Keeping everyone safe on our roads

The Matt Whayman Memorial Prize was awarded to Taroona High school student Max Burgess in 2022.

The prize is in memory of Matt, who was tragically killed in 1999 by a negligent driver on the Midlands Highway at the age of 26.

2022 proved a particularly hazardous year for road users, with the highest number of fatalities experienced in more than a decade.

50 people lost their lives on the road in 2022.

This is 51 per cent above the five-year average.

"These statistics show us that many challenges still lie ahead in our journey towards our target of zero serious injuries and deaths on Tasmanian roads", said Minister for Infrastructure and Transport

Michael Ferguson.

"Achieving this vision will only happen if every single one of us accepts responsibility for road safety and plays our part in making our roads safer for all road users.

"The governments 'Towards Zero Action Plan 2020-2024' has implemented a number of initiatives to reduce the number of people killed or seriously injured on Tasmanian roads."

Operation Safe Arrival was launched over the festive season, with police patrolling known hotspots for unsafe road behaviour.

Acting Inspector Adrian Leary said that a total of 6100 drivers were breath tested during Operation Safe Arrival, with 27 people charged with drink driving offences, 23 people charged with mobile phone offences, 259 people charged with speeding (not including speed camera detections)

and zero fatalities.

"While the festive season is over, we'll still be out in force, targeting risky driver behaviours like speeding, mobile phone use, and driving under the influence of alcohol or drugs, said Acting Inspector Leary.

"Importantly, keeping everyone safe on our roads is a mission for the whole community, not just police", said Acting Inspector Leary.

"We have a community evidence portal on our website, where members of the public can submit footage of dangerous driving incidents to us for investigation".

A new mobile speed detection camera program was launched in 2022, with more cameras to be introduced in 2023.

New camera technology detecting illegal mobile phone use and seatbelt noncompliance will also be trialled in early 2023.

Black Spot funding for Kingborough

Funding under the Australian Government's Black Spot Program will substantially improve 17 dangerous crash sites on Tasmanian roads in 2022-23, including \$120,000 for Kingborough region.

This project is included in the \$2.6 million of funding for Tasmanian roads under the Black Spot Program's 2022-23 funding round.

The Black Spot Program funds safety measures such as traffic signals and roundabouts at locations where a number of serious crashes are known to have occurred or are at risk of occurring.

These Black Spot projects will make an important contribution towards reducing serious injuries and deaths on Tasmania's roads and build on previous investments in the state.

The \$120,000 will be spent on improving skid resistance at Maranoa Road and Denison Street in Kingston which has been identified as a dangerous blackspot.

Tasmanians have had a devastating year with 53 people dying on our roads; this over a 60 per cent

increase from 2021.

MP Julie Collins said the funding would be crucial to improve the safety of a busy area for Kingborough residents.

"There is no doubt black spot funding has been a successful initiative that has and will continue to save lives on our local roads," Ms Collins said.

"I look forward to seeing work commence on this upgrade that will ensure our local roads are safer for Kingborough residents."

Senator Bilyk said these improvements are particularly important as they are adjacent to a local school.

"Roads around schools can be particularly hazardous, with a lot of vehicle and pedestrian activity at the same time around pick up and drop off times," Senator Bilyk said.

"I am proud to be part of a Labour government that taking action to keep children safe."

Christmas Day vehicle burglaries

An 18-year-old male has been charged and will appear in court over multiple motor vehicle burglaries committed in Springfarm Estate, Kingston on Christmas Day.

It is alleged the man, along with a female youth accomplice, stole property from several vehicles in the Estate.

Tasmania Police works to help people protect their homes and vehicles from burglary.

They are currently conducting additional patrols and engaging with the community around crime prevention.

While they continue to have a high arrest and charge rate for these types of crimes, police can't reduce this type of offending on their own.

"People can help prevent their homes, cars and businesses from becoming targets for thieves by taking some simple steps to make them less appealing to criminals," said Detective Sergeant Lee Carr.

Tasmania Police encourages all car owners to:

- Avoid parking on the street for long periods of time, especially overnight.
- Remove all valuable items from your car.
- Secure vehicles with an alarm, steering lock or immobiliser if possible.
- Always keep car doors and windows locked.
- Take tools inside overnight, even if the vehicle has a lockable canopy or toolbox.
- Park in a well-lit area if parking on the street overnight; and
- Ensure car keys are kept out of sight.

Lack of detail dissatisfies Community regarding Tasmanian Salmon Plan

Disgruntled community members have expressed their disappointment in the recently released Draft Tasmanian Salmon Industry Plan.

