Council consider new method of calculating rates

Dear Editor,
Hobart Council is considering changing their method
of calculating rates.
Up until now council rates have been measured on the
'Assessed Annual Value' (AAV).
Hobart Council has published a 24-page booklet titled
Rating Review Options 2023-2024.
One of the strategies apparently favoured by the
Council is looking at calculating rates based on 'Capital
Value Rating' (CVR).
Business owners are very anxious about this option,
concerned this change would unfairly increase
commercial yearly rates and the costs passed on to the
consumer.
In other words, prices for goods and services will
further add to price pressures for average Tasmanians.
If this council is considering such a change, we must
assume their income will increase at the expense of
homeowners.
Kingborough Council is examining these methods of
collecting greater income regardless of the cost-of-living
pressures already impacting ratepayers.
Contact your local councillors now to see how you
may be affected.

Questions regarding conflicts of interest

Dear Editor,
In February 2023 the ABC News website advised that
political lobbying in Tasmania is opaque and that
Tasmanians currently have little information about who
is lobbying their politicians and decision-makers, what
their meetings are about and who is trying to get spec-
ific policy outcomes.
At that time, Tasmania had 66 registered lobbyists,
some of whom have a long list of clients who could be
paying fees to gain access to the state's key decision-
makers in the hope of influencing policy, legislation,
contracts and funding allocations.
The Tasmanian Integrity Commission advised at the
time "Lack of transparency and accountability in lobby-
ing activities risks eroding public trust that decisions are
being made fairly and in the public interest, and that
there may be an imbalance towards decisions being
made due to powerful minority interests."
"The use of the term 'powerful minority interests' is
deliberate.
"Any system of lobbying oversight mustn't stifle legit-
imate political discourse or the ability of individuals and
community members to advocate for their interests to
(public representatives)."
The *Handbook for Elected Members in the Tasmanian
House of Assembly* in section 3.8 'Conflict of Interest'
states, "A conflict of interest arises where the private
interests of an individual conflict with the workplace
activity that the individual is involved in.
"A private interest can include anything that brings
benefits or disadvantages to the individual, their family,
friends, associates or even political opponents.
"A conflict of interest can be actual or perceived; there
may be a direct conflict, for example, an individual or
relative has shares in a company that quotes for servic-
es being sought, or a business owned by a family mem-
ber is used.
"A perceived conflict of interest is where a third party
might reasonably believe that a conflict of interest exists
between private and workplace activities regardless if
this is the case or not.
"For example, if an individual gives approval for a pur-
chase from a business owned by their friend.
"It is important that all conflicts of interest are declared
and managed appropriately, depending on the risk".
At the very top of the current *Tasmanian Register of
Political Lobbyist* updated January 25 is one Eric Abetz.
Ex-senator Abetz is now a confirmed Liberal Party
candidate in the coming Tasmanian election on March
23 in the seat of Franklin.
As a registered political lobbyist Mr. Abetz lists Bass
Rock Quarries Pty. Ltd., Karen and Michael Williamson of
Murdunna, King Island Marine Research, Makarna
Grazing Company and Mt. Oriel Breadalbane Pty. Ltd as
his clients on the freely open and available public web-
site.
A question I would like answered is how is Mr Abetz
going to juggle these clients' interests during any term
of office he may hold, if elected, as against the rest of
the Tasmanian elector's interests?
Another question I have for the Integrity Commission is
how can a political lobbyist hold political office and be a
political lobbyist at the same time without any conflict of
interest?

Total fire ban for southern Tasmania

With hot weather, dry and windy conditions and extreme fire danger forecast last week, Tasmania Fire Service (TFS) initiated a hot day response across the state, and a total fire ban was declared for southern Tasmania on February 21.

Deputy Chief Officer Matt Lowe said the total fire ban was in effect for southern Tasmania from 2am Thursday, February 22 until 2am Saturday, February 24.

“This meant no fires were permitted in the open in southern Tasmania, including incinerators, burn-offs, campfires, fire pots, and wood-fuelled barbecues,” he said.

