Traffic debate for transit lane

Minister for Infrastructure and Transport Michael Ferguson has announced the next stage in the construction of the Southern Outlet transit lane will begin this summer.

"We have developed a staging of work, starting from where the traffic is the heaviest in the city and working our way back," Minister Ferguson said.

"Advice is that this will maximise the flow on the Macquarie and Davey Street couplet in the first instance with continued congestion improvement as we work our way back to Olinda Grove."

Franklin MPs Dean Winter and David O'Byrne have raised some concerns.

"The problem with the project is the massive disruption it is going to cause while the work is done and the modelling shows the work will only save 90 seconds of travel time when the project is finished anyway," Mr Winter said.

"It seems like a very expensive way to get people closer to the bottleneck at Macquarie Street."

Mr David O'Byrne said whilst he welcomes any initiative that will increase the efficiency of public transport, the major issue is this bottleneck.

"Spending tens of millions of dollars on a public transport solution alone, putting aside the crisis that Metro is now in, will not deal with the fundamental cause of the traffic gridlock, that being the bottleneck at the bottom of the Southern Outlet," Mr O'Byrne said.

Minister Ferguson said "We will focus on initial preparation works for the transit lane, construction of the Macquarie and Davey Streets Bus Improvements project and the transit lane connector between Davey and Macquarie Streets".

"We are doing this work first to minimise traffic impacts when the major construction on the additional transit lane starts."

Local awards for hospitality

Three Kingborough organisations were recognised at the Tasmanian Hospitality Association (THA) Awards for Excellence last week.

Longley International Hotel received gold for the Best Live Music or Entertainment Venue, Cricket Hub Tasmania received silver for Best RSL, Sporting or Community Club and Cellarbrations Kingston received bronze for Best Retail Liquor Outlet.

Competition was fierce with more than 200 venues from around the state submitting almost 500 overall entries.

"The quality and volume of the nominations this year reached unprecedented levels," THA Chief Executive Officer Steve Old said.

"All our winners will now get the opportunity to represent Tasmania at the AHA National Awards at Adelaide Oval on November 27."

We were on the right track before

Dear Editor,

In reply to Jane Wilson's reply (October 3) to my earlier letter, while I always appreciate others opinions wholeheartedly, and it is healthy for society to discuss important topics like the housing crisis, I must reiterate that I still see that we are going well over the top with unit development.

I still believe the unit revolution of high and medium density is feeding into the housing crisis and homelessness couch surfing.

While I am very happy to hear your unit living has worked out well, I can't help but be concerned.

I have heard way more horror stories regarding unit living than positive ones, so many in fact that I find unit living to be a major concern for society.

I really don't think it breeds a wholesome outcome.

What also concerns me, in response to Brian Cadell (October 3) is that we are not building outward enough, with large tracts of outer area land either locked up or simply not used.

I feel we are damaging the environment with such dense suburb development with far too many units.

I see way too much concrete that comes with high density/medium density, and nowhere near enough trees and grass, whereas in a home like mine and many around it we have massive amounts of grass.

Not only that, I've planted around 80 trees around my home.

This does incredible positives for the environment, carbon soak up for example, and is cooler in summer.

This simply cannot happen to a large enough degree in unit developments.

I also believe we need to go outward even more, designing smart satellite suburbs, with the traditional ratio of land/home that was seen in the 70s and 80s, and with far less units than we are currently building.

I believe this would have an environmentally positive impact, with not only greenscape between the satellite suburbs, but also greenscape companioning each home like we used to in the past.

We have an environmental emergency, and I don't think high and medium density units are the solution.

We were on the right track back in the 60s, 70s and 80s, and I believe society just does not realise it yet.

Road Safety Forum for Channel Highway

Labor Member for Franklin Dean Winter is hosting a community meeting for Channel residents to discuss concerns over the Channel Highway.

Mr Winter said Channel locals have been sharing with him their frustration that the Channel Highway is not fit to serve the fast-growing region.

The Channel Road Safety Forum will take place at Snug Hall on October 22.

"People have raised road safety issues for a long time," Mr Winter said.

"The Channel is attracting a lot of new residents and that means more traffic, and we need a main

road that can cater for that."

Mr Winter said there are flashpoints along the highway, and many were identified in the Government's own corridor study.

"This month marks three years since that report looked at the stretch between Algona Road and Sandfly Road," Mr Winter said.

"The report recommends some basic safety measures such as widening road shoulders and changing the speed limit near the notoriously bad Howden Road intersection.

"These do not involve high-end engineering."

Further south, residents in Kettering and Snug have

campaigning for safer crossings in built-up areas.

Back in 2021 they collected hundreds of signatures in a petition Mr Winter tabled in Parliament, but the Government rejected it.

Currently, locals are campaigning for the shared bicycle and pedestrian path to be extended from Snug to Coningham.

"Just think how popular the existing shared path from Margate to Snug is," Mr Winter said.

"People want to ride a bike and walk, but only when it is safe to do so.

"These communities deserve infrastructure that is up to the task."

Elise Archer resigns from Cabinet

Attorney General of Tasmania and Minister for Justice Elise Archer has resigned from Cabinet following allegations of workplace bullying and inappropriate behaviour.

Premier Jeremy Rockliff requested Ms Archer's resignation and said an independent investigation has been launched into these allegations.

"If culture is to change in this state, it requires leadership and accountability starting at the top, no matter how difficult those decisions might be," Premier Rockliff said.

A new Cabinet lineup was announced last week with Minister Guy Barnett appointed as the new Attorney-General and Minister for Justice.

Included in these Cabinet changes, Liberal Member

for Windermere Nick Dugian has been appointed as a new Cabinet member and Franklin MP Dean Young has become the Parliamentary Secretary for Small Business and Industry.

