

Kings Quarter building approved



Traders in Purple's new commercial building at their \$300 million Kings Quarter development has been approved by Kingborough Council.

Traders in Purple Development Director Jennifer Cooper said the new commercial building would stimulate business in the local area and help reduce congestion on the Southern Outlet.

"The building is expected to support around 100 jobs during construction, and accommodate up to 400 employees once occupied, taking a significant number of traffic movements off the Southern Outlet each morning and afternoon," Ms Cooper said.

"Traders In Purple is also excited about the positive impact this building will have on the local economy in Kingston, providing opportunities for local businesses to grow, and for new services to come to the area for the first time."

Kingborough Mayor, Cr Paula Wriedt welcomed investment in more commercial and office space for Kingston.

"We've got a vision for the centre of Kingston as being a vibrant place, where people want to visit, spend time and, importantly, spend money at our local businesses," Cr Wriedt said.

"This investment in further retail and commercial spaces will bring more people and businesses into Kingston and will create more jobs for our rapidly growing municipality."

"Creating more possibilities for residents to work in Kingston has the added benefit of reducing the need to sit in traffic."

Partner at Knight Frank Richard Steedman said the approval would provide much-needed office accommodation for greater Hobart.

"Hobart has the lowest vacancy rate in the country at 2.5 per cent compared to the national average of 12.5 per cent, and arguably market failure, with no new supply currently under construction," Mr Steedman said.

"This lack of supply is impeding economic growth with the inability for existing businesses to expand or attract new businesses to greater Hobart as there is currently no office accommodation solution."

Traffic plans for Huntingfield housing development

Machinery has arrived on the new housing site in Huntingfield off the Channel Highway where approximately 500 new homes are to be built.

Local Labor MP Dean Winter is calling for an update on traffic plans for the area.

"The housing development is desperately needed but work can't start without access from the highway, and the Liberals' bungled road proposal has delayed things massively," Mr Winter said.

The government put forward a plan for a new roundabout but left out a slip lane to allow traffic from the south to go through without stopping.

The government suggested Kingborough Council amend the application to

add a slip lane.

Mr Winter says a new design has not gone through Council and Kingborough residents deserve to know what the current plan looks like.

"The State Government promised work on this roundabout would start in early 2022," Mr Winter said.

"They stuffed up their last proposal so Kingborough residents deserve to see the next design and hope this time it's up to the task," Mr Winter said.

Minister for Infrastructure and Transport Michael Ferguson said "The Department of State Growth is progressing planning and design for a new roundabout on the Channel Highway to service the planned Huntingfield

residential development which Mr Winter fought tooth and nail until we finally got it approved".

"A development application for the slip lane was lodged in April last year and Council has made further requests for information since lodgement."

"The most recent response was provided this month," Mr Ferguson said.

"The department is awaiting the Council's decision on issuing a permit."

"The relocation of power lines to accommodate the new roundabout and slip lane has required extensive negotiation with adjacent landowners."

Minister Ferguson said work will begin once Council approvals are received and the power lines relocated.

Long-term problems on municipal gravel roads

Dear Editor,

Good red gravel seems to be disappearing for use on Kingborough gravel roads!

Some ratepayers living in rural areas of Kingborough with gravel roads will be experiencing the new red gravel mix which Council Works Department has been spreading on gravel roads in the municipality.

Having just graded a section of Van Moreys Road last week, the road surface is now covered with loose gravel and rocks and every vehicle raises a cloud of dust that drifts across local ratepayers' properties, settling on their windows, roof, cars and anything else in the yards.

After settling on the roof of houses the dust is washed into water tanks, water that is used for cooking, washing and drinking.

The loose gravel and rocks on the road surface makes the gravel roads a road safety hazard; the rocks can be thrown up by passing vehicles, and the gravel makes the road surface slippery and dangerous.

Cyclists and walkers are also impacted by a road surfaced with loose gravel and rocks.

At some sections of the road the gravel and rocks are

up to 100mm thick on the sides of the road, especially on some of the corners.

I have spoken with Council Management about this gravel and was told that it 'passes the specs'!

This new mix of gravel might 'pass the specs' in the laboratory but it certainly does not pass the reality specs when it has been on the road for only a short time.

Red gravel has been used on rural roads for probably a hundred years in southern Tasmania.

It is a quarry product and is generally a mix of decayed dolerite gravel and clay.

Good mixes of red gravel after spreading and rolling on roads provide a stable and generally safe road surface with minimal dusting, not much loose gravel and very few rocks, and stays in place, bonded by the clay in the mix.

