The awards ceremony was held at Parliament House in Canberra.

Good Sports is Australia's largest community health sports program, working with more than 10,000 community sports clubs across Australia, including more than 550 clubs in Tasmania.

The Good Sports Award recognises local sports clubs that are committed to building healthy and family-friendly club environments and for their work with the Alcohol and Drug Foundation's Good Sports program in tackling topics like alcohol, illicit drugs, smoking, mental health and safe transport.

"Good Sports supports local sporting clubs to identify and reduce potential risks around alcohol and other drugs, as well as other important issues such as mental health and road safety," said Alcohol and Drug Foundation's Tasmanian Manager Mona Malouf.

"The Good Sports Awards are the ultimate trophy for any Good Sports club.

"They shine the spotlight on success, celebrate the volunteers who are the backbone of Good Sports clubs and give winning clubs the recognition they deserve," said Ms Malouf.

Woodbridge Cricket Club was crowned the 2022 Good Sports National Club of the Year and the 2022 Good Sports Tasmanian Club of the Year for adopting practices and strategies to improve the health and wellbeing of their members, inspiring positive change and building a healthier and family-friendly club environment.

Council votes to change the date

Kingborough Council will change the date of its January 26 Citizenship Ceremonies from 2024 onwards.

Kingborough Mayor Paula Wriedt said this was a positive and inclusive move for Council and the community.

"Relocating the date for January Citizenship Ceremonies will help alleviate concerns associated with holding Citizenship Ceremonies on January 26 every year," Cr Wriedt said.

"This date has become controversial, with many Australians concerned about celebrating Australia Day on January 26, which is also identified as a day of mourning and invasion by many Australians.

"Following the amendment to the Australian Citizenship Ceremonies Code, several councils have moved to change the date of their January citizenship ceremony, including City of Hobart, Glenorchy and Huon Valley.

"I think it is incumbent on our Council to consider what is in the best interest of all our community.

"We all recognise that there is community distress surrounding Australia Day and its differing meaning for many.

"By choosing to hold the Citizenship Ceremonies on another day other than January 26, we are alleviating any distress that some community members may feel either by attending or by participating in them.

"The changes will take place commencing in 2024, with the ceremony to be held either on the 23, 24, 25, 27, 28 or 29 January."

Participants will learn how insulation and draft proofing

can reduce heating and cooling costs by up to 50% and discussions will canvas how investments to improve carbon footprint can pay themselves off over just a few years.

People attending the event, in Kettering Hall, Sunday March 12th at 4pm will have opportunity to ask questions, interact with locally based panellists, who have already taken the steps towards household sustainability.

Attendees will be able to make vital connections that will allow people to make further progress down the path towards sustainable households.

Channel gardens to hit the trail

Five different gardens are the focus of this year's garden trail in April hosted by the South Channel Garden Club.

This is the fourth trail in the series and previous events have raised thousands for garden-related projects in the Channel, including helping ex-service men and women combat post-traumatic stress syndrome through gardening.

This year's trail, Colours and Flavours of the Channel, will feature gardens in Kettering, Woodbridge and Middleton on April 16.

Joy and Ted's garden in Kettering highlights interesting or unusual plants in a newly developed garden which reflects their passion for plants and years of experience running a rare-plant nursery in South Hobart.

Nearby, Sue's garden is an illustration of what can be achieved in a near-urban environment offering privacy and seclusion and a perfect habitat for birds and frogs.

At Dalmere in Middleton, a garden first developed almost 20 years ago surrounding a straw bale house, combines shrubs, vines and trees with a year-round productive veggie patch.

With its year-round colour, Jana's garden south of Woodbridge reflects a sense of European grandeur and incorporates a Monet-inspired dam filled with water lilies while dotted among the fruit trees are some of the sculptures created by the owner.

Five Bob Farm at Birchs Bay - previously known as Fleurty's Cafe - is run by a manager and an enthusiastic team of volunteers in a garden which produces inspiration and therapy as well as fresh herbs and vegetables.

It also gives visitors the opportunity to walk the neighbouring Art Farm trail.

Entry to all five gardens is \$20 with free entry for under-16-year-olds.