The new ministry was sworn in at Government House on Tuesday, October 3.

Ms Archer also resigned from Parliament following an ultimatum from Premier Rockliff.

"The only way Parliament resumes is if Ms Archer resigns as she initially committed, or she provides a written guarantee of confidence and supply," the Premier said.

"We will not be returning to Parliament unless either of these two actions occurs."

Ms Archer was a long-standing member of the Liberal

Party and was first elected to Parliament in 2010.

She was the first female Speaker of the Tasmanian Parliament and served in the Cabinet from 2017.

"I am particularly proud of my achievements as the first female Speaker in the House of Assembly, and significantly in law reform over the last five years," Ms Archer said.

"I depart knowing that despite the events of recent days, this law reform will hopefully endure as my legacy for the people of Tasmania and my community, who I have loved serving over the last 13 years."

Ms Archer's resignation from Parliament means a recount will be required in the Clark electorate.

Simon Behrakis is anticipated to be Ms Archer's replacement.



Bushfire smoke alert

A smoke alert message for Valley View Road, Margate, Electrona and Snug was issued on October 4 in response to a bushfire at Longmans Road, Margate.

There was no threat to communities but smoke from the fire was visible around Margate, Electrona and Snug.

Blasting on the Channel Highway

Blasting will happen between Rays Court and Maddocks Road between 1pm and 2pm on October 11 and 14, weather permitting.

Traffic will be stopped in both directions and delays of up to 30 minutes are expected.

The blasting is part of early works for a planned roundabout to service Homes Tasmania's new residential subdivision in Huntingfield.

The roundabout will provide direct access to Channel Highway for residents in the subdivision.

Updates on the works will be provided on the RoadsTas Facebook page and electronic message signs on the highway if there are any changes.







Van Diemen's Band to tour Tasmania

Van Diemen's Band (VDB) will be touring Tasmania between Friday, October 20 and Saturday, October 28.

Borderlands, Van Diemen's Band's acclaimed and deeply moving musical examination of the lines that have both divided and united humanity, is visiting Franklin, Tullah, Hawley Beach, Stanley, Scottsdale, St Helens and Hobart, and being broadcast on Australian Digital Concert Hall on Wednesday, November 1.

After 19 performances across mainland Australia and New Zealand in 2022, VDB finally brings home to Tasmania its most critically acclaimed program to date for an eight-concert state-wide tour of ravishing Baroque music on original instruments.

Originally conceived in 2021 for Musica Viva Australia, *Borderlands* took on a prescient resonance and relevance a few weeks before opening night with Russia's invasion of Ukraine and the subsequent tightening of global geopolitical tensions.

"Our starting point had been the notion of cultural differences in music around the time of Europe's Thirty Years War during the 1600s," said VDB's Artistic Director Julia Fredersdorff.

"But as soon as the first missiles hit Kiev, *Borderlands* became something that spoke as much about now as it did about then.

"We quickly commissioned a new piece to be included, Donald Nicolson's *Spirals*, that incorporates a melody known to every Ukrainian and many Russians, a Slavonic Orthodox lament."

The seven-piece VDB line-up features the long-necked theorbo and the stunning harpsichord on its first road trip with its newly completed lid featuring a panorama of Indigenous flora designed by local artist Deborah Wace.

"There's a lot of kit to drive around for this show," said Fredersdorff.

"Even if *Borderlands* wasn't alluding to war, moving this group would still be a military exercise."

Fire permit period for southern Tasmania

The Tasmania Fire Service (TFS) declared that fire permits were required for southern municipalities recently.

"Following a review of current conditions, and in preparation for the bushfire season, if you wish to light a fire in the open in a southern municipality you will require a fire permit," said TFS Deputy Chief Officer Matt Lowe.

"An analysis of current conditions showed that moisture levels in the landscape are now very low in the southeast."

Southern municipalities are Brighton, Central Highlands, Clarence, Derwent Valley, Glamorgan Spring Bay, Glenorchy, Hobart, Huon Valley, Kingborough, Sorell, Southern Midlands, and Tasman.

"The fire permit period for southern municipalities does not stop landowners burning on their properties; however, it does require that landowners obtain a fire permit for any burn larger than one cubic meter in size on their property," said Deputy Chief Officer Lowe.

People wishing to burn on their property can apply to a TFS permit officer by contacting their local brigade or calling 1800 000 699.

Permits are free and contain clear conditions that will ensure any burn is conducted as safely as possible.

"The fire at Coles Bay in recent weeks is a timely example of how crucial it is to be informed and to

know how to access information that affects you and our local community," said Deputy Chief Officer Lowe.

"Know your risk, develop and practice bushfire plans, know how to access information through TasAlert, and review the community bushfire protection plan for your area.

"If you're ever faced with a situation where you need to evacuate due to bushfire, please be aware of the difference between an 'Evacuation Centre' and a 'Nearby Safer Place' to keep safe.

"An Evacuation Centre is a designated building, specifically selected to provide people with a safe shelter option, often with basic amenities; whereas a Safer Place is an area that provides shelter as a last resort - these are often designated areas outside."

You can visit fire.tas.gov.au to familiarise yourself with the community bushfire protection plan for your area.

Tasmania Parks and Wildlife Service (PWS) will continue to monitor conditions to determine when campfire restrictions are required.

"Bushfire risk reduction is a shared responsibility between fire agencies and the community, and everyone has a part to play," Tasmania Parks and Wildlife Service State Fire Manager Katy Edwards said.

Information will be available on the PWS website parks.tas.gov.au once campfire restrictions are introduced.
