

Kingborough Scouts awarded highest honour

The highest award that can be presented to youth members in the 15-18-year-old age bracket in Scouting and Guiding is the Queen's Scout Award and the Queen's Guide Award.

A group of young Tasmanians were recently bestowed with these awards at Government House by Her Excellency the Honourable Barbara Baker AC, Governor of Tasmania.

Amongst the recipients were three Kingborough Venturers; Jett Hilder (Kingston Sea Scout Group), Isabel Weiley (Blackmans Bay Sea Scout Group) and Toby Barrett (North West Bay Sea Scout Group).

Each Venturer had to complete a number of tasks over their four years within the Venturer section including core skills in bushcraft, bushwalking and camping, as well as grow their skills in other areas such as paddling, climbing, boating, and bike riding.

Additionally, they planned, carried out and reviewed a minimum of six individual projects in a subject of their choice.

Each also planned and carried out an unsupervised adventurous journey over three nights, attended a personal development course and took an active part in leading, assisting and participating in the regular activities of their unit.

Following the passing of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II last year there was a temporary hold on the naming of the Venturer Scout peak award.

Buckingham Palace via the Governor General of Australia (and Chief Scout) has informed Scouts Australia that the Queen's Scout Award can still be presented until the official patronage for the King's Scout Award is determined.

All Venturer Scouts who have achieved this award since the Queen's passing will now be recognised as Queen's Scouts.

It is a well-deserved honour for their remarkable achievements and dedication.

Feedback on local government elections

The Tasmanian Government introduced compulsory voting at local government elections in 2022.

A consultation process was conducted from December 7, 2022 to January 30, 2023 with the findings published in a report last week.

The government invited members of the public to contribute to an online survey as an opportunity for feedback on the elections.

Councils were also invited to provide written submissions and eight of them did so.

Feedback from these councils noted that compulsory voting generated more interest in the election and prompted more voters to have their say.

Last year's council elections delivered a voter turnout of 84.8 per cent state-wide, with over 120,000 more votes returned than in the previous 2018 elections.

Kingborough was slightly above the state-wide average with a response rate of 86.32 per cent.

This also posed challenges, with the councils that participated in

the survey noting this led to an increased demand on council staff and resources.

"Far greater support [is required] for local councils to provide for those voting at council offices, particularly in the last days of the voting period," the report stated.

The councils noted in the report there was an intensive demand on councils' customer service teams throughout the election period, in comparison to previous elections.

Some councils reportedly incurred a higher cost to administer and support the election process.

Minister for Local Government Nic Street said "A review of local government voting arrangements is now progressing to ensure Tasmania's electoral provisions are contemporary and fit-for-purpose to improve future elections".

A public discussion paper will be released in the second half of this year.

The *Kingborough Chronicle* invited Kingborough Mayor Paula Wriedt

to reflect on the consultation report's findings.

"Kingborough Council agrees that the move to compulsory voting in local government elections has been positive," Cr Wriedt said.

"However, there were several challenges in the move to compulsory voting that could be overcome.

"As such, Council is very pleased that Minister Street has been proactive in initiating this review.

"Kingborough Council concerns relating to compulsory voting include the significant impost on council staff involved in collecting ballots, the challenges of a postal ballots being lost and the processes for issuing replacement papers.

"These challenges could be overcome by having a single in-person polling day for local government elections such as occurs for federal and state elections.

"We look forward to seeing recommendations and improvements made as a result of the review."

Supporting businesses

Kingborough Council is developing the main street of Kingston, Channel Highway to improve the retail and commercial experiences of residents and visitors.

Kingborough Mayor Paula Wriedt said Kingborough Council is concerned about the short-term loss of foot traffic into local businesses.

“Council has been working with local businesses affected by the road closure during the construction and post-construction phase,” Cr Wriedt said.

“Council staff have also been helping, using local businesses to cater for events, buying their meals locally and participating in weekly staff group lunches at affected businesses.

“Council has also waived fees and charges for affected food businesses where possible.”

At their recent meeting, Kingborough Council approved a one-time compensation payment of \$5000 to affected business owners along the Channel Highway who can demonstrate lost revenue.

“This payment is intended to offset the approximate average annual rates amount,” Cr Wriedt said.

“Council is working hard to support these businesses, but we also need our community’s help.

“All of these businesses are still accessible, and we implore our residents to keep shopping locally throughout the upgrade.

“Work continues on the upgrade, with new footpaths and the southern side of the Highway due to open in the coming days.

“Council would like to thank everyone for their continued patience and understanding during the CBD upgrade along Channel Highway in Kingston.”

