Unwarranted and unacceptable

Dear Editor,

The following detections were made related to persons apprehended by police for driving a motor vehicle while exceeding the prescribed alcohol limit under the Road Safety (Alcohol and Drugs) Act, 1970:

- Driver 1 was intercepted on February 9 at Huonville at 8pm with an alcohol reading of 0.115.
- Driver 2 was intercepted on February 2 at Blackmans Bay at 9am with an alcohol reading of 0.203.

Some drivers are not to have any alcohol in their system when driving, whilst the majority of drivers are restricted to a limit of 0.05.

It is disappointing to see these detections as the motorists pose a significant risk to road users (i.e. you and your loved ones), not to mention themselves.

These risks taken by certain drivers are unwarranted and unacceptable and you will be caught and suffer the associated consequences in that you will not be driving for an extended period of time and suffer a significant financial penalty.

Police employ overt and covert methods to detect drink drivers.

But just as important, we want members of the public to continue to contact us to advise of risky behaviours by motorists on 131444 if time has passed, or 000 if time critical.

A powerful deterrent

Dear Editor,

How long is it going to take automotive manufacturers and government regulators to implement biometric security (fingerprint scanning or face ID) into cars so only the owner and authorised drivers can use the vehicle?

I've had this kind of technology on my desktop PC for 15 years or more, and it is not expensive to implement.

This would, for a start, stop a lot of vehicle theft (if not nearly all), and also give the driver some power to shut down the vehicle if they are being carjacked, and the thief would already know cars only start (restart) with the owner's fingerprint/face ID.

So it would also be a powerful deterrent once widely implemented.

Sure, I understand in the carjacking scenario it is not 100 per cent foolproof, but it would certainly help a lot.

We literally have this biometric security on our smartphones, but not on a vehicle, which can turn into a lethal weapon in the wrong hands, especially when stolen, as it is incredibly obvious criminals who steal cars also turn out to be some of the worst and most deadly drivers on the road.

Something needs to happen, as it is obvious from the news reports car theft is not only a huge problem, but it is also getting people killed.

High fire danger declared

Tasmania Fire Service urged Tasmanians to prepare for an increased fire danger last week.

"I urge the community to be aware that current weather conditions combined with a dry landscape mean that any fires lit today could spread easily and be dangerous and difficult to control," said Tasmania Fire Service Deputy (TFS) Chief Officer Matt Lowe.

The TFS put a temporary hold on issuing fire permits in the south and north of the state from February 12 until 2am Thursday, February 15.

While not declaring a total fire ban, TFS did ask people to think carefully before lighting campfires and using machinery, and if doing so, to be extremely cautious.

"Along with our fire partner agencies, Parks and Wildlife and Sustainable Timber Tasmania, we have firefighters, aircraft and incident management teams on standby and prepared to respond to any fires that may start," Mr Lowe said.

"While TFS has these measures in place, we also ask community members to take responsibility for keeping themselves and their neighbours safe.

"This responsibility extends to ensuring that any fires lit in recent days and weeks are fully extinguished to ensure they don't flare up and escape."

Deputy Chief Officer Lowe said the best way for Tasmanians to be prepared was to "review your bush-fire plan, be aware of your surroundings, keep up-to-date with warnings and report any fires to Triple Zero (000).

All details were correct at the time of writing, go to fire.tas.gov.au for the most up-to-date information.

Poker league wants reform

According to the **Gaming Control Act 1993**, only a licensed casino operator can run a poker game or tournament that involves wagering of money or anything of value.

This includes running an event where an entry fee is charged and prizes are won.

Running such an event without a licence is illegal.

Players in a social poker league took to Parliament Lawns and Civic Square recently asking the government to allow them to play in pubs and clubs.

Member for Franklin Dean Winter joined them to draw attention to the issue.

“For many years, poker leagues have offered Tasmanians an opportunity to come together and socialise face to face,” Mr Winter said.

“These games are played with low stakes and regular participants tell me they really enjoy them.

“Let’s be very clear on this, these are social games that have suddenly been deemed unlawful.

“I’m sure most of us support people’s right to go out and enjoy a social activity, even if it is not one they are necessarily interested in themselves.”

Mr Winter is also sponsoring an online petition in Parliament to allow poker games to continue.

Councillor Antolli to stand for Franklin

Kingborough Councillor Aldo Antolli officially declared his candidacy for the seat of Franklin standing for the Liberal Party.

Cr Antolli said the choice was solidified a few days before Christmas in conjunction with his family, driven by a deeply rooted passion for public service.

“My late father contributed to the construction of the Snowy Mountain Scheme as an engineer,” Cr Antolli said. “He was part of a migrant generation who helped build this country.”

Born to a Croatian refugee father and an Italian mother who fled post-World War Two Europe, he said his family legacy of dedication to community development influenced his vision for Tasmania’s future.

His decision to enter the political arena is driven by a broader vision for Tasmania’s future.