On February 20, the TFS suspended fire permits in the southern region of Tasmania due to the high fire danger.

“These measures were designed to protect our communities and keep people safe, and we appreciated everyone’s understanding and cooperation,”

Mr Lowe said.

The fire danger rating forecasts were high for most districts on Thursday and Friday.

“Our state-wide hot day response doubled the initial brigade response to any fires that occurred and our aerial firefighting fleet remained on hand, ready to respond and support ground crews across Tasmania,” Mr Lowe said.

The total fire ban applied to Kingborough, Huon Valley, Hobart, Brighton, Central Highlands, Clarence, Derwent Valley, Glamorgan Spring Bay, Glenorchy, Sorell, Southern Midlands and Tasman municipalities.

A total fire ban means it is illegal to light or cause a fire in the open.

People are reminded to check all fires they may have had on their property, including any campfires, to ensure they are fully extinguished and check their bushfire survival plan.

Fern Tree water on world stage

After being crowned the 2023 IXOM Best Tasting Tap Water in Australia, Fern Tree’s TasWater water competed in the 34th Annual International Water Tasting last weekend in Berkeley Springs, West Virginia, USA.

“Representing the nation is a proud moment for TasWater, and having previously won the award for world’s best in 2021, we know the international judges like the taste of Tasmanian water,” TasWater Manager Water Quality Stephen Westgate said.

“Our specially packed water samples were sent to the USA two weeks ago to take part in this weekend’s blind-taste test alongside water from across the world.”

Sourced from rainfall and snowmelt off kunanyi / Mount Wellington, the pure taste and clarity of Fern Tree’s water has long been celebrated by locals for its exceptional quality.

A panel of judges sipped samples sent from 60 countries in a range of different categories.

The tasting kicked off Saturday local time in Berkeley Springs, West Virginia, which meant an early start for Stephen watching the webcast from home in southern

Tasmania.

“Getting this right is a balancing act that we do well in Tasmania,” Stephen said.

“TasWater has won the award for Australia’s best tasting water three times, for Fern Tree, Barrington and Rossarden.

“Rossarden then won the world’s best award in 2021.

“To be back in the running just three years later is a great achievement for us, and really demonstrates the care we take with each drop we produce.

“Having clean and pure water sources helps, but we need the best treatment processes to back that up, and last year we invested nearly \$120M in water treatment across the state to make sure great tasting, safe and reliable drinking water is delivered to all our customers.”

The event was livestreamed on the Berkeley Springs International Water Tasting Facebook page, with the winner of Best Tasting Tap Water announced at around lunchtime Sunday, February 25 AEST.

Jessie’s friend and collaborator, Anne Morgan, a Tasmanian children’s author and coordinator of the Tasmanian chapter of the Society for Children’s Book Writers and Illustrators (SCBWI) said that Jessie was an enabler, content to make things happen behind the scenes.

“The literary world and the Bruny Island community have lost one of their staunchest champions,” Anne said.

“Jessie Mahjouri, my close friend and collaborator in

kid lit adventures, died unexpectedly last Thursday, three days after a massive stroke.

“She was an enabler, content to make things happen behind the scenes.

“And make them happen she did.

“This marvellous woman lit up the lives of everyone she met and made the world a better place.

“Heartfelt sympathy to Rod, Nadia and the rest of the family she adored.”

Concern about stroke knowledge trends

New Stroke Foundation data has revealed that only 62 per cent of Australians know at least one sign of stroke and awareness of one of the most common signs of stroke, facial droop, has dropped.

Stroke Foundation’s F.A.S.T. (Face, Arms, Speech, Time) national awareness survey found that, compared to last year, Australians’ overall awareness of stroke signs has stagnated.

While 39 per cent of Australians know that facial droop is a sign of stroke, that is one per cent fewer than last year.

Stroke Foundation Chief Executive Officer Dr Lisa Murphy said Australia can’t afford to be going backwards when it comes to recognising a stroke.