A question was raised at the meeting regarding what clauses in the contract exist between the construction company responsible for delivering the roadworks and Kingborough Council that address significant delays in delivering the final outcome.

General Manager Gary Arnold said there have been no significant delays in delivering the construction project.

“However, there are contractual means of managing agreed extensions of time and/or other significant non-delivery of target timeframes,” Mr Arnold said.

Tassie Mums nomination

Tassie Mums has been nominated for the 2023 Tasmanian Community Achievement Awards.

The Community Group Award recognises groups that make a significant contribution to their community. These community groups share a strong sense of team spirit, and play a vital role in enhancing the social, economic, commercial and environmental prosperity of their region.

Whether it be working together on an event, restoration project, providing a service or program, it is important to recognise and encourage these groups, as their efforts help to make our communities stronger and more vibrant.

Tassie Mums said in this financial year alone they have supported 80 social service and health organisations to provide everyday essentials to over 1700 Tasmanian children in need.

Cultural burning

The Tasmanian Government has allocated \$1.3 million to support cultural burning in Tasmania.

"The government has been working with Tasmanian Aboriginal people to develop a policy and procedures for cultural burning on land managed by the Tasmanian Parks and Wildlife Service, supported by Aboriginal Fire Officers," Minister for Aboriginal Affairs and Parks Roger Jaensch said.

The policy released last week aims to reinstate a cultural burning program to protect and enhance natural and cultural values on the land, enable and empower Tasmanian Aboriginal people and organisations to undertake cultural burning on the land, and through collaborative working relationships, share knowledge of culture and burning practices.

"The procedures also outline the approval processes, statutory requirements, and minimum standards for the management of work health and safety and environmental risks," Minister Jaensch said.

An Aboriginal Fire Coordinator and two Aboriginal Fire Officers will be appointed to implement the new policy and procedures.

These important roles will also engage with Tasmanian Aboriginal people and organisations to identify areas suitable for cultural burning, facilitate approval for Aboriginal organisations to undertake cultural burning, and identify and facilitate Aboriginal people to be involved in Parks' planned burning program.

The recruitment process for these positions began on Friday, June 9.

It's about whether we should change the Constitution to recognise the First Peoples of Australia by setting up an Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Voice. A referendum is the only way to change the Australian Constitution.

What is the Voice?

The Voice would be a permanent body that gives independent advice to the Australian Parliament and Government on matters that affect First Nations people.

The Voice aims to help the Parliament and Government to make better decisions and deliver better outcomes for First Nations people.

How will the Voice be set up?

How it's set up would be determined after the referendum with input from First Nations people, the broader public and the Government. The Parliament would then make a law to set up the Voice.

The intention is that its members will be chosen by and representative of, Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people from across Australia.

Seagrass presentation at Kingborough Community Hub

The Kingborough Community Hub recently hosted PhD candidate Kelsie Fractal, who delivered a presentation on seagrass, supported by OzFish Unlimited and Natural Resource Management South (NRM South). Kelsie discussed some of her work on seagrass restoration in Tasmania. Senior Project Officer with OzFish Unlimited Vere Michiels discussed the importance of habitats such as seagrass

in supporting healthy fish populations. NRM South Senior Project Officer Grace Isdale explained the role of environmentally friendly moorings in protecting and restoring seagrass, as well as the negative impact of traditional chain moorings. Participants were able to get a closer look at seagrass cores on display.

New number plates for Tasmanian vehicles

The Tasmanian Government is set to make Tasmanian number plates more secure with new holographic markings to be incorporated into the design. Minister for Infrastructure and Transport Michael Ferguson said directional security marks will be embedded into number plates when they are made, which means they can't be removed physically or chemically. "This means it will be nearly impossible for fraudulent plates to be made, making identification of illegal plates much easier," Mr Ferguson. "There are a number of reasons some people may seek to make unauthorised reproductions or fake plates but in general it would be for illicit reasons to avoid identification. "Appearing similar to the holographic authentication marks on driver licences, the symbols are embedded in

the retro-reflective sheeting used in making authentic number plates. "They are visible to a viewer standing about two metres behind a vehicle looking down to the rear plate but disappear when the viewer moves to one side or the other from the viewing position. "Importantly, the marks are verifiable in diffuse daylight and by retro-reflected light at night. "Initially the marks will be applied to regular vehicle and trailer plates as well as government vehicle and trailer plates and we are currently examining having them applied to custom and personalised plates. "Vehicle owners don't need to take any action and the new feature will be rolled out on new plates and as existing plates are renewed or replaced normally. "Importantly, this new security feature will not increase the cost for new plates in Tasmania."