A community briefing session regarding the new 10-year plan, part of the Tasmanian Government's visions for a "sustainable industry into the future that all Tasmanians can be proud of" was held at Huonville Town Hall on Friday, December 16.

It saw employees from the Department of Natural Resources and Environment Tasmania facilitate the meeting, where tensions flared between local attendees and the organisers.

Deputy secretary of Department of Primary Industries, Parks, Water and Environment (DPIPWE) Deirdre Wilson and Director of the Marine Resources Branch at the Tasmanian Department of Primary Industries, Parks, Water and Environment Ian Dutton introduced the plan's purpose to locals, as well as the four priority outcomes of Sustainable Industry, Healthy Ecosystems, Prosperous Communities and Contemporary Governance framing the plan's approach.

Key initiatives proposed in the Draft Plan at the meeting included promoting a productive and viable industry, supporting finfish developments in areas that are further away from land, higher energy and more exposed or deeper; undertaking a government-led planning process in the south-east to encourage future farming in offshore areas; developing policy settings regarding significant community interest; supporting marine farming lease re-configurations; expanding the regulatory framework to include new standards and controls; reviewing the Marine Farming Planning Act 1995 and; determining a full recovery of costs of management from July 1, 2023.

However, Mr Dutton and Ms Wilson faced the many questions and accusations pressed against the salmon plan, with many at the meeting calling the plan "deliberately misleading" and "beating around the bush".

One of the many upset community members at the community briefing was Glenn Sanders, the secretary of Neighbours of Fish Farming (NOFF).

Mr Sanders said the briefing was marred by an audience "dissatisfied with the lack of detail and vague answers from the two Government representatives".

"A disappointingly small audience of 24 heard a short presentation, and there was plenty of time for questions, all of which were relevant and addressed specific topics," Mr Sanders explained.

"The NRE presenters attempted to limit each person to one question, promising to come back to that person later, but soon abandoned this tactic in the face of vigorous audience reaction.

"It became quite farcical, as the two presenters swapped microphones with each other and the audience, disinfecting them after each speaker, and appearing at times almost to wrestle the devices from speakers keen to follow up their first questions.

"The meeting was less effective than it could have been, because the NRE presenters over-used three standard replies.

"Several times participants were told to read specific parts of the Plan, until a frustrated audience member pointed out that everyone in the room had in fact read the Plan, that was why they had come along."

Mr Sanders said that many members were told to put their questions in a written submission on the Tasmanian Government website when it appeared that the two presenters could not answer the questions.

To this, several people said that they had already made submissions in detail, to the 2019 Legislative Council Finfish Enquiry, and more recently in response to the government's Discussion Paper on the Plan, asking why they should do so yet again.

"As the meeting moved to the finer aspects of the Plan, the response too often was that the Plan lacked detail because that would be developed once the Plan came into effect in May," expressed Mr Sanders.

"There were definite answers about the status of government maps showing leasable areas around Tasmania, and the government's principle of no expansion in existing leased areas while the Plan was being developed.

"It was explained that both these would lapse once the new Plan came into effect, but there was no further information provided on these two crucial issues.

"Talking to participants afterwards, it was clear that most were dissatisfied with the vague and evasive NRE answers.

"One participant did comment that the pictures in the Plan were nice, and the colours were pretty, which no doubt will be encouraging for the government."

The dissatisfaction shown by many at the meeting follows a prior boycott by community organisations Tasmanian Conservation Trust, Bob Brown Foundation, Neighbours of Fish Farming, Tasman Peninsula Marine Protection, Killora Association (Bruny Island), Marine Protection Tasmania, Surfrider Foundation Tasmania on Wednesday, December 14.

These groups, who protested the community briefings on Parliament House Lawns in Hobart accused the state government of deception and dishonesty as it "enables the Atlantic salmon industry to expand in public waterways".

In an open letter to Tasmanian Premier Jeremy Rockliff on Friday, December 9, President for NOFF Peter George called the Premier and Minister for Primary Industries and Water Jo Palmer's development of community consultation as the "illusion of public consultation".

"The latest draft salmon plan utterly ignores the concerns more than 200 people who made thoughtful, intelligent and informed submissions in the first round of "consultation" - more than 80 per cent of whom expressed serious concern about industry expansion and its impact on marine life, communities and waterways," stated Mr George.

"The government's true intentions were revealed when it emerged that the Premier personally gave secret undertakings to multinational salmon executives at a private Liberal Party fundraiser that their expansion plans would be green-lighted.

"This was shameful back-door dealing with multinationals whose records of corruption, environmental vandalism and regulatory failures are globally recognised.