“With the expansion of Parliament, there is an evident need for capable and compassionate leadership in government,” Cr Antolli said.

“I want to help bring about a secure future for all Tasmanians, mine and your children included.”

Cr Antolli expounds a people-first approach to local government, advocating for reduced bureaucracy and red tape in planning, increased individual freedom and robust social support.

“Regardless of your political stance, I hope you resonate with my people-first approach to local government that I want to take into Parliament,” Cr Antolli said.

“I am committed to keeping my roles as a candidate and independent councillor politically separate.

“By laying down two roles for just one in Parliament, I

am certainly not doing this for the money, but to make sure the new Parliament has a strong voice for those who are vulnerable and for the wisdom of a fair and strong economy in Tasmania.”

Cr Antolli’s CV includes his role as the CEO of Pathways Tasmania Limited, a Tasmania charity that works with the homeless.

Pathways Tasmania is a non-profit organisation located in southern Tasmania that provides specialty disability support services for people with developmental needs, residential addiction recovery programs, and a long-term shelter for homeless young males aged 13 to 20.

“The fulfilment I’ve experienced in these roles, both as a community representative and the CEO of Pathways Tasmania, has been immeasurable,” Cr Antolli said.

Meriem is a passionate advocate for suicide prevention and mental health awareness.

She channels her dedication into a range of roles and fundraising activities that have seen her nominated in the SPEAK UP! Stay ChatTY - Outstanding Contribution to Suicide Prevention by a Young Person category.

In 2023, Meriem was announced as Tasmanian Young Australian of the Year.

A record 30 individuals and organisations were nominated over five award categories across the state, each with a focus on creating belonging and reducing suicide rates in Tasmania.

Relationships Australia Tasmania CEO Dr Michael Kelly said he was delighted by the number of nominees and their stories of dedication and contribution to suicide prevention in Tasmania.

"The Tasmanian LiFE Awards are based on the national LiFE framework," Dr Kelly said.

"LiFE stands for 'Living is For Everyone' and recog-

nises that suicide prevention is a whole-of-community responsibility and promotes collaborative action by all Australians.

"I am always inspired by the willingness of community members to help those in need and to do their part to prevent suicide and support those affected by it."

The Men's Table was also nominated in the Lifeline Tasmania - Communities in Action for Suicide Prevention category.

Other nominees include the Build Up Tassie Team, the Eureka Clubhouse, Short of a Sheet, and the Retired Police Association of Tasmania.

Relationships Australia Tasmania provide families, couples, individuals, older people, children and communities with tools and strategies so that they have healthy, positive lives.

They help more than 8000 Tasmanians every year to transform and change their lives through counselling, mediation, dispute resolution, support and training.

The winners of this year's LiFE Awards will be announced at the LiFE Awards ceremony on March 21 at Crowne Plaza in Hobart.

Undine takes to the water

The Wooden Boat Centre has completed restoration of the historic boat, the *Undine* and relaunched her at Oyster Cove Marina recently.

The significant restoration project took hundreds of hours and was led by Shipwright Cody Horgan, students and volunteers from the Wooden Boat Centre.

The Derwent Class vessel was donated to the Australian Wooden Boat Festival (AWBF) in poor condition, by the Oyster Cove Marina in 2020.

The AWBF then gained philanthropic funding to support the restoration project.

The Derwent Class yachts date back to the 1920s, as they were a style of yacht that could be built by amateur builders and inexperienced yachties as entry-level vessels.

Undine was originally built in a suburban backyard, in Pirie Street, New Town by Don Colbourn in 1948.

It is hoped *Undine* will join the fleet of several Derwent Class yachts sailing out of Kettering, with young custodians at the helm.

Liberal Member for Franklin Dean Young said this occasion offered an important opportunity to connect with Tasmania's proud maritime history.

"Being around, on, or in the water is in the blood of Tasmanians and for a great deal of our history this was done via expertly crafted Tasmanian wooden boats," Mr Young said.

"It was amazing, some 76 years after work began on the vessel, to see the *Undine* still in Tasmania and still seaworthy thanks to the work by the Wooden Boat Centre.

The Australian Wooden Boat Festival is biennial, with the next scheduled for 2025.

Community Survey results released

The results from the Tasmania Police Community Survey 2023 were released recently.

In November, Tasmania Police reached out to the community to get feedback on local crime and safety concerns, police performance and other issues.

More than 4000 responses were received from across the state.

"This is the first time we've asked our community to let us know their priorities, and we are listening," said Commissioner Donna Adams.

"We recognise the importance of trust and confidence in Tasmania Police.

"We cannot do our job without the support of our community.

"It's been gratifying, and challenging, to hear directly from our community on what they feel is important and how we are performing our roles."

The top safety concerns for Tasmanians are youth crime issues, theft from homes and public order and safety.

Other community safety concerns identified included drugs and alcohol related issues, vehicle theft, road safety and family violence.