Now that it is winter police are urging anyone planning on bushwalking to plan and be prepared.

"With winter here it's timely to remind anyone planning on bushwalking or entering alpine areas to plan and be prepared," said Detective Inspector Steve Jones.

"It's imperative that anyone planning on bushwalking is aware of the weather forecast and suitably prepared for all conditions including sub-zero temperatures.

"When walking in elevated and alpine areas the temperature can change quickly.

"The day may be warm and fine when commencing a walk but change rapidly as weather patterns move through and light reduces.

"It's a priority to carry equipment to keep you safe and enable contact with emergency services if you require assistance.

"Mobile phones should not be relied on as a single source of communication and navigation.

"Batteries will not last as long when cold, and mobile navigation apps deplete batteries quicker than other apps.

"Police suggest walkers carry physical maps and not rely solely on mobile phones for navigation.

"Walkers are also encouraged to carry a

battery bank to recharge mobile devices, and a torch per person.

"Personal Locator Beacons should be carried, but they are a one-way communication device.

"Police and rescue agencies will always respond to requests for assistance, but it's important to remember that if you require assistance, rescue helicopters are not a magical solution - in bad weather, aircraft are often not able to fly due to conditions and ground crews could be hours away.

"Carrying suitable equipment will ensure you can remain safe until help arrives if required."

Police urge bushwalkers:

- Ensure you're prepared with appropriate equipment - take a map and torch, clothing and footwear to suit any conditions, regardless of the season take a waterproof jacket, adequate food and water, first aid kit.

- Research the intended trip - ensure the trip is within your abilities and fitness level, and you have a route plan, map and check the expected weather forecast.

- Let someone know before you go - ensure someone knows your route and expected return time.

- Always carry a fully charged mobile phone and a PLB and consider a portable charger to extend battery life.

Kingborough Mayor Paula Wriedt said "Certainly it is something that I would like to see us repeat".

"So I think probably every second year might be a more appropriate time frame for the event."