"To now claim the government is consulting the public in good faith is dishonest and insulting."

Mr George went on to call the meetings a "travesty of process", stating they are too difficult to attend for many and that the draft document is not worth engaging over for a document that lacks

"clarity, detail or scientific underpinnings". Shadow Minister for Primary Industries and Water Janie Finlay MP further supported NOFF's notion, stating that the Draft Plan appears on first reading "to have failed Tasmanians".

"The Minister for Primary Industries and Water was in a position to boldly lead the nation when it comes to aquaculture and our ocean economy, yet much of this draft plan is focused on managing past negativity," said Ms Finlay.

"It is also concerning that the government has released a work plan before the consultation process has even finished.

"Have they already deemed the feedback irrelevant?"

"This plan could have delivered Tasmanians an ambitious way forward and provided an invitation to positively participate in our ocean economy.

"Instead, the government has placed its priority on regulation rather than having an eye to the future and identifying pathways to support new innovations that showcase our skills and talents and build trust and confidence."

Not all are critical of the Draft Plan however, with CEO of the Tasmanian Salmon Growers Association Sue Grau expressing that the plan "validates where or industry is headed" and is a positive first step for creating a shared vision of the industry, government and community.

"The Government's Plan backs in the world-leading innovation already driving our sustainable farming practices," said Ms Grau.

"We are Tasmania's biggest primary industry, with a low carbon footprint and low environmental impact, locking in Australia's food security by growing sustainable protein under some of the strictest regulations in the world.

"It is pleasing to see the Government recognise that our industry's contribution to thriving regional communities goes hand in hand with their ability to fund essential community services."

Ms Grau said the Government's Plan acknowledges the industry's importance to the state and looks forward to engaging in the consultation process as we review the plan in detail.

"We are a Tasmanian success story committed to the conservation of the marine environment we share with the local community," stated Ms Grau.

Members of the public are still invited to have their say on the Draft Tasmanian Salmon Industry Plan.

Feedback on the Draft Plan can be provided via web-based submissions and will be considered in the finalisation of the Plan.

Submissions are open until January 20, 2023, with the finalized Salmon Industry Plan to commence on May 1, 2023.

New Boating Code of Practice

NRM (Natural Resource Management) South, through the Tasmanian Smart Seafood Partnership (TSSP) and in partnership with the Tasmanian Seafood Industry Council, has created a new Boating Code of Practice that gives practical guidance on clean boating in Tasmanian waters for all waterway users.

The Boating Code of Practice focuses on best practice for general marine safety, biosecurity risk reduction, dealing with marine debris and pollution, and caring for coastal and marine ecosystems, birds and mammals and bycatch.

It also advises how to report interactions if they occur.

"With changing sea temperatures, we need to be more vigilant with our monitoring," said NRM Souths Water and Marine Program manager Jennifer Hemer.

"We are seeing new biosecurity risks and we want to help the boating community understand their responsibilities and how they can best look after our marine environment.

"Professional sea fishers and the seafood industry more broadly depend on healthy coastal and marine waters for their livelihoods, and through this TSSP initiative we are trying to help waterway users be responsible stewards", said Jennifer.

Volunteering for Change empowering inmate rehabilitation

The Tasmanian Government is making key investments in Tasmania's Corrections system that will ultimately help keep the community and staff safe, while providing offenders with more opportunities for rehabilitation.

Attorney-General and Minister for Corrections and Rehabilitation, Elise Archer said the government, in partnership with the Australian Red Cross, is delivering the Volunteering for Change program, which provides training for inmates to become Special Status Red Cross Volunteers within their correctional facilities. The Volunteering for Change program empowers participants to improve the health, wellbeing and safety of their correctional facility community through the identification and delivery of targeted projects aimed at improving the overall physical and mental health of inmates.

The program is also designed to provide volunteers a greater sense of purpose, increased confidence, self-esteem and self-worth within their community, all of which support improved outcomes upon their release.

"Programs like Volunteering for Change, delivered by the Red Cross, have seen excellent outcomes in correctional facilities across Australia as well as internationally, with both correctional staff and program volunteers reporting improved safety and overall wellbeing of the entire correctional facility community," Ms Archer said.

"This is a significant commitment, and I know that through their engagement with the program, the participants have demonstrated not only their commitment to the program, but also their commitment to a different future, for themselves and for their families, and indeed their communities."

Now that this group has completed the core units of the Volunteering for Change program, these women will work together to deliver a project that benefits all women in the Mary Hutchinson Women's Prison - spreading the benefits across the correctional facility and creating a more therapeutic environment for inmates and staff.