I hope the management of Kingborough realize that the use of this latest gravel product will cause long-term problems on the municipal gravel roads and source a supply of more suitable material for our rural roads.

Report reveals importance of local newspapers

Deakin University has released a report into the future of country newspapers.

Country Press Australia president Andrew Manuel said the *Media Innovation and the Civic Future of Australia's Country Press* report highlights the essential role local papers play in serving their communities and delivering civic journalism.

"This is arguably the most comprehensive study of our industry ever undertaken and the report stands as a beacon for government, for policy makers and for the community to take the appropriate and necessary actions to ensure newspapers can continue to play such a vital role," Mr Manuel said.

The *Media Innovation and the Civic Future of Australia's Country Press* report has been a three-year Australian Research Council project, led by Deakin University, in partnership with Country Press Australia and the Royal Melbourne Institute of Technology University.

The study included a survey into attitudes towards local papers and the respondents' likes and dislikes, as well as interviews and interpretive focus groups with news editors, proprietors and key staff within the Country Press Australia network of more than 200 mastheads located at sites across Australia.

The report questions an obsession with digital reach among major advertisers and government and explains how local papers are not designed to individually engage with millions of people, but that their strength lies in their rich levels of engagement with the distinct local communities they are an essential part of.

Mr Manuel said people living in country areas remain passionate and engaged with their local mastheads, and the report highlights the need to better support local news.

"Our members continue to provide the local and civic news that readers crave more than ever, often as the only local media outlet serving a particular region," Mr Manuel said.

Coming out of the pandemic, many publishers have reported a strong revival in their readership, underpinned by a focus on hyper-local and unique news that has been a common denominator of country papers since their inception.

"We urgently need government to recognise the importance of our members in the local community and for government to adapt the way they seek to engage our readerships, just as we have adapted our businesses during particularly the past few years," Mr Manuel said.

Banning Nazi salutes

The Rockliff Liberal Government has tasked the Office of Parliamentary Counsel to examine how a ban on Nazi salutes can be incorporated into the Police Offences Amendment (Nazi Symbol Prohibition) Bill 2023.

Attorney-General and Minister for Justice, Elise Archer said Nazi salutes have no place in our society. "The use of the Nazi salute is offensive, distressing and a breach of our community and moral standards," the Attorney-General said.

"I want everyone in our community to feel safe from these disturbing displays whether it be Nazi symbols or saluting, as they can cause hate and fear. "Our government will take immediate action to examine how the Police Offences Amendment (Nazi Symbol Prohibition) Bill 2023 (the Bill) can prohibit the Nazi salute. "I believe these reforms will be nation-leading and will build on our commitment to create a more caring community for all Tasmanians."

Kingborough's young writers triumph

In conjunction with Tasmania Reads week, the Terror Australis Readers and Writers Festival (TARWF) announced the winners of its Children's Mystery Short Story Competition earlier this month, with a number of budding Kingborough and Huon writers becoming finalists or winners.

At a ceremony at Government House, Dr L. J. Owen, Director of the (TARWF) and Convenor of the TARWF Children's Mystery Short Story Competition, said the theme for this year's competition arose from celebration of the centenary of mystery writer Agatha Christie's visit to Tasmania. "Agatha loved it so much, she wrote in her autobiography that she had hoped to move here one day," Dr Owen explained. "So, for this competition, we asked our young writers to imagine that she had, and to create mysteries she may have written if she had made Tasmania her home." Last year, Dr Owen curated an exhibition as part of 2022 TARWF that celebrated Agatha Christie's visit as well as

the 35 authors and 100 crime and mystery published in the past century, either by Tasmanians or set in Tasmania. "I'd also like to thank all the librarians, teachers and parents who helped this year's entrants," said Dr Owen. "I know, all too well, just how much encouragement and support we writers can need, so thank you for helping to nurture our next generation of storytellers." Judges for this year included Bronwyn Chalke, the owner of Hobart Bookshop, Lindy Cameron, the CEO of Clan Destiny Press, Em Cutting, also a judge of the national Aurealis Awards and Judi Rhodes, one of Tasmania's finest children's authors. In the open category to age 16, Grace Fu of Hobart was joint winner with her work *Murder on the Oreo Express* with Kingston's Ava McMahon Jones and her piece *The Mysterious Affair at Shirley's*. In the up to Year 2 category Kingston's Connor McGuire was shortlisted for his *Activity in the Bush* along with Huonville's August Walter with *The Mystery of the Dino Model*.