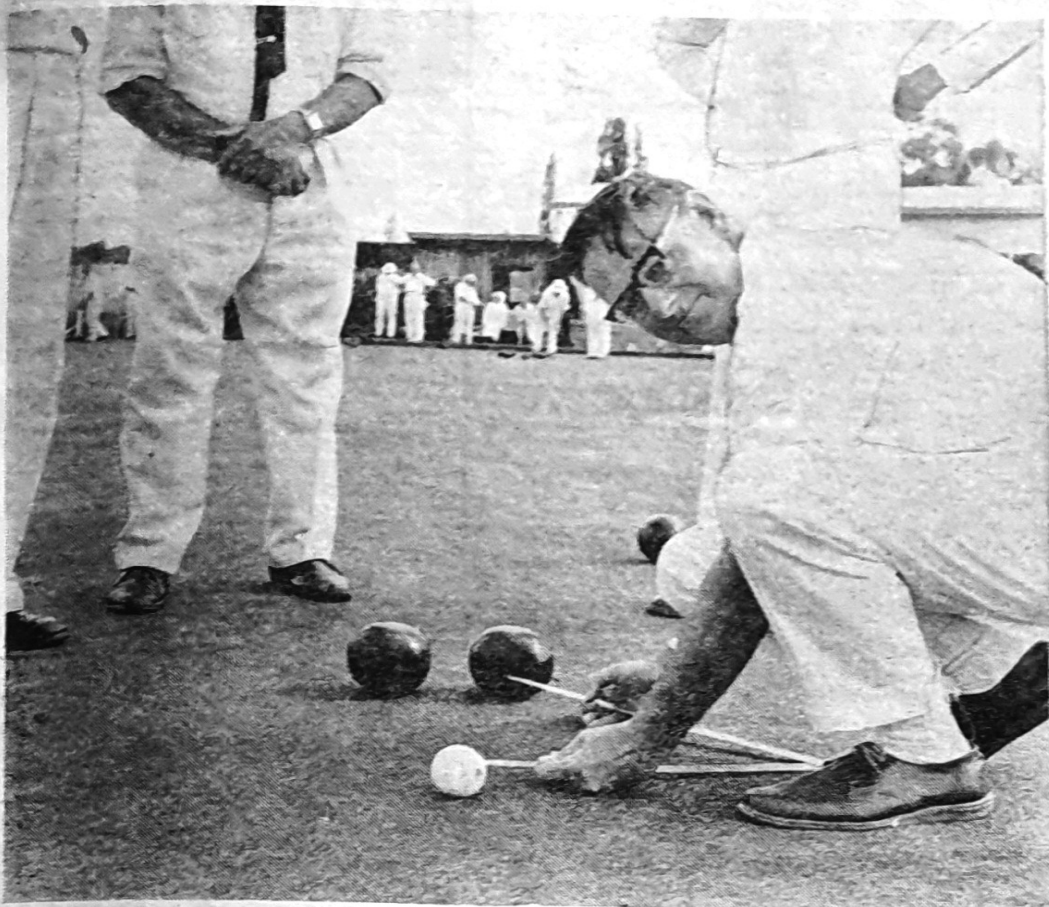

A Page from the Past - Kingborough News

Fifty years ago the Huon Newspaper Company published *Kingborough News*, a weekly newspaper that circulated from 1967. The below page is taken from *Kingborough News*, February 9, 1968.

PROBLEM FOR THE UMPIRE



THERE was an unusual occurrence in a bowls match at Margate on Saturday. At one end, the bowls shot by Doug Crisp's Kingborough team and Len Burgess' Rosny Park four could not be separated. The umpire (Mr George Ellis) was called in, and he used calipers for several minutes in an effort to separate the shots, but the distance of both bowls from kitty was exactly the same, and it proved to be a drawn end. Bowlers said that such a position had not happened at Margate for years. The two teams concerned were level at the 24th, but at the next end Crisp drew the shot, and won by one. •Pictured is the umpire using the calipers.

Memorial for Fire Victims

SNUG Progress Association has launched a public appeal for funds to establish a memorial to the many who died in the fires last February.