“This is not the way we’d like to see the data shifting,” Dr Murphy said.

“It’s concerning because when fewer people know the signs of stroke, more lives are at risk.

“We know that recognising the common signs of stroke saves lives.

“The faster someone can recognise a stroke, the sooner specialist, time-critical treatment is received.

“Minutes are the difference between life or death and living well after a stroke or having lifelong disability.”

Every year, the Stroke Foundation surveys thousands of Australians on their knowledge of the F.A.S.T. signs of stroke.

The F.A.S.T. acronym highlights the three most common signs of stroke (facial droop (F), inability to lift both arms (A) and slurred speech (S)).

The T stands for time, as a reminder that there is no time to waste, stroke is a medical emergency.

Take action and call triple zero (000) at the first sign of stroke.

“The F.A.S.T. acronym is an easy and effective way to remember the signs of stroke,” said Dr Murphy.

“Just by knowing the signs and recognising a stroke, you could save a life.”

When a stroke strikes, it kills up to 1.9 million brain cells per minute and, in Australia, a first-time stroke occurs every 19 minutes.

A Taste of the Huon back for 2024

A Taste of the Huon launched their festival on Wednesday, February 22 in the lead up to a big weekend on March 10 and 11 at the showgrounds at Ranelagh.

Organisers expect in excess of 20,000 locals and visitors to enjoy the festival over its two day run.

This will be the 31st edition of the festival that celebrates the best of the Huon region's food, beverage, arts, craft and entertainment.

Minister for Stadia and Events Nic Street said the Huon has always been famous for its apples, giving Tasmania the world-renowned name of the Apple Isle.

"Now it's known for so much more than that," said Minister Street.

"Salmon, mushrooms, vineyards, cideries, a huge range of fruit and of course incredible Tasmanian truffles all come from the region, and there's no better place to try them all than A Taste of the Huon."

Entertainment this year is headlined by local favourites The Wolfe Brothers and the world's number one Abba tribute show, Björn Again.

The Tasmanian Government supports A Taste of the Huon through a three-year \$82,000 funding partnership.

Liberal Member for Franklin Dean Young further welcomed the investment for this tremendous event.

"There really is something for everyone at A Taste of the Huon," Mr Young said.

Candidates asked to support volunteers

Volunteering Tasmania has asked for a commitment from the major parties and support from independents to invest in the critical volunteering industry through sustainable peak body funding.

Significant organisations and events in Kingborough like the Kingborough Community Missions and the Kingston parkrun rely on the assistance of volunteers.

In a recently released statement, Volunteering Tasmania said in the last four years formal volunteering participation dropped by 11 per cent.

"This represents a loss of 15,000 workers in the face of increasing community demand for the services and supports delivered by volunteers," the statement said.

"332,100, or 68.9 per cent of Tasmanians over 15 volunteer, making Tasmania's volunteer workforce the largest in the state.

"Yet structural funding challenges have escalated a

decline in available formal volunteers.

"If this trend continues we will see a gap of 42 per cent between the demand for and supply of volunteers by 2029.

"Tasmania's volunteering industry is in critical need of support and its peak body is not adequately funded to provide the programs and best practice infrastructure required to reverse the downward trend in formal volunteer participation.

"We cannot assume that volunteers will always be there, we need to act now to ensure that our communities aren't left without support as the need for volunteer support increases," Volunteers Tasmania said.

"We are asking those who volunteer, work with volunteers, or see the benefit that volunteers bring to their communities, to support Tasmania's volunteering industry by writing to their local candidate."

