Frantically regrowing trees

Dear Editor,

For decades now, the Tasmanian Government-legislated forest industry, Forestry Tasmania, has been indiscriminately logging then burning public forests for the singular purpose of frantically regrowing trees for future harvest.

At a time when other states around Australia have put an end to native forest logging for the sake of human health, our threatened climate and endangered forest species, Forestry Tasmania continues to log native

forests and firestorm everything that is left on the forest floor.

More than half of the forests' biomass is left lying to waste on the ground after logging, which is then scraped into piles and burned to a crisp.

These post-logging infernos irreversibly damage the environment, kill wildlife, harm human health and release huge quantities of dangerous, climate-destroying pollution into the atmosphere.

Most people confuse fuel reduction burns with logging regeneration burns, and the forestry industry does

nothing to correct the confusion.

There is a monumental difference between the two types of burns.

Fuel reduction burns are essential for bushfire safety, but the sole purpose of forestry 'regen burns' is to regrow harvestable trees back as quickly as possible for future logging.

The destructive, harmful practice of native forest logging and post-logging burns must end now.

Kingston joins battle of the beets

The Tasmanian Institute of Agriculture's (TIA) Let it Grow vegetable growing competition returned for its second year, with Kingston High School one of the 12 schools that competed.

This year students put their agricultural science skills into practise with the aim of growing beetroots during a Tasmanian battle of the beets. Kingston High was unable to top Launceston Church

Grammar School's entry that weighed an impressive 602 grams.

The 12 schools' entries were judged at a weigh-in ceremony on Thursday, May 2.

The competition is designed to create excitement and generate interest about a career in agriculture.

Schools from throughout the state spent the last two-and-a-half months growing the vegetables from seeds

that were donated by Tasmanian small business Seed Freaks.

Director of the Tasmanian Institute of Agriculture Professor Mike Rose said it was a great opportunity to get students interested in agriculture.

"Students are able to see the fruits of their labour," he said.

"This is a great way to get students involved and

hopefully it will generate interest in a career in agriculture."

The winning entry from Launceston Church Grammar has earned the school a Subpod grow pack valued at over \$500 that includes a worm farm, garden bed, aerator and worm mats and a workshop at their school with one of TIA's soil scientists.

Second-hand smoke survey

Kingborough Council is seeking the community's feedback on whether second-hand smoke is a problem at Council owned spaces.

Kingborough Mayor Paula Wriedt said Council was asking if more smoke-free areas were needed to help address any potential issues.

"Smoke-free areas are controlled under the Public Health Act 1997 and were introduced to reduce the public's exposure to harmful second-hand smoke," Cr Wriedt said.

Areas which are currently declared smoke-free areas:

- Indoor restaurants and shops
- Within three metres of an entry to a public building
- Pedestrian malls

- Outdoor dining areas (at times when food can be eaten)
- Within 10 metres of playground equipment
- Bus malls; and
- Within three metres of bus shelters

"In these smoke-free areas you can't use any tobacco products such as electronic cigarettes like vapes, herbal cigarettes and non-tobacco cigarettes," Cr Wriedt said.

"Council has previously declared Kingston Park and the Community Hub as Council owned smoke-free areas.

"The community's feedback will help inform Council's future direction with smoke-free areas in the community."

This consultation will close on Tuesday, May 28.

Woodbridge sets the stage

Members of the local community in Woodbridge have been busily painting the foyer of Woodbridge Hall in preparation of a visit by local Federal Minister, the honourable Julie Collins.

Minister Collins will officially open Woodbridge Hall's new stage on Saturday, May 11 after which local choristers and musicians will test it out.

At the ceremony the community will be Welcomed to Country by Fanny Cochrane Smith's great great granddaughter Zoe Frost.

The concert will feature Woodbridge School Choir led by Maggie Bowman, a violin duet from Chris Stapleton and Angela Hemenstall, the Old Pretenders Pipe Band, the Woodbridge Uplift Choir and a piano solo from Belle Huntir.

Woodbridge Hall was built in 1890, with the stage regularly used for concerts, plays and presentations.

However, the increasing popularity of badminton in the 1930s led to the decision to remove it.

Participation in the Channel badminton competition required that Woodbridge have its own venue and it was ruled in 1947 the stage be removed to accommodate a badminton court.

In more recent years, the Woodbridge Hall Committee has applied to host community events but the venue was frequently deemed unsuitable.

A grant was used to install a new kitchen in 2019 and the committee worked closely with Kingborough Council and Heritage Tasmania to install a new roof in 2021.

Installing the stage was the latest step in the committee's strategy to upgrade the hall to a comfortable and welcoming space.

Tasmanian fire permits lifted

Tasmania's fire permits came to an end on Thursday, May 2 for all municipalities apart from King Island.

While permits have been lifted, landowners are reminded to continue monitoring localised conditions to ensure their fires can be controlled.

As a municipality with an abundance of bushland, Kingborough is host to a number of fuel reduction and registered burns each year.

"Landowners who plan on conducting burns on their property should be mindful of the weather, be well equipped and capable and to make sure it is done in consultation with the owners of neighbouring properties," Tasmania Fire Service Acting Chief Officer Jeremy Smith said.

"Engagement with neighbours in the vicinity of any planned burning is critical to ensure smoke will not adversely affect farming or harvesting operations, with emphasis on the wine industry which is particularly vulnerable to smoke at this time of year."

During the 2023/24 fire permit period, 1184 permits had been issued- 216 more than the 2022/23 fire permit period - resulting in a significant reduction of bushfire risk.

"Our fire permit system continues to be a vital bushfire management tool, allowing for the coordination of resources and assisting to maximise fire safety for the Tasmanian community," Mr Smith said.