The form the memorial should take has not yet been decided but it is thought it should be something unique to commemorate such an unprecedented disaster.

Nearly half of southern Tasmania's fire victims lost their lives in the

Snug area between Margate and Kettering and most of Snug township was destroyed, therefore, Snug is considered the most appropriate place for a memorial.

Mr Charles Pitt jnr., who is credited with originating the idea, said this week that, with the advent of a new church, shops, houses and surroundings, the younger generation will soon forget the structure and life of the old Snug.

The fury and terror of February 7th, 1967, which put Tasmanian on the map throughout the world and has become a legendary lesson to all Australians, must not be allowed to drift into obscurity.

As a community remembrance of loss of life and as a reminder to coming generations as a thanksgiving for the relief received and a needed tourist attraction, there ought to be a memorial somewhere in Snug. It should not be a conventional one, so common throughout Australia but one worthy of the happening.

Possibly Tasmania should have an annual event as a reminder to all Australia to the lesson taught.

TAROONA PEOPLE TO TAKE STRONG STAND

RESIDENTS of Tarooma, who number more than 3,000, are generally discontented with the absence of postal facilities in the town, and intend to make an issue of the matter in the forthcoming election campaign.

Members of Parliament and private citizens have taken up the matter, as well as the Kingborough Commission, and one resident has written a strong letter to the Postmaster General (Mr Hume).

A Tarooma woman, who expresses the general feeling, addressed the Postmaster General in the following terms:

"Along with many others, I shall be glad to know when suitable post office facilities are going to be made available for Tarooma residents. A new shopping centre is in the planning stage, and it is hoped a post office will be incorporated in the scheme.

appropriate to provide an official post office, at this stage.

The most suitable method, he said, would be to have an office conducted

in conjunction with a private business.

Unfortunately, the department had been unable to find a suitable person willing to undertake this work.

SITE FOR P.O. BOUGHT

What the people want to know is if the department thinks there is not enough business to warrant a post office, why did it buy a site to establish one. The site is a vacant piece of land at the intersection of Seaview Ave. with the Channel Highway.

Mr Hodgman said that the Tarooma newsagent (Mr E. K. Hook) sold \$30 worth of stamps a week as a needed service, and the writer of the letter to the P.M.G. said she would buy \$300 dollars worth of Tax stamps for the company she works for rather than get them in the city.

Also, the writer of the letter to the P.M.G., and Mr M. Hodgman, M.L.C., both know of a post mistress in a country town, who intends to move to Tarooma, and is interested in starting up a post office at Tarooma. Mr Hodgman has advised her to communicate with the Deputy P.M.G. (Mr Geilston).

Mr Hodgman told the "News": "It is incredible that a town like Tarooma which is a major suburb of Hobart, should be without a post office."

Mr Hodgman said he had written to Mr Hume about the matter more than a year ago, and had since interviewed another Federal Minister, who had assured him the matter would be taken further by the P.M.G.

Last year he had spoken to Mr Geilston in Hobart about the matter, and had received an assurance that if someone could be found to conduct a post office on a non-official basis, the department would consider the matter favourably. This is where the matter now stands.

A Page from the Past - Kingborough News

Fifty years ago the Huon Newspaper Company published *Kingborough News*, a weekly newspaper that circulated from 1967. The below page is taken from *Kingborough News*, February 16, 1968.

DRAMATIC PROSPECTS FOR KINGSTON BEACH

IF a five-million dollar casino and multi-storey hotel at Wrest Point is calculated to place Tasmania on the world tourist map, what would a similar expenditure at Kingston Beach recognised by those who know it as one of the most attractive places in Australia, do for the State?

The difference is that you won't need a casino at Kingston Beach. It is already one of the best beaches imaginable for swimming, yachting, and fishing. It already has an international golf course, sailing club facilities, a sports ground, and a caravan park, and an esplanade promenade which could be made to rival Manly (N.S.W.).

What can be done locally is improvement of the caravan park, with a better access road, reclamation of the river front marshes for sports or additional accommodation areas, and possibly the formation of a trout fishing lake by damming Browns River above Kingston. This would not affect the flow once the lake was filled in the rainy season, because the water would not be drawn off.