"The program not only provides participants with new skills and confidence, but also allows them to focus on projects that really matter to them in the corrections environment, as well as in their own networks and communities after their release," Ms Archer said.

Feedback from a number of participants said they felt empowered and that the program helped them to find their voice, better understand others and to make positive change in the correctional system.

The participants also stated they were grateful for the opportunity to undertake this program and highly recommended it to others within the facility.

The Volunteering for Change program will continue in the Mary Hutchinson Women's Prison in 2023 and will also be expanded to the men's correctional facilities, as part of the Tasmanian Government's significant commitment towards rehabilitation programs and staff over a pilot three-year period.

"Rehabilitation remains a key priority for me and our government, and I will continue to look for opportunities for new and expanded rehabilitation programs within our custodial and community-based Corrections system," Ms Archer said.

Feedback on returning land

Last year, the Rockliff Liberal Government released a consultation paper with their proposals for changes to the Aboriginal Lands Act 1995 to improve the model for returning land to Tasmanian Aboriginal people.

Overall, the Government's proposals have been well received; however, the issues of eligibility to participate in the Aboriginal Land Council of Tasmania election processes and the role of the Tasmanian Electoral Commissioner need further clarification.

Aboriginal Affairs Minister Roger Jaensch has recently released an additional consultation paper that asks for feedback on a more refined approach to these issues, and provides significantly more detail

on how the proposed new arrangements could operate.

"This consultation period will run for 11 weeks with submissions due by 12 March 2023, to ensure that everyone has time to consider and provide a response," Minister Jaensch said.

The feedback received through this and the previous consultation process will inform a draft Bill, which will be released for further consultation prior to its introduction to Parliament later in 2023.

Further information about the Review into the model for returning land to Tasmania's Aboriginal people, and the process for amending the Aboriginal Lands Act, is available on the Aboriginal Heritage Tasmania website.

Beat the heat this summer

Tasmanians are encouraged to prepare for hot weather over the New Year period.
 Not only is it important for individuals to protect themselves, but to also look out for others.
 Director of Public Health Dr Mark Veitch said "Hot weather can affect us all, but some people are at higher risk than others".
 "These include the elderly and very young, pregnant women, people who work outside, as well as people with chronic medical conditions.
 "When it comes to hot weather simple steps like keeping hydrated, minimising direct sun exposure, and wearing lightweight clothes, can help keep us safe in the heat," said Dr Veitch.
 Public Health Services recommend:
 * Keep hydrated: Drink plenty of water, even if you don't feel thirsty. Drink alcohol responsibly, as alcohol can cause worsen dehydration caused by heat.
 * Never leave your child in the car: Children can die in hot cars.
 * Check on others: Check on relatives and friends at risk, such as the elderly and people with chronic medical conditions.
 * Clothing: Wear lightweight, comfortable clothing, especially light colours that reflect the heat.
 * Minimise sun: Keep out of the sun as much as possible and don't exercise outside in the heat of the day. If you must go outside, wear protective clothing, sunglasses, and use plenty of broad-spectrum sunscreen (minimum SPF30+).
 * Prepare your house: If you have a fan or air-conditioner, make sure it is working (and set to cool). If you do not have a fan or air-conditioner, open doors and windows to improve ventilation. Draw blinds and curtains to keep out the heat during the day.
 * Pets: Keep your pets out of the sun and give them plenty of cool water to drink. Avoid exercising your dog in the heat of the day and never leave pets in a car during hot weather.
 * Seek medical advice: Heat-related illness can be life threatening. If someone seems ill and affected by heat, get advice from a health professional. In an emergency, call 000 for help.

Lower PBS prices

The new, lower cost of PBS medicines came into effect on New Years Day, meaning the most patients will pay for a PBS listed medication is \$30, down from \$42.50.

This follows Parliament passing legislation late last year to lower the maximum co-payment cost of PBS medicines.

Pharmacy Guild of Australia's National President, Professor Trent Twomey says this will be a big help to some 19 million patients, especially those who have been struggling to afford their medicines.

In 2019-20 we learnt that 900,000 Australian

patients did not get a script filled because they could not afford it?, Professor Twomey said.

January 1st marks a significant date as it will be the first time in the history of the PBS that the general co-payment for medicines has come down and not gone up?.

Professor Twomey said that the Pharmacy Guild are pushing for the maximum co-payment to be reduced even further to \$19.

Reducing the maximum co-payment to \$19 will mean an additional 30 per cent of PBS medicines are covered, Professor Twomey said.



* The Lost Clog - Lithuanian singers and dancers,


* Bush Gothic with a unique take on Aussie songs.