Joan has portrayed, for instance, our unique Fagus,

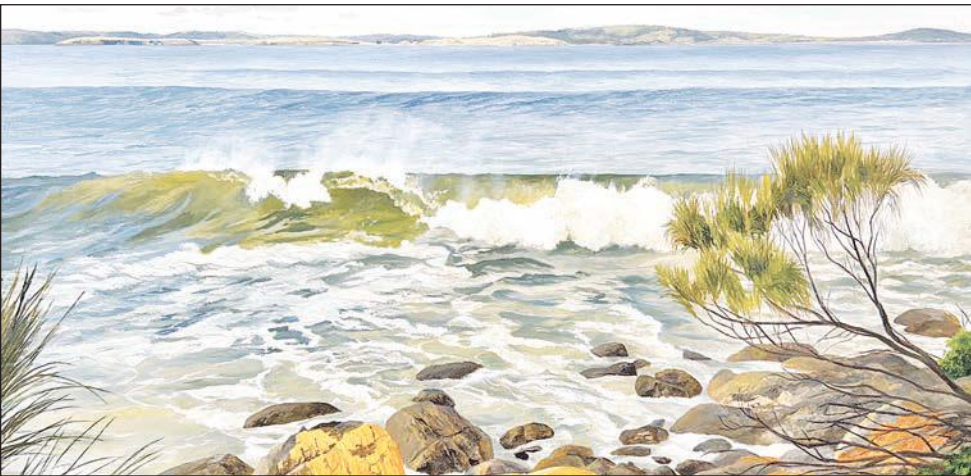

Her works vary in size from 60 cm x 120 cm down to miniatures just 5 cm x 10 cm, thus the magnifying glass can help on the finer details.

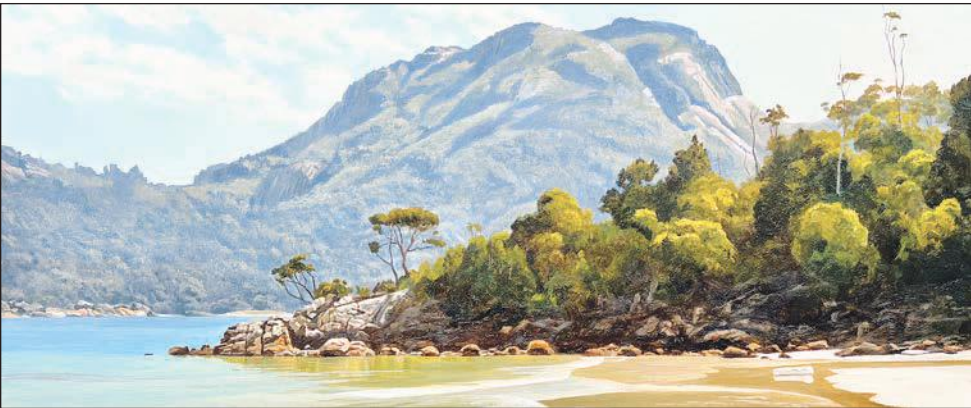

A Page from the Past - Kingborough News

Fifty five years ago the Huon Newspaper Company published *Kingborough News*, a weekly newspaper that circulated from 1967. The below page is taken from *Kingborough News*, March 22, 1968.

Modern Hop Kiln Starts Production

THE most modern and scientific hop kiln in Australia, which halves the drying time and eliminates night work, on the Brookfield property of H. Jones and Co. Pty., Margate, got under way to a good start early last week and, apart from teething troubles, all went well.

On a visit to the hop-fields last week, it was interesting to see the experiences shown by the four women who drive tractors hauling trailers laden with hop vines cut at top and bottom by modern methods.

No more laborious hop picking by hand on this estate. The trailers are backed into the picking shed, and the vines are stripped by a machine, after which the leaves are blown away by the air blower, and women give the hops a final clean as they ascend a conveyor belt into the drying rooms.

Once the hops reach the drying rooms, the new inventions by engineer, Mr Fred Peacock, begin to operate.

There are four drying rooms, and in each the hops is in a different state of dryness. Into each, the hops is poured by overhead travelling conveyors controlled by a switch board on which are two automatic time clocks.

On another page is pictured hops being poured from a conveyor on to the floor of one of the "rooms."