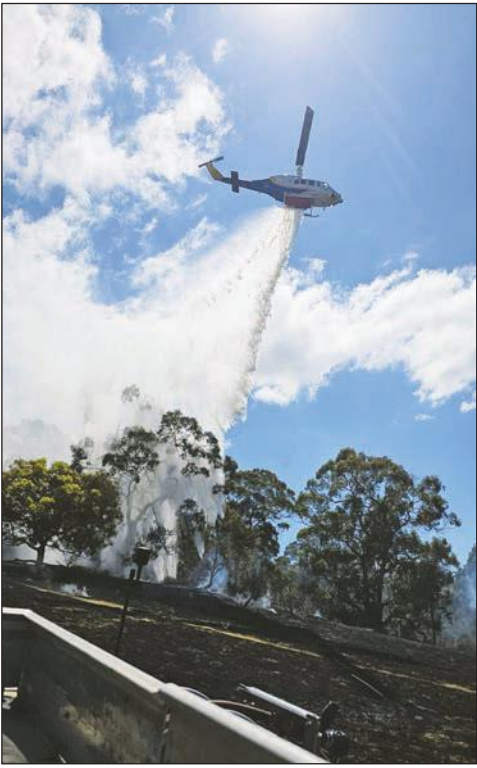

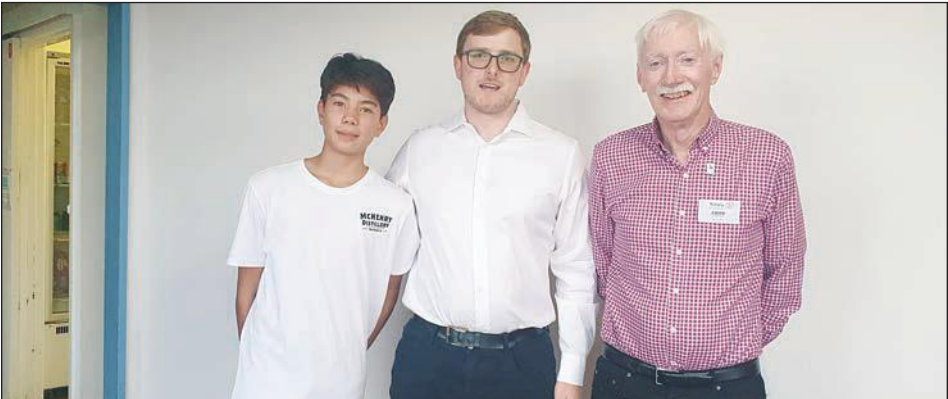

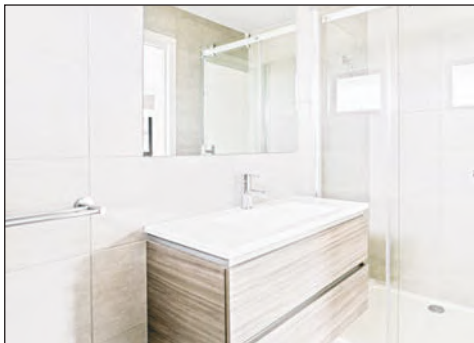

Government's No on Road Link

RECENTLY Huon Council asked the Minister for Public Works (Mr Michael Barnard), to consider a proposal to link the top ends of Braeside and Jacksons Roads, at South Franklin. The request has been negated.

The matter had been raised by the Minister for Education who had informed the Council that formation of a link between the top of Braeside and Jacksons Road would be a great convenience to the School Bus in the locality.

In a letter tabled on February 11th, Mr Barnard informed the Council that he had obtained a detailed report from the Director of Public Works on the proposal which would involve the acquisition of about half a mile of roadway and construction of some 1 1/4 miles extension of Jacksons Road. The cost of the work

made the proposal impracticable at the present time, Mr Barnard stated.

On the recommendation of the Works Committee, Huon Council has decided to make application for a Settlers Roads Grant for construction of a road to Mr Bruce Bond's property off Judds Creek Road.

It was decided also to install "No Parking" signs in the vicinity of the Huonville Schools.

At the request of the Council, Insp. Webberley attended the meeting to discuss the matter of having a "No Parking" reserve adjacent to the Schools and said that the Police appreciated the problem in Wilnot St.

It was decided to request the Transport Department to act in the matter.

The Council has decided to apply for \$10,000 for \$ for \$ sealing on Swamp Road in 1974-75.