What an investing developer could do, once these preliminaries were accomplished, would be to build a multi-storey hotel with night life on international lines, including club room facilities, a heated swimming pool, and public tennis courts.

The experience of other Eastern Australian States suggests also that multi-storey apartment units along the esplanade would be snapped up as quickly as they were built, but there would need to be some available for visitors and at prices that gave value for money.

The advent of the outlet road undoubtedly will lead to dramatic developments, which could be on this scale, though it is doubtful whether many Kingston residents would appreciate such inroads on their present quiet life.

Foreshore Development

With the present interest in tourism it was significant that at a meeting of the Kingston Beach Development Association on Monday night, enthusiastic interest was shown in a complete development and beautification programme on the Kingston Beach foreshore.

A member said that, on a recent holiday round Tasmania, she had asked Mainland visitors what impressed them most about the State, and nearly all said it was the greenery and natural scenery.

Members are of opinion that it is in these aspects

that Kingston Beach can do its share to help the State present an even better scenic attraction in natural beauty.

They consider that, in these days of industrial development, everything possible should be done to preserve the State's natural heritage, so that others can share with Kingston people the pleasure they derive from living there.

A report on proposals for Kingston Beach foreshore developments will be sent to the Kingborough Commission to help in their deliberations on the matter.

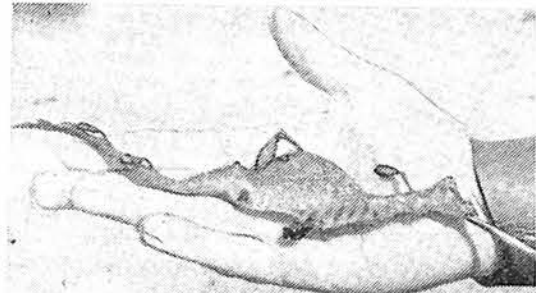

Huts Sold Like Hot Cakes

AT an auction at Snug Park on Saturday morning, there was a complete clearance of the 70 huts which had been provided by the Hydro Commission to help house the burnt-out people of Snug 12 months ago.

About 200 persons attended, bidding was brisk, and the buildings sold very quickly at an average of about \$20 each.

Most of the huts were bought by residents of Huon and Cygnet districts and the main purpose for which they are needed is to accommodate fruit pickers, although some will be used as workshops, woodsheds and general outhouses.

In many cases, they will replace outhouses burnt in the fires and not yet been replaced, although one woman, Mrs R. W. Salter, of Gardners Bay, who bought two, said that one would be painted and used as a playhouse for her daughter.

Some purchasers bought

six, seven, and as many as eight each. All measure 10 ft. by 8 ft., except one which is 13 by 10.

By February 26, there won't be a hut left at Snug Park, because the Kingborough Commission has stipulated that all must be removed from the municipality by then.

The commission has ruled that they don't comply with the building regulations, and cannot be used for any purpose in the municipality whether for habitation or as out-buildings.

Some Kingborough people, particularly fruit-growers, were disappointed that they could not buy them.

This week an employee of the commission has at-

tended to release the huts for removal, and he will attend also next Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday.

Among those present were some former occupiers, who turned up to see them sold.

