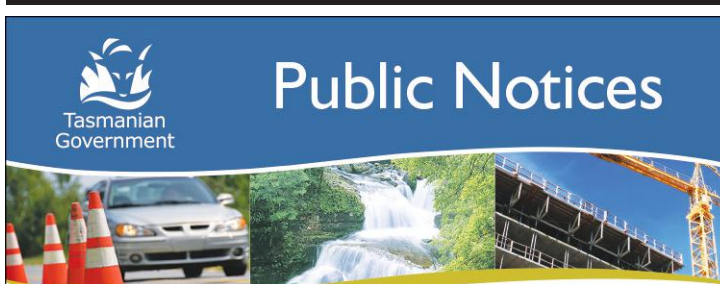