The top suggestions from the community for improving safety were greater police presence or visibility, more police patrols and more work done to address youth crime issues.

The majority of respondents felt most safe in their own homes, followed by outside in the community during the day.

However, feelings of safety in the community at night and on public transport were very low.

Respondents also reported they felt crime in their community had increased over the past 12 months.

The survey also asked respondents about their experiences with police and perceptions of how police do their job and met their core values.

On the whole, members of the public were more confident that Tasmania Police can deliver policing services.

Perceptions of Tasmania Police were positive for the

qualities of professional, trustworthy and honest, compassionate and fair and equitable.

Agreement that Tasmania Police exhibit the organisation's core values of respect, integrity and support was strong overall.

However, respondents indicated they are less confident that Tasmania Police are both accountable and visible in their communities.

"Clearly, we have some work to do with this important community feedback," said Commissioner Adams.

"We also acknowledge the community's concerns about being accountable and visible in the community.

"We are committed to being transparent and accountable for our actions."

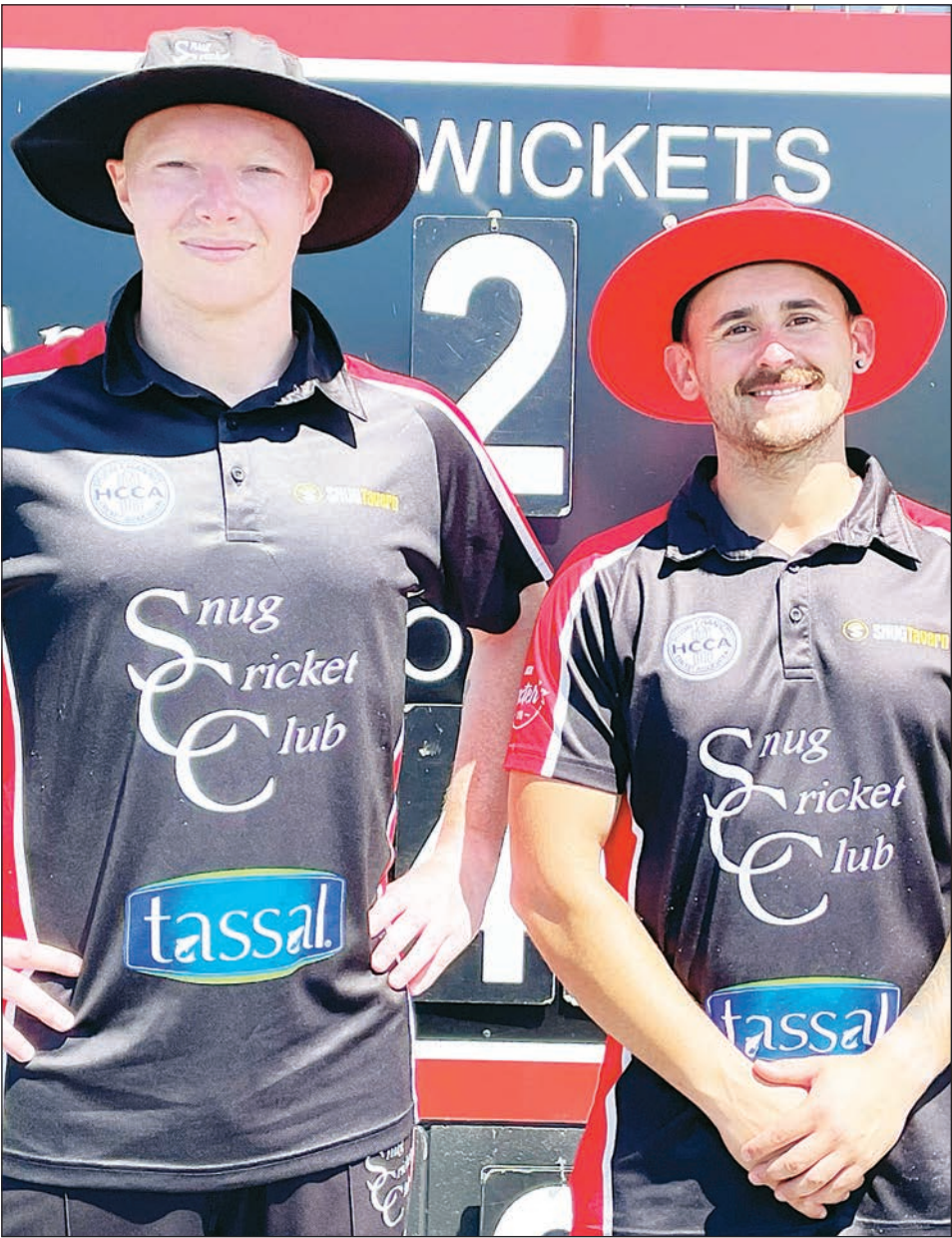