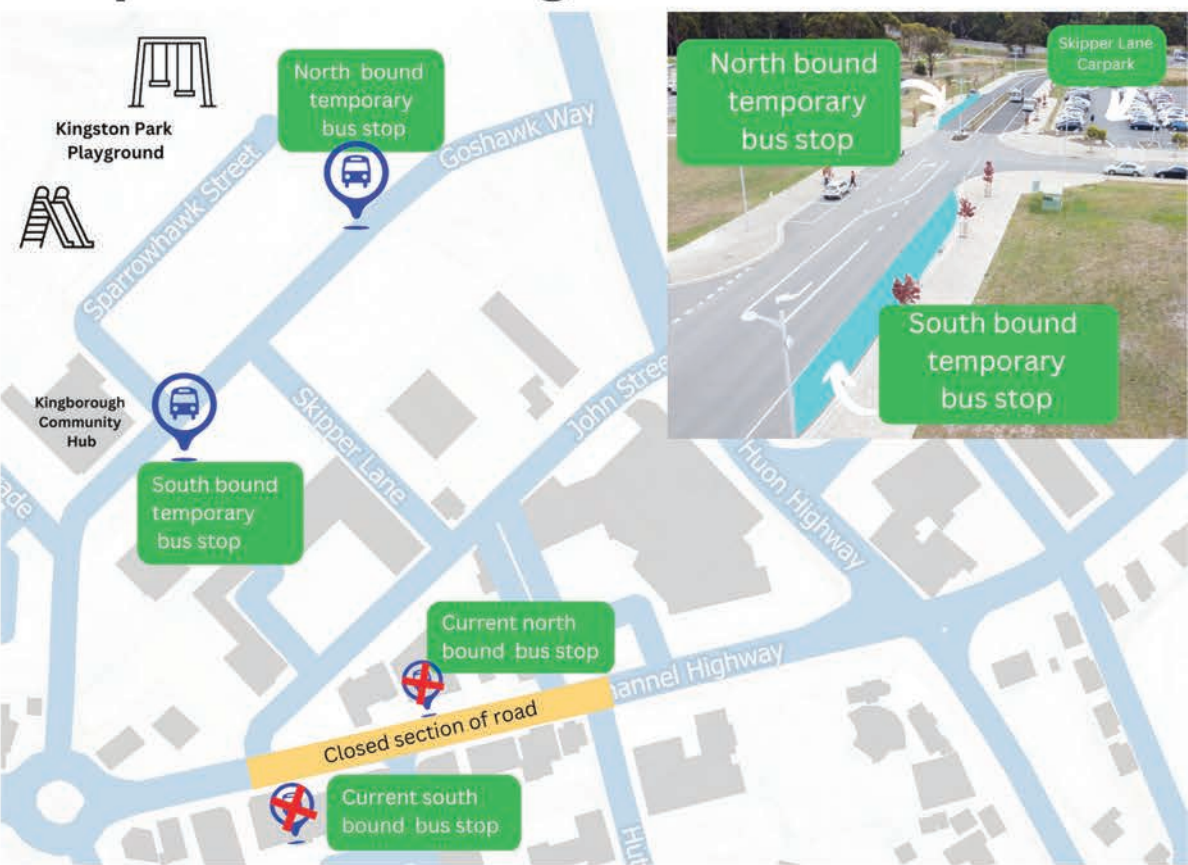