"We continue to encourage anyone lighting fires to register their burn on the free call 1800 000 699 number."

Dry spell for working bee

Kingborough Council's Biodiversity Officer Sophie Golding was taken along Tramway Hill Landcare Group's (THLG) working bee on Tuesday, April 30.

Volunteer Roz Thurn showed Ms Golding all the sites where THLG volunteer - Tramway Hill Reserve, Davis Flat, Brinks Link and Nierinna Creek Reserve.

Kingborough Council has kindly placed a park table and attached bench seats on Davis Flat in the north-eastern corner.

Roz said this will come in handy for the group and for the general public.

Many native trees in patches in the landscape along Nierinna Road and beyond have noticeably been adversely affected (brown leaves) by the recent dry conditions which hasn't been seen to this extent in at

least 20 years.

The 2013 National Tree Day planting on the western side of Burnaby Drive (at the beginning of the Nierinna Creek walking track) has many trees that will possibly not survive.

The weather was fine and the ground very dry underfoot on the day of the working bee.

There was no water in Nierinna Creek and the water level in the dam remains low.

A fence has been constructed across Nierinna Creek north of the reserve.

This could cause a problem with water flow when the creek flows again if not removed by then.

The volunteers weeded a clump of umbrella sedge from the entrance to Nierinna Creek Reserve and removed

blackberries from the creek edges between the foot bridge and the ford.

Tramway Hill Landcare Group plans on the following for future working bees:

- Organise fallen tree to be removed from fence on Davis Flat and to have fence repaired.
- Have more tables and bench seats on THLG reserves if available.
- See if Kingborough Council can weed and refresh the 2018 planting on the corner of Nierinna and Sandfly roads. Due to occupational health and safety issues the volunteers are unable to work on this site unless road safety signs are erected by Council.
- See if Nierinna Creek Reserve can be added to the next Council Kingborough's Tracks booklet.

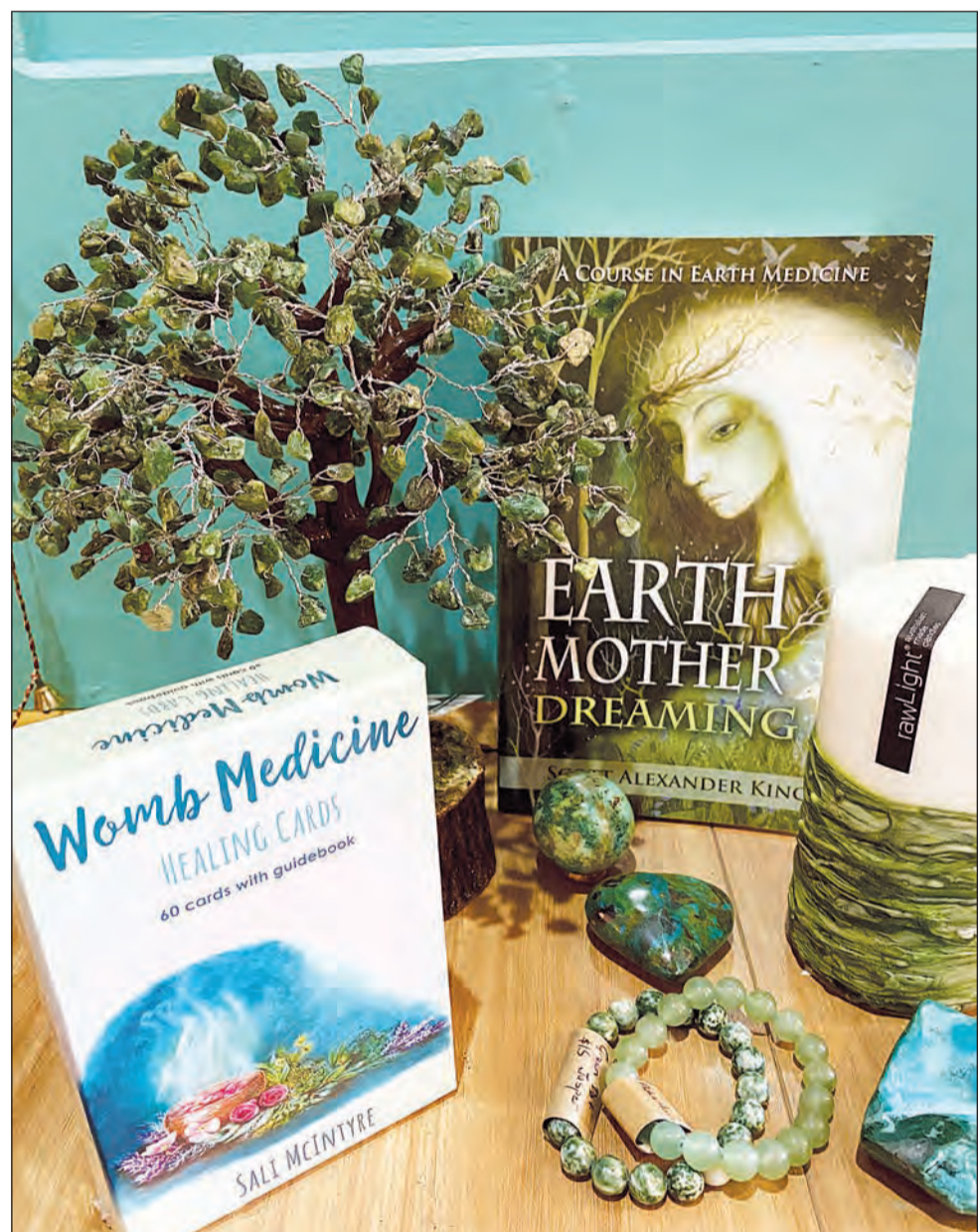

Kingborough athletes personal best