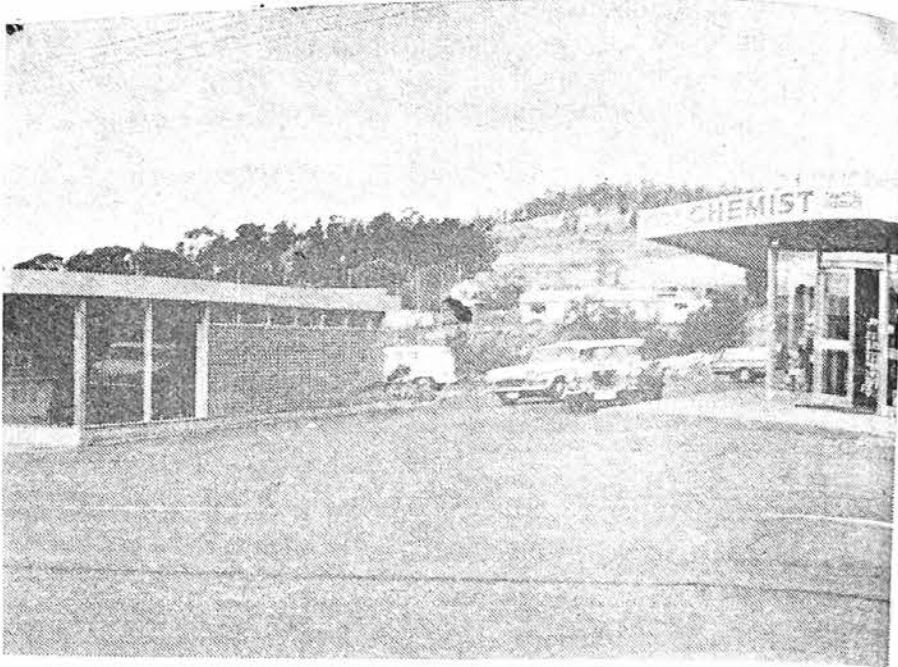

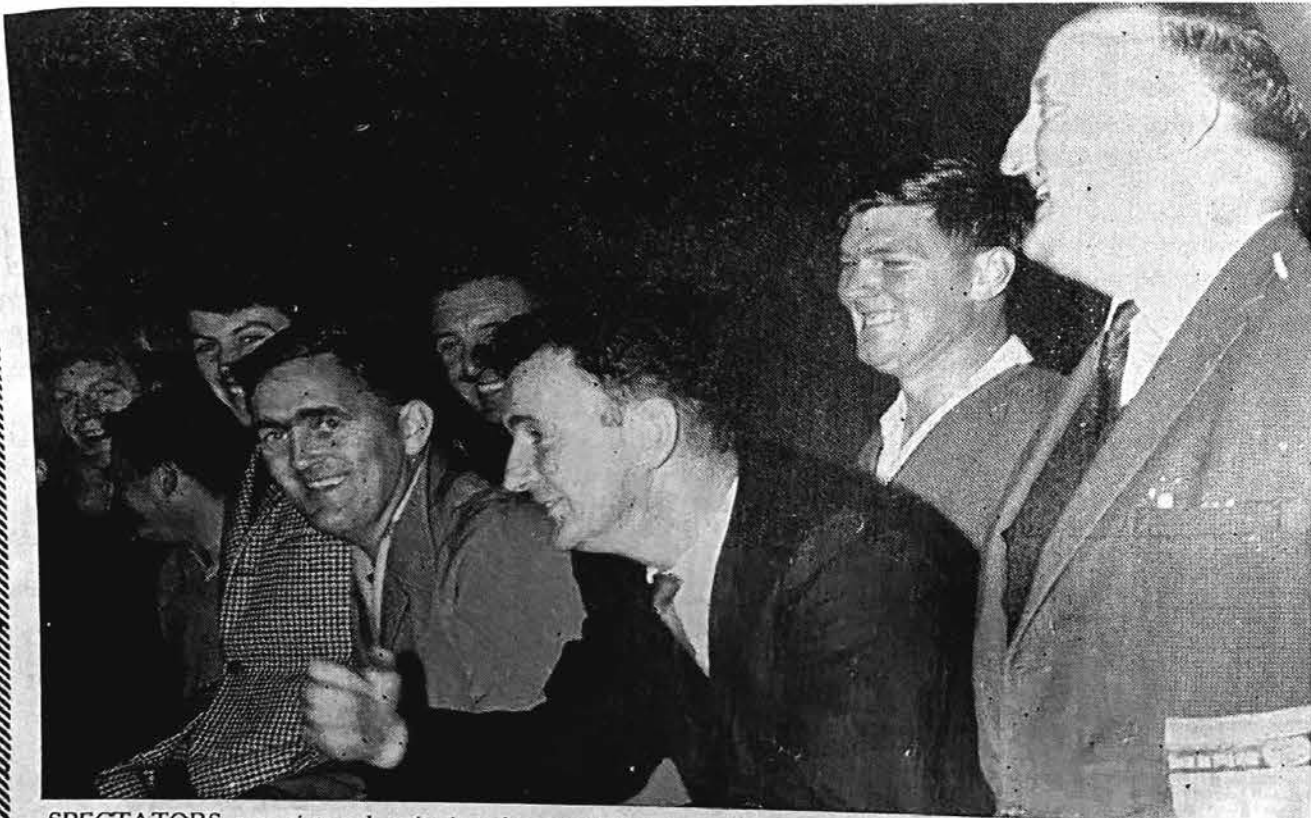

Kingborough gymnasts going international

Based on the results of the 2023 Australian Gymnastics Championships, seven Kingborough gymnasts have been selected to represent Australia in three different international competitions being held next month.

Leuca McLeod and Amber French have been selected to contest two Fédération Internationale de Gymnastique (FIG) World Cup events being held in Santarem and Coimbra, Portugal from July 1-8.

Amber will make her senior international debut in Portugal alongside the Australian Women's Double-Mini team who were crowned World Champions at the 2022 World Championships in Bulgaria last year.

Amber will step into this gold medal winning team in Portugal in the hopes of impressing selectors for her inclusion in the 2023 World Championships being held in England in November.

Leuca McLeod will compete in his first World Cup for Individual Trampoline, after winning the silver medal in Portugal last year.

Leuca will be the youngest member of the team and will be hoping to land himself in the semi-final at both World Cup events.

The World Cup event being held in Coimbra will be the first Olympic Games qualification event for the 2024 Paris Olympics.

A little closer to home, five more gymnasts will represent Australia in the Trans-Tasman Challenge being held in Tauranga, New Zealand from July 5-8.

Matthew French and Tristan Styles will represent in the Senior International Men's division, Matthew for Individual Trampoline and Double-Mini, while Tristan will compete in Double-Mini Trampoline only.

Axel Murden and Billy French will represent Australia in the 17-21 years Men's Double-Mini Trampoline event and Individual Trampoline event respectively, while Rohan Wilcox will compete in the 15-16 years Men's Individual and Double-Mini Trampoline events.

All seven gymnasts will be looking for selection into the Australian team to contest the 2023 World Championships and World Age Championships in Birmingham, England in November.