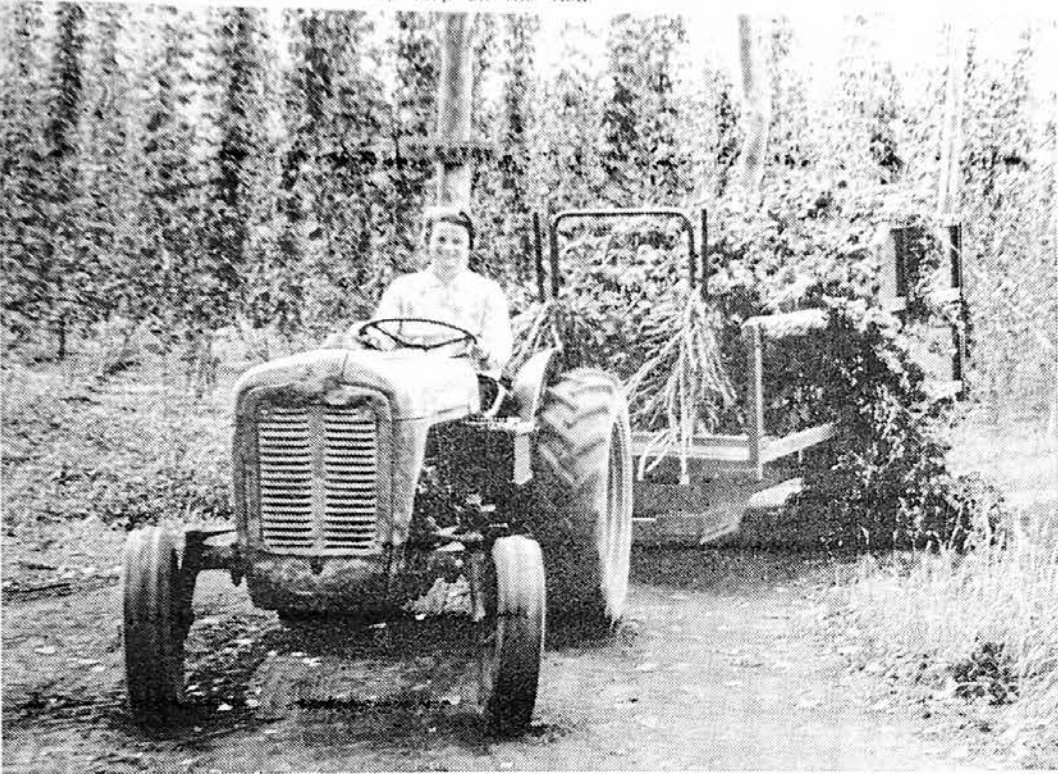
The whole secret is the introduction of very hot air being forced up into the hops from the floor by hot air ducts, invented

by Mr Peacock. These are the only ones of this kind in Australia.

By this means, the hops

dry in half the normal time, and the economic gain is obvious. The hop crop on the

Brookfield estate is a good average one—largely the result of sensible irrigation.

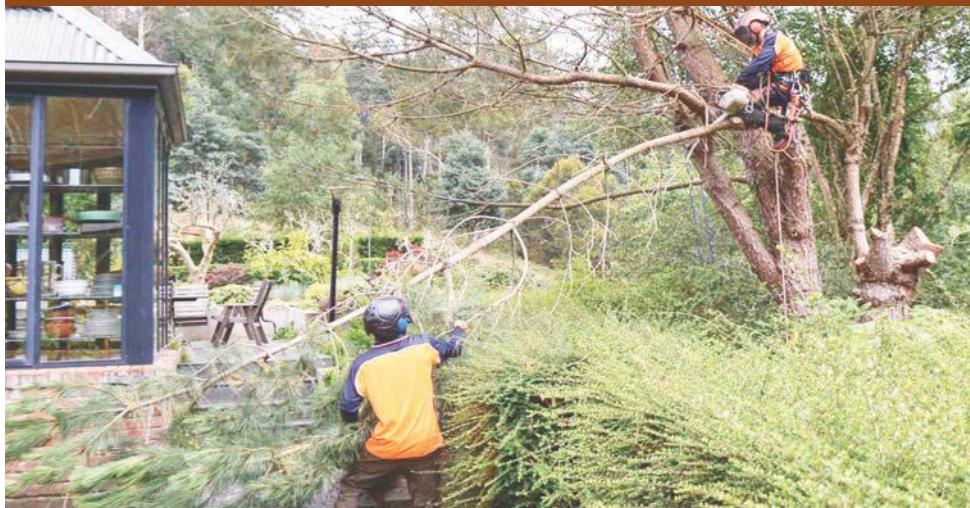

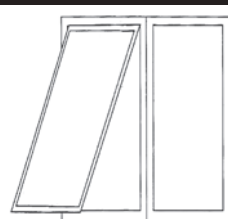

Close wins and surprise results in bowls finals