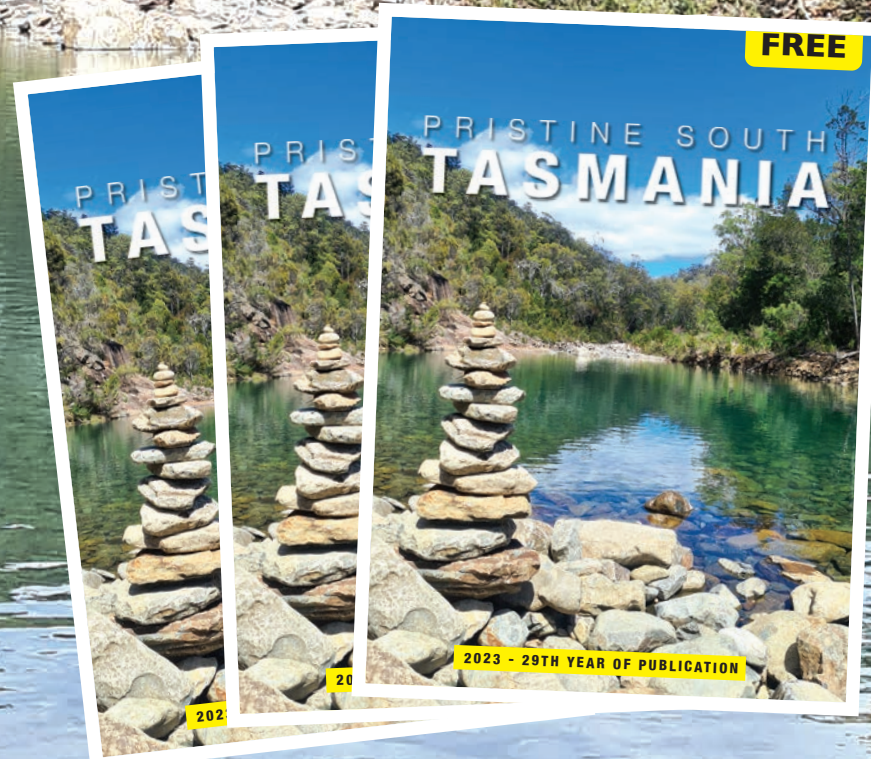

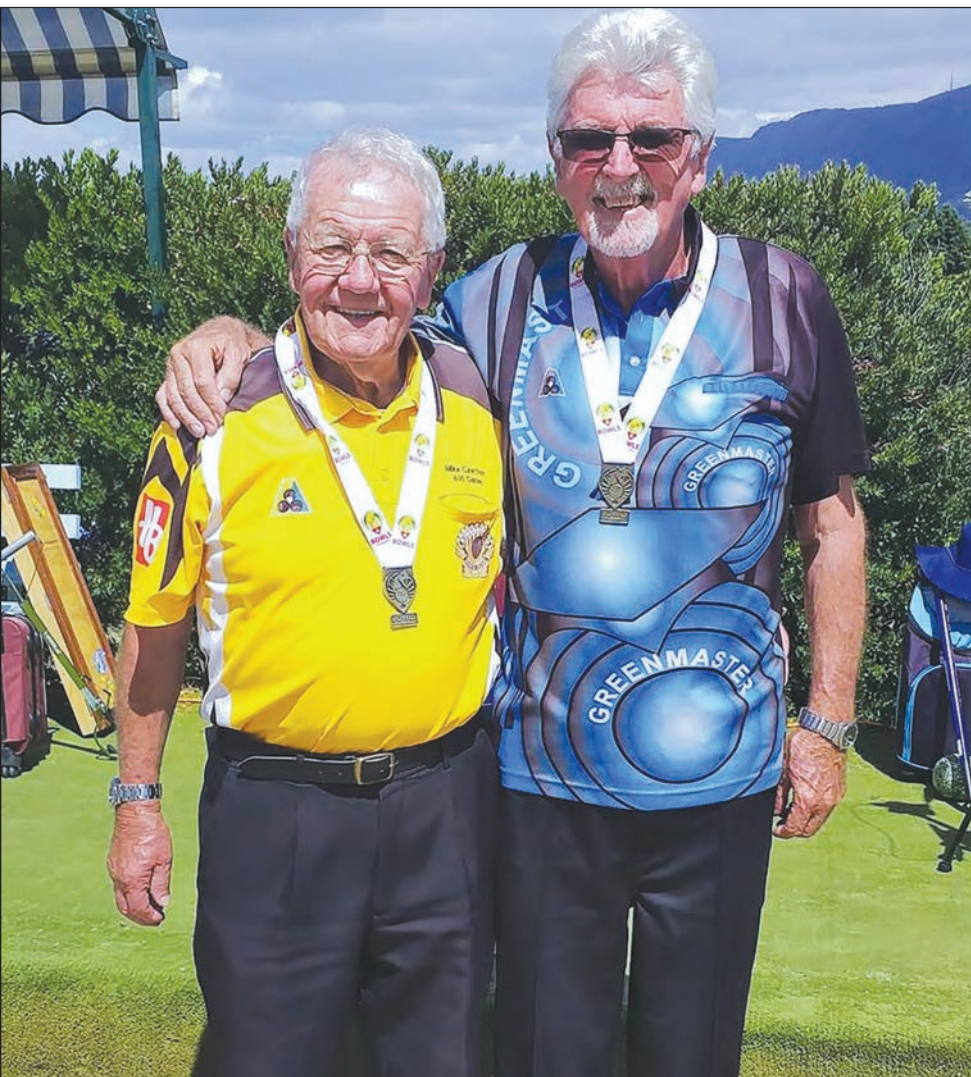
